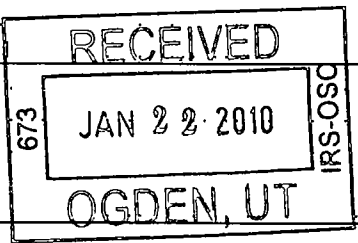

NOTE 1 - HISTORY AND NATURE OF THE ORGANIZATION

The Bold Chicago Institute (BCI) was incorporated on December 6, 1997 under the 1987 General Not-For-Profit-Act of Illinois. BCI provides leadership and service learning training programs for educational institutions, community organizations, and individuals in Chicago.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Basis of presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 116, Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made, and No. 117, Financial Statements for Not-For-Profit Organizations.

Under SFAS No. 116 contributions are recognized in the period received, or in the period in which an unconditional promise to give is made.

Under SFAS No. 117, BCI is required to report information regarding its financial position according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. Classification of net assets as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted is based on the absence or existence of donor imposed restrictions.

Donor-imposed restrictions

All contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor. Amounts received that are designated for future periods or restricted by the donor for specific purposes are reported as temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support that increases those net asset classes. However, restricted support that is received and fulfilled within the same fiscal year is reported as unrestricted.

Income taxes

BCI is exempt from federal taxes under Section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code. It qualifies for charitable contributions under Section 170(b)(1)(A), and has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation under Section 509(a)(2).

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles may require management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, revenues, and expenditures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendation of the Financial Accounting Standards Board

Expense allocation

The cost of providing various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the Statement of Activities and in the Statement of Functional Expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Donated goods and services

BCI received donated goods and services from Chicago Public Schools (CPS). Such donated goods and services include, but were not limited to, classroom instructional time, student transportation, student food costs, and curriculum costs. In addition to the goods and services donated by CPS, BCI received donated services from individuals. A provision for the estimated value of donated goods and services received by BCI is not included in the financial statements because an objective basis for measuring the value of such services is not available.
