Pikeville Medical Center, Inc. (PMC) is committed to providing accessible healthcare to all patients in need regardless of their ability to pay within the bounds of responsible stewardship in a Christian environment. This is, of course, an integral part of the tax exempt service within the healthcare industry. In addition, to an acute care hospital, PMC operates an outpatient radiology center, an outpatient diagnostic center, an outreach physical therapy site, and has physician offices in Pikeville and outlying communities, outpatient radiology centers in Inez and in Prestonsburg, and sleep study labs in Prestonsburg and in Whitesburg. These off-site facilities are an example of the hospital's commitment to providing accessible healthcare for many different types of healthcare services. To further the mission of enhancing the health of the people and communities it serves, PMC provides medically necessary care to patients regardless of race, religion, sex, national origin, disability, age or ability to pay. Recognizing that not all patients have the ability to pay, it is the policy of PMC to provide DSH income guidelines to all patients registered and to assist those that qualify in completing an application for determination. Further, PMC also has an in-house charity program that is designated fiscally to assist patients who do not meet the outside program's criteria for assistance. PMC has notices posted throughout the hospital that clearly communicate the hospital's charity care policy. PMC employees are instructed in the application of the charity care policy and are trained to recognize situations that indicate the financial resources of a patient may be inadequate. These employees freely and willingly volunteer information regarding the charity care policy to any patient who may express a concern regarding their ability to pay for services. PMC relies on the physician's orders to determine whether treatment is medically necessary and whether the patient is treated on an inpatient or outpatient basis. A patient's ability to pay for services has no bearing upon whether, or how, the patient is treated at PMC. Patients are transferred only when PMC does not provide the specialized service that is required, or by specific request of the physician or the patient. PMC operates an Emergency Department that is open 24 hours a day and 365 days a year. In FY 2007, we had 35,252 emergency department visits. PMC emergency department posts policies regarding the treatment of patients regardless of their ability to pay. Under no circumstances is appropriate care delayed by discussions regarding insurance coverage or ability to pay.

The mission statement of Pikeville Medical Center (PMC) is to "provide quality regional healthcare in a Christian environment." PMC strives to reach this goal by providing a complete range of state-of-the-art and technologically advanced health care services for our local community and beyond. The passion of the staff at Pikeville Medical Center is to help others with compassion, and to deliver excellent care to our patients. The medical center's values are demonstrated in the care and concern shown throughout the facility by employees who exhibit a spirit of teamwork and a desire to serve others. Throughout Pikeville Medical Center's 83-year history, the hospital has exhibited substantial growth and change, especially over the last few years. Starting as a small rural 50 bed facility at its inception in 1924, the Medical Center has undergone many changes in its physical layout. Today, the facility is a modern 261-bed, 500,000 plus square foot medical complex. This tremendous physical growth, along with sound financial leadership, has allowed PMC to significantly expand the healthcare services offered to the region. These services now include a full service cancer treatment center, expanded cardiology services, including open heart surgery, a 40-bed inpatient physical rehabilitation unit, neurosurgery, adult and adolescent medical drug detoxification program, neonatal intensive care (Level II +/- III), outstanding state of the art radiology services with Siemens ONCOR Linear Accelerator (second in the nation), two 64-slice CT scanners, Pet Scanning, Stand-Up MRI unit, two satellite sleep lab facilities, and an outpatient diagnostic center. As well as augmenting the range and complexity of health care services provided to patients in the area, Pikeville Medical Center's growth has also played an integral part in enhancing the hospital's outreach to the local community. uncompensated charity of \$17,701,901 (services at hospital's established rates). The care was distributed throughout 19 counties across eastern Kentucky and southern West Virginia. Shriner's Hospital for Children Clinic: PMC provides radiology equipment for use by the staff of the Shriner's Crippled Children Hospital for the assessment of their patients during multiple outreach clinics in 2007. This allows local children to have their appointments at home without traveling hours away to another facility. These clinics see dozens of children each year. American Cancer Society Relay for Life: Pikeville Medical Center was one of 61 teams to participate in the 2007 Pike County Relay for Life. The hospital's finance team served as the finance chairman for the event, which raised more than \$170,000 for the American Cancer Society. Pikeville Medical Center's Public Relations department serves as the publicity coordinator for the event and the Medical Leader ran a series of public service announcements for the event. In conjunction with the Relay for Life, PMC sponsored a survivor's dinner for area cancer survivors the week before the event. Blood Drives (CKBC): Our facility provides a location for quarterly blood drives conducted in accordance with Central Kentucky Blood Center. The Medical Center encourages employee and public participation in these events. In 2007, PMC held four blood drives and donated over 234 units of blood. PMC Hospital Week Health Fair: In celebration and recognition of National Hospital Week during May 2007, PMC sponsored a community health fair. During this event, over 120 individuals were screened for blood pressure, blood sugar/diabetes, oxygen saturation, BMI, etc. Medical information was also provided to those in attendance. The event is open to the general public. Hillbilly Days First Aid Station: During the 2007 Hillbilly Days Festival held in downtown Pikeville in April, PMC sponsored and staffed a health screening booth while serving the event as the official first aid station. During the three-day event, PMC employees screened over 1,000 festival attendees. The employees distributed literature related to the warning signs and early detection of cancer. Attendees received on-site medical attention and some were sent to the emergency room for additional treatment. Fall Fit Classic (10K & 1 Mile Walk/Run Event): Held in October, this PMC event targets employees and the community to stay fit by holding two race type events - a one mile fun walk/run and a more competitive 10K run. Each year a different charity is selected to receive all net proceeds generated through sponsorships, entry fees, etc. Past charities included the medical detoxification program and Hurricane Katrina rebuilding efforts. Habitat for Humanity's Women's Build: In 2007, Pikeville Medical Center played a pivotal role in the construction of a Habitat for Humanity Women's Build project. Hospital employees worked in conjunction with other civic organizations, churches, other non-profit groups and businesses in this effort. PMC employees participated in training that included how to install shingles, frame walls and roofs, a class devoted to insulation, doors and windows, in addition to training dates for installing sheetrock, painting and trim, siding and flooring.

Women Build has grown at an annual rate of almost 25 percent, according to reports from Habitat for Humanity. The cost of building a three-bedroom habitat house is just over \$50,000 and includes work from the ground up - from excavation to the last shingle. PMC also provided lunch for the workers during the week of the construction of the home. The building project took six weeks, however, the hospital worked throughout the year in assisting the organization in fundraising efforts. The Medical Leader gave the group advertisements free of charge. Holiday Events: PMC involves the community in many activities and events around several of the key national holidays such as Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas. During Easter, the community is invited to participate in a Sunrise Service at the hospital and several promotional items are given to the public to celebrate the holiday. PMC is also a prominent spcnsor of the YMCA Easter Egg Hunt event. Christmas is the hospital's major holiday celebration. A week-long live nativity is held for the community. Hospital employees donate several hundred hours to staff, create, and make the live nativity a success. The hospital also sponsors a Blessing Tree, a large Christmas tree where employees and the public are invited to display their thankfulness by placing symbolic ornaments and messages on the tree. Further, PMC arranges for live Christmas music for the patients. The hospital participates in the city parade with a float emphasizing its mission to the community. A tree lighting ceremony is held for the community with free pictures with Santa along with free refreshments and other activities. Additional Health Fairs: PMC conducts additional health fairs throughout the year when contacted by external groups and hundreds of local people are screened. During health fairs, participants are screened for health problems such as blood pressure and diabetes. Additional health fairs were held at area senior citizens centers, school resource centers, local festivals, clubs and businesses. Examples are: Women's Club Health Fair, Federal prison health fair, YMCA sponsored health fairs. Christian Emphasis Committee: Pikeville Medical Center desires to seek the guidance of the Lord in fulfilling its mission, and therefore regularly begins meetings with prayer. This committee is made up of PMC Board members, medical staff, and employees who meet regularly to discuss ways to give back to the community. Some of the activities that were held in 2007 were: -Food drive for the Homeless Shelter -Collection for Domestic Violence Shelter -Collection for Judi's Place for Kids (a. shelter for sexually abused children) Meals on Wheels: Pikeville Medical Center provided 5,108 meals for this program during fiscal year 2007. The hospital incurs about \$11,500 in expenses related to this program annually. COMMUNITY EDUCATION Community Education Programs: PMC's Education Department offered a wide array of healthcare-related continuing education courses during FY 2007 to the community. Community members participated in courses, including Pediatric Advanced Life Support, Advanced Cardiac Life Support, Aids Update, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, Neonatal Resuscitation, Adult Heartsaver, First Aid, and IV Therapy. strongly that its efforts in this area are essential in enhancing the health and well being of our community and region. Surrounding community hospitals look to our hospital to offer the specialties and sub-specialties that their facilities do not provide. It is also critical to maintain physicians who can treat conditions, which afflict the population of eastern Kentucky in numbers significantly above the national average (specifically heart disease, cancer, and diabetes). During 2007, Pikeville Medical Center assisted in the placement of physicians in our local area practicing in the following specialties: -Critical Care Medicine -Physical Medical & Rehabilitation -Retina Specialist -Neurosurgery -Hospitalist -Cardio Thoracic Surgery -Family Practice -Oncology -Orthopedic Surgery -Anesthesia -Radiation Oncology -General Surgery -Neonatology -Ophthalmology -Allergy/Immunology. Health Advantage Program: The Health Advantage program seeks to provide employers with assessments regarding the health of their workforce. A team of employees from the medical center visits each job site to conduct interviews and draw the necessary specimens. The assessment includes a lipid profile, metabolic profile, height, weight, blood pressure and a health questionnaire completed for each employee. Results of the testing are then confidentially sent to the employee, while the employer receives a summary of the overall health assessment of its workforce. The employer pays a reasonable fee for this service. Pikeville Medical Center staff continues to travel across the region and beyond to provide this service for local employers and their branch offices. Smoking Cessation Classes: Pikeville Medical Center, along with the Kentucky Cancer Program, offers classes to the community. Using the Cooper-Clayton method of smoking cessation, the program is a 13-week class that is held in the Leonard Lawson Cancer Center on a quarterly basis. Several staff members are certified to teach the program. Addiction Services: Pikeville Medical Center's Addiction Services Program is actively involved in not only community and civic organizations, but employees in this department also serve as a vital component in combating drug-related issues in eastern Kentucky. Employees in this department serve on various boards and committees including: Pike County Community Drug Task Force, Unite Drug Task Force, Consultants for WestCare, Consultants for Hospice, Drug Court Representative in Juvenile Court, Drug Court Representative for Adult Court, International Nurses Society on Addiction Services and Pike County Board of Education Drug Task Force. PMC, along with officials from Pike County District Court, has implemented the P.A.S.T. (Professionally Assisted Substance Abuse Treatment) program, which allows the drug court to be held at the hospital weekly. The hospital also holds two Lifeline meetings a week. These meetings are facilitated through a joint effort between the hospital's Addiction Services and Chaplain programs. Lifeline meetings help those addicted and their families get their lives back together after treatment. HEALTH CLINICS/SCREENINGS Cancer Screenings: During 2007, PMC provided several free cancer screenings for the community. The goal of these screening programs is to educate area residents concerning the importance of early detection and treatment of the cancer as well as detect suspected disease processes. Wellness Program: Employees at Pikeville Medical Center can voluntarily enroll into the hospital's wellness program, an initiative to encourage employees to live a more productive and healthier life. This, in turn, promotes a more productive and healthier workforce and assists - in the long term - in eliminating the cost of health care pertaining to diseases and ailments associated with poor diet and exercising habits. Participants are eligible to earn \$500 (twice annually) if he or she hits a target set forth through a health risk appraisal. The wellness program also extends its reach throughout the community, offering services (including lectures and body mass index (BMI) calculations) at area schools. In 2007, wellness program bonuses were \$283,579. During the flu season, the program helped coordinate free flu shots for PMC employees. More than 1,000 employees took advantage of this free service. This service is offered to community businesses for a reasonable charge. **SUPPORT GROUPS:** PMC sponsors and provides meeting space for several support groups within our community. These groups include: -ABC/After Breast Cancer Support Group -LLCC Cancer Support Group -Stroke Support Group -Diabetes Support Group -Mended Hearts -AL-Anon -Alcoholics Anonymous -Narcotics Anonymous. **DEPARTMENTAL EVENTS**

Women and Children's Health: Pikeville Medical Center delivered 937 babies this year to mothers of all socioeconomic levels. Mothers-to-be and their families are offered child- birth classes and newborn care classes at no charge. The Medical Center provides Level II Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) for infants requiring specialized care due to premature or developmental issues. The NICU reported 170 admissions during fiscal year 2007. The Special Care Nursery provides a full range of monitoring and procedures to support sick infants. Hospital services provide excellent support for the care of neonatal patients through x-rays, ultrasounds, etc. Infant developmental stimulation services are provided by a team of therapists who are trained to work with infants. The NICU involves the efforts of a team of neonatologists, as well as nurses, therapists, and other employees. Pikeville Medical Center also offers safe sitter classes to the community. The classes are also given to local schools at their request. Young people, between the ages of 11-13, are taught by registered nurses and are given the resources and skills they need to provide babysitting services in our community. This service is provided for a nominal fee. PMC also provides meals to the parents of pediatric patients during their child's inpatient stay. **Volunteer Services:** Pikeville Medical Center is blessed with a vibrant and active group of local volunteers of all ages. During the year ended September 30, 2007, these dedicated individuals donated approximately 14,069 hours of their personal time to serve patients and provide other services within the facility. Services provided by volunteers include: -Tours given to local groups including: Model City Daycare, Pikeville College Nursing Program, National College of Business, East Ridge High School, Pike County Central High School, Numerous Girl Scout Troops -Observation opportunities for the PEPP program, which allows high school students to observe clinical areas in healthcare -Coordination of the Upward Bound Program -Educational Fair for Betsy Layne Elementary School -Coordination of the Pikeville High School School-to-Work Program. **Medical Leader:** Pikeville Medical Center publishes a weekly newspaper which is delivered free of charge to 69,000 households and

Each issue contains information on current health topics, services offered at Pikeville Medical Center, sports, and other community news events including: -adult health and child health related articles/topics used to make the public aware of health issues -extensive coverage of school-related events -a full sports section, featuring college, high school and youth sports -a community calendar used for free public service announcements for churches, schools, hospital events and other community activities. S.A.N.E. (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner) Program PMC maintains a staff of on-call nurses trained and certified in treating sexual assault cases. The S.A.N.E. program has made a profound difference in the quality of care provided, and offers victims prompt, compassionate care and comprehensive forensic evidence collection. In addition to helping preserve the victim's dignity and reduce psychological trauma, the program enhances the evidence collection for more effective investigations and better prosecutions. Chaplaincy Services: In accordance with its mission, Pikeville Medical Center is very committed to providing chaplaincy services to our patients, visitors and others in the community as needed. The medical center houses an on- site chapel and employs two full-time chaplains. Other part-time chaplains are available as needed. An effort is made to visit all patients daily. PMC allows area churches to use the hospital baptistery when needed. The hospital also hosts a Sunday worship service, which is aired on television to all patient rooms and waiting areas. Little Lambs, a small New Testament Bible, is given to each new baby born at PMC. Devotional material is also available to patients and is distributed by the chaplain staff members daily. Our chaplains often work with patient's families to meet individual needs. In addition to spiritual needs and grief support, the chaplain helped to provide nearly 5,000 meals for families unable to meet the cost. Chaplains also work with Social Services to make sure patients, who cannot obtain medicine due to financial or other hardships, can enroll in special services and/or programs that cater to their needs. Every year, Pikeville Medical Center hosts an appreciation dinner for community ministers and their spouses.

The department assists in collecting items for area homeless shelters, abuse shelters and other community organizations, such as Appalachian Pregnancy Care Center and help for a mission trip to a South Dakota Indian Reservation with the collection of needed items for the children. Chaplains are on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week and the chaplain on duty delivers a devotion each morning over the hospital's public address system. A devotion line is accessible in-house and from outside at any time during the day or night. The department also provides weekly/daily addiction support group facilitation for Addiction Services and sends sympathy cards to the family of patients who have expired at PMC. Social Services: Employees in the Social Services department of the medical center work with patients to locate assistance to help cover the cost of needed medications. During fiscal year 2007, they helped 212 patients to receive needed medications at no cost to them. This deferred cost is over \$15,000. The department also works with women's services/NICU to evaluate each family and to help them find needed resources and coordinate plans with agencies and follow-up programs.
