STATEMENT OF PROGRAM SERVICE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Touro Infirmary is dedicated to improving the health status and well being of the people it serves through the provision of effective, efficient and compassionate healthcare services. Touro was founded over 150 years ago as a not for profit hospital that was open to all, regardless of class or financial status. Over a century and a half later, Touro continues to lead by example in the manner in which it provides services to those in our community who are financially disadvantaged.

Touro is located in New Orleans, Louisiana, an urban area, which, while noted for tourism, food and music, is economically depressed and has some of the highest incidence of disease and medical problems in the country. Largely driven by life style, New Orleans has an unusually high incidence of diabetes, heart disease and cancer. As a result of these factors, Touro provides a substantial number of programs aimed at educating the public through free seminars and disease detection through free health screenings. These programs, many of which focus on diabetes, heart disease and cancer, are largely targeted at persons of low socio-economic means.

As an example, we offer free colorectal cancer screenings and skin cancer screenings to the public as a means of early detection and treatment of cancer. Our diabetes education center routinely presents programs in the form of seminars as well as one on one counseling of how to maintain healthy lifestyles for diabetics. In a typical year, Touro will provide free screenings to over 10,000 such persons, and nearly 40% will have some abnormal health finding. From the screenings, we work to match them with appropriate treatment, be it through a program that we offer with significant discounts or some form of free care.

We have a program with many of the public schools in the community to provide pregnancy testing and counseling and provide transportation to pregnant junior and senior high school students to a prenatal care program at Touro aimed at improving the status of maternal and fetal health. We provide prenatal care, education and maternity services each year to hundreds of financially disadvantaged women through the Touro Center for Healthy Beginnings program. The Touro Family Birthing Center provides maternity services in modern private labor/delivery/recovery rooms. Many of the patient rooms in Touro are private rooms and are available to all financial classes.

Touro has a historical focus on providing services to seniors, many of which receive substantially discounted services. Examples of these services, outside of the routine inpatient and outpatient services provided by most hospitals, include the Buckman Assessment Program, a multidisciplinary evaluation program for persons with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia; the Touro Senior Day Program, a day care center for seniors with Alzheimer's. Touro recently invested \$30,000,000 in Woldenberg Village, our

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continuing care retirement community with independent, assisted and skilled nursing facilities and well respected programs for persons with Alzheimer's. Woldenberg has beds and apartments for 240 seniors.

Our Prime Years program, aimed at low-income seniors, provides a series of activities, exercise programs and educational programs to keep seniors active and help them maintain healthy lives.

We have a strategy of locating primary care offices in medically undeserved portions of the City to make primary health care more accessible to those who might not otherwise be able to access basic medical services. Some of these geographical areas are significantly economically deprived. We work with churches in many of the neighborhoods to promote improved health and to provide free health screenings.

Our Touro for Health Program, designed for the working poor, provides a 50% discount from our routine charges. This program is marketed through small employers who may not have the ability to afford or offer medical insurance for their employees and also marketed through word of mouth in the community. There is no membership fee to be a member of this program.

The Touro Clinic, in existence for decades, provides inpatient and outpatient services on a sliding fee basis, determined based on the financial status of patients.

As part of our commitment to the community, Touro is a major teaching hospital offering medical student and post graduate medical training to the two New Orleans medical schools, LSU and Tulane. We act as a clinical training site for allied health programs for Dillard, Xavier and other metro New Orleans colleges.

In addition to all the above, Touro provided over \$15,000,000 in charity and uncompensated care to persons in need in 2004.
