### DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM SERVICE THREE

DURING THE TAX PERIOD ENDED JUNE 30, 2006, AS IN PRIOR YEARS, ST. LUKE'S AGREED TO PROVIDE CARE TO PERSONS COVERED BY GOVERNMENTAL PROGRAMS AT BELOW ITS COST. RECOGNIZING ITS MISSION TO THE COMMUNITY, SERVICES WERE PROVIDED TO BOTH MEDICARE AND MEDICAID PATIENTS. ST. LUKE'S RECOGNIZED THESE AMOUNTS AS CHARITY CARE IN MEETING ITS MISSION TO THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY.

CHARITY CARE WAS ALSO PROVIDED THROUGH MANY REDUCED PRICE SERVICES AND FREE PROGRAMS OFFERED THROUGHOUT THE YEAR BASED UPON ACTIVITIES AND SERVICES WHICH ST. LUKE'S BELIEVED SERVED A BONA FIDE COMMUNITY HEALTH NEED. THESE INCLUDED:

- -ACTIVITIES SPONSORED BY ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL INSTITUTE FOR HEALTH EDUCATION-SEE SUMMARY BELOW.
- -OPERATION OF A MISSION-BASED PEDIATRIC CARE CENTER WHICH PROVIDED HEALTH CARE TO CHILDREN IN ST. LOUIS CITY AND COUNTY IN A PRIVATE PRACTICE SETTING.
- -PREPARED AND DELIVERED 17,685 MEALS DURING THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED JUNE 30, 2006 TO COMMUNITY RESIDENTS WHO WERE UNABLE TO PREPARE A MEAL FOR THEMSELVES DUE TO THEIR MEDICAL CONDITION. THE MEALS WERE PROVIDED AT A MINIMAL SUBSIDIZED FEE.
- -ST. LUKE'S OFFERS AN INTERNAL MEDICINE RESIDENCY PROGRAM PROVIDING PARTICIPANTS THE UNUSUAL OPPORTUNITY OF TRAINING IN PRIMARY CARE INTERNAL MEDICINE AT BOTH A MODERN HOSPITAL LOCATED IN ST. LOUIS COUNTY AND PUBLIC HEALTH CLINICS SERVING THE NEEDS OF THE INDIGENT POPULATION OF THE ST. LOUIS AREA.
- -THE AUXILIARY OF ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL (WHOSE PURPOSE IS TO RENDER SERVICE TO THE ST. LUKE'S EPISCOPAL-PRESBYTERIAN HOSPITALS AND ITS PATIENTS AND TO ASSIST IN PROMOTING HEALTH AND WELFARE OF THE COMMUNITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH OBJECTIVES ESTABLISHED BY THE HOSPITAL) CONTRIBUTED 77,085 HOURS OF VOLUNTEER SERVICE TO ST. LUKE'S. THE VALUE OF THESE VOLUNTEER HOURS ALONG WITH FUNDS RAISED AND GIVEN TO THE HOSPITAL BY THE AUXILIARY ARE GIVEN BACK TO THE COMMUNITY THROUGH LOWER COSTS IN BOTH PATIENT SERVICES AND HEALTH

#### EDUCATION PROGRAMS.

THE ST. LUKE'S HOSPITAL INSTITUTE FOR HEALTH EDUCATION ADDRESSES A FUNDAMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY OF THE INSTITUTION TO OFFER EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES, WHICH IMPROVE THE HEALTH OF THE COMMUNITY. 


