For the older students, the process in which the grants were given promoted student leadership skills, work ethic and pride, as students are required to formally request assistance at monthly DDAA meetings, presenting a written request and answering questions from DDAA membership. An attempt was made with each request to enlist those requesting assistance to in return assist with DDAA fundraisers, either students or family members, promoting awareness and skills in responsibility. Many times student(s) and/or sponsors from an organization return following the event and report to the DDAA on the activity. (continued next page)
