

BY-LAWS

Article 1 - Membership

Section 1. Membership in this corporation shall consist of active and associate members who reside in Elm Grove. A member who has moved out of the boundaries of Elm Grove will be allowed to retain her active or associate status as long as she remains in good standing. While she cannot be president, she is entitled to all remaining privileges, including holding other office positions.

Section 2. An active member is required to attend the majority of the general meetings. She shall fulfill adequate membership and committee requirements as determined and reviewed by the Executive Committee. If she does not fulfill these requirements, she shall be notified by the Membership Chair that her membership may be forfeited.

Section 3. An active member for at least a five-year period who wishes to maintain some active participation without active requirements may become an associate member. An active member for at least a three-year period, who for whatever reason is unable to fulfill membership requirements, may also become an associate member. She will be required to serve on an auction committee for the remainder of the time she would need to total five years (total of 5 years of auction service). Associate members may not vote or hold office. An associate member desiring to regain active membership status shall notify the Membership Chair in writing and her application shall be given a priority position on the general waiting list. She may change her status again from active back to associate at any time. An associate member may remain in such membership status for an unlimited period of years.

Section 4. Names of prospective members should be submitted to the Membership Chair. She will give the prospective member a membership application as well as a document outlining membership requirements.

Section 5. Upon receipt of applications, the Membership Chair will date the applications and submit them in chronological order for admission. New members admitted from July

1 through December 31 will be given a standing committee assignment as well as an auction assignment. New members admitted after January 1 will only be given a standing committee assignment. They will not be given an auction assignment and will not be required to purchase a ticket for the auction or donate to the auction. Any exceptions are at the discretion of the president.

Section 6. Any member desiring to change her membership status for the coming year must submit a written notification to the Membership Chair by close of the June Meeting.

Article II - Officers

Section 1. The officers of the corporation shall perform the duties prescribed of their office in the parliamentary authority adopted by this organization.

Section 2. The term of the office shall be one year or until successors are elected and qualified, but no officer shall hold the same office for more than two terms consecutively.

Section 3. Newly elected officers shall be installed at the annual meeting. The newly elected President shall announce the Board at that time for the ensuing corporate year.

Section 4. If a vacancy occurs among elected officers, the President with the Executive Committee shall have the authority to fill the vacancy until the next regular election. She shall declare any office or chair vacant if the officer or chair absents herself from three successive general meetings without good cause, and fill the office by appointment.

Article III – Meetings

Section 1. The corporation shall meet on the first Tuesday evening of the designated month.

Section 2. The meetings shall be held in the homes of various members as previously selected by the Program Chair.

Article IV – Dues

Section 1. Annual dues of active members shall be \$40.00.

Section 2. Annual dues of associate members shall be \$30.00.

Section 3. Dues shall be payable July 1 each year.

Section 4. If a member moves out of Elm Grove before October 1, dues will be refunded in full upon application to the Treasurer before that date.

Article V -- Executive Committee

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers and the immediate past president as a nonvoting advisor.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall exercise general supervision of the business of the corporation between regular meetings and shall approve the budget before it is submitted to the general membership.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall determine the general policies of the corporation.

Section 4. Any expenditure of unbudgeted funds requires the signature of the President and the Treasurer to be binding.

Article VI - Board

Section 1. The Board shall consist of the Executive Committee and the Chairs of the Standing Committees.

Section 2. Meeting of the Board shall be held at the discretion of the President and / or Executive Committee.

Section 3. The Board shall approve activities, policies, and programs before they are submitted to the general membership.

Article VII - Standing Committees

Section 1. The President, with the approval of the Executive Committee, shall establish or abolish Standing Committees and/or ad hoc committees as needed in order to carry out the directives of the Executive Board.

Section 2. The President shall appoint chairs of Standing Committees. All committees shall be under the direction of the President. Committee members shall be under the direction of the committee chair.

Section 3. Each chair shall keep a record of work accomplished and a detailed expense report during the corporate year and shall file a report in duplicate at the June meeting.

Section 4. Responsibilities of committee chairs include administration of the committee's budget. An anticipated expenditure greater than \$25.00 over budget requires prior approval of the Executive Committee.

Article VIII - Quorum

Section 1. Fifty percent of the membership shall constitute a quorum of the corporation for the transaction of business.

Article IX - Parliamentary Authority

Section 1. All meetings of this corporation shall be governed by parliamentary law as set

forth in Robert's Rules of Order Revised.

Article X – Amendments

Section1. These By-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the corporation by the affirmative vote of the majority of those present, provided that notice of the proposed amendment was submitted at a previous regular or annual meeting.
