Eligibility

Eligible recipients include: pre-school; elementary and secondary schools; collegiate-level, professional or technical schools; two-year, junior, community and four-year colleges; and universities and graduate schools; any tax-exempt fund (501 [c] [3]), foundation or association (classified as a public charity) whose purpose is to raise funds, transmit gifts or sponsor programs for colleges or college students; literacy organizations; and any community foundation or fund therein.

Entities must be located within the United States, be tax-exempt, non-profit, non-proprietary, and be accredited or approved by a nationally recognized accrediting agency, a state department of education, a state university or operated under public control.

Gifts

Gifts must be personal contributions made, not merely pledged, in cash or securities. The minimum gift is \$25. There is no limit to the number of gifts or entities eligible for matching funds, within the \$3,000 maximum per year. Securities are valued for matching purposes at their quoted market value at the close of trading on the day the gift is made.

Donors may make unrestricted gifts, or they may designate their gifts for specific projects, but may not receive anything of value in return. The Scripps Howard Foundation's matching gifts will be unrestricted.

To Participate

Donor (employee, director or retiree) completes the **Donor** and **Receipt** portions of the form and forwards it with his or her gift to the recipient entity.

The recipient entity completes the **Recipient** portion of the form and forwards it to the Scripps Howard Foundation.

Once the Scripps Howard Foundation verifies the eligibility of the donor and recipient entity, a matching gift check is sent to the recipient entity and the donor is mailed a receipt giving notification of the matching gift payment.

2010 National Merit Scholarship Program

For high school junior (11th grade/third year) students who will be completing or leaving high school and entering college in the fall of 2010.*

Scripps Howard Foundation established this scholarship program for sons and daughters of Scripps employees. The annual competition is conducted through the National Merit Scholarship Program by National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC), an independent, not-for-profit organization. NMSC's purposes are (1) to identify and honor exceptionally able high school students and (2) to provide a system of services for corporations, foundations, and other organizations that wish to sponsor college undergraduate scholarships for outstanding students who interest them. All aspects of the selection of winners and the administration of their awards are handled by NMSC.

Who is eligible?

Only high school students who are sons and daughters of Scripps employees can compete for these scholarships. Such students also must meet all requirements for participation in the National Merit Scholarship Program that are published in the *Official Student Guide to the PSAT/NMSQT* which is updated annually and distributed to students through their high schools.

To participate in the program, students must take the qualifying test, the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) during the proper high school year. In general, students who spend the usual four years in grades 9 through 12 must take the PSAT/NMSQT when they are in their third year (grade 11/junior year). A participant also must be a citizen of the United States; or be a U.S. lawful permanent resident (or have applied for permanent residence, the application for which has not been denied) and intend to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. The *Official Student Guide to the PSAT/NMSQT* explains these and other requirements for the competition, gives detailed information about the test (including sample questions and a complete practice test), and describes the scholarship programs NMSC administers.

* Students who plan to leave high school a year (or more) early to enroll in college full time should refer to the *Official Student Guide to the PSAT/NMSQT* (or contact NMSC) about when to take the qualifying test.

How do you enter?

To enter the competition for Scripps Howard Foundation Scholarships to be awarded in the spring of 2010:

(over)

1. A 2010 Scripps Howard Foundation Scholarship Program Entry Form must be completed and submitted by December 31, 2008. An Entry Form for the 2010 competition is attached. Forms must be completed and mailed to: Vickie Martin, Scripps Howard Foundation, P.O. Box 5380, Cincinnati, OH 45201. Or the student may choose to complete and submit an Entry Form online at www.scripps.com/foundation under the Employee Programs.
2. The student must take the PSAT/NMSQT in the fall of 2008, on the date their school chooses for the administration -- either Wednesday, October 15 or Saturday, October 18, 2008. At the beginning of the 2008-2009 school year, the student should obtain a copy of the *2008 Official Student Guide to the PSAT/NMSQT* from the high school counselor and make arrangements with the school to take the PSAT/NMSQT in October.

Important information regarding the PSAT/NMSQT:

- The 2008 PSAT/NMSQT is the qualifying test to enter the 2010 competition. Scores from prior PSAT/NMSQT administrations (2007 or earlier) cannot be used for participation in the 2010 program.
- The 2008 PSAT/NMSQT will be administered on Wednesday, October 15 or Saturday, October 18.
- The 2010 Scripps Howard Foundation Scholarship Program Entry Form can be submitted prior to the student taking the October 2008 PSAT/NMSQT and/or receiving his/her official score report.
- As a sponsor of the examination, NMSC receives all 2008 PSAT/NMSQT scores and information students provide on their answer sheets. Therefore, students do not need to report their PSAT/NMSQT scores to NMSC.
- For more information about the PSAT/NMSQT or the National Merit Scholarship Program, visit NMSC's Web site at www.nationalmerit.org

NOTE: A student who does not take the 2008 PSAT/NMSQT because of illness, an emergency, or other extenuating circumstances (but meets all other participation requirements) may still be able to enter the 2010 competition. To request information about possible arrangements for alternate testing, the student must write directly to NMSC as soon as possible after the October 2008 PSAT/NMSQT administration but no later than March 1, 2009. The student should not delay; the earlier the student writes, the more options there are for scheduling test dates. The letter must be postmarked on or before March 1, 2009 for the request to be considered. Write to National Merit Scholarship Corporation, Attn: Educational Services, 1560 Sherman Avenue, Suite 200, Evanston, Illinois 60201-4897; telephone (847) 866-5100.

How are winners selected?

All Scripps Howard Foundation Scholarship winners in 2010 will be chosen from a group of candidates who (1) score high on the 2008 PSAT/NMSQT and (2) are notified by NMSC in the fall of 2009 that they may receive further consideration for a scholarship by meeting several academic and other

requirements set by NMSC. Scores from the 2008 PSAT/NMSQT will be used by NMSC as an initial screen of applicants in the 2010 Scripps Howard Foundation Scholarship Program. **Entrants who advance in the competition will be contacted by NMSC on or before December 31, 2009.** (Only those entrants who advance in the competition will be notified and receive materials from NMSC.) These students and their high school principals will complete applications that include biographical and academic information that must be filed with NMSC. Scholarship winners will be chosen on a competitive basis and without regard to family financial circumstances, gender, race, ethnic origin, or religious preference. An NMSC committee of professionals trained in selection will choose the winners by evaluating several factors about each eligible candidate; these include academic record throughout high school, significant activities and contributions to the school and community, test scores, the school's recommendation of the candidate, and the student's essay about personal characteristics, activities, plans, and goals. In most cases, winners will be notified by NMSC in March of 2010. All winners are notified directly, prior to any public announcement that may be made about recipients.

What is the amount of the award?

Each Scripps Howard Foundation Scholarship stipend is \$2,000 per year for up to four years of college undergraduate study or until baccalaureate degree requirements are completed, whichever occurs first. The winner's annual stipend will not be affected by other scholarship aid or by an approved change in college.

Are there requirements that scholarship winners must meet?

Yes. The formal offer of a Scripps Howard Foundation Scholarship that NMSC sends to each winner specifies terms for acceptance and continuation of the award. A winner must enter college in the fall term following selection and must enroll as a full-time undergraduate in a college or university in the United States that holds accredited status with a regional accrediting commission on higher education. (Scholarship stipends are not payable for attendance at service academies, virtual universities, and certain institutions that are limited in their purposes or training.) Also, the winner must attend college during the day, enroll in a course of study leading to one of the traditional baccalaureate degrees, and remain in good academic and disciplinary standing.

Who handles scholarship procedures?

All phases of the competition, including the selection of winners and payment of scholarship stipends are handled for Scripps Howard Foundation by National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

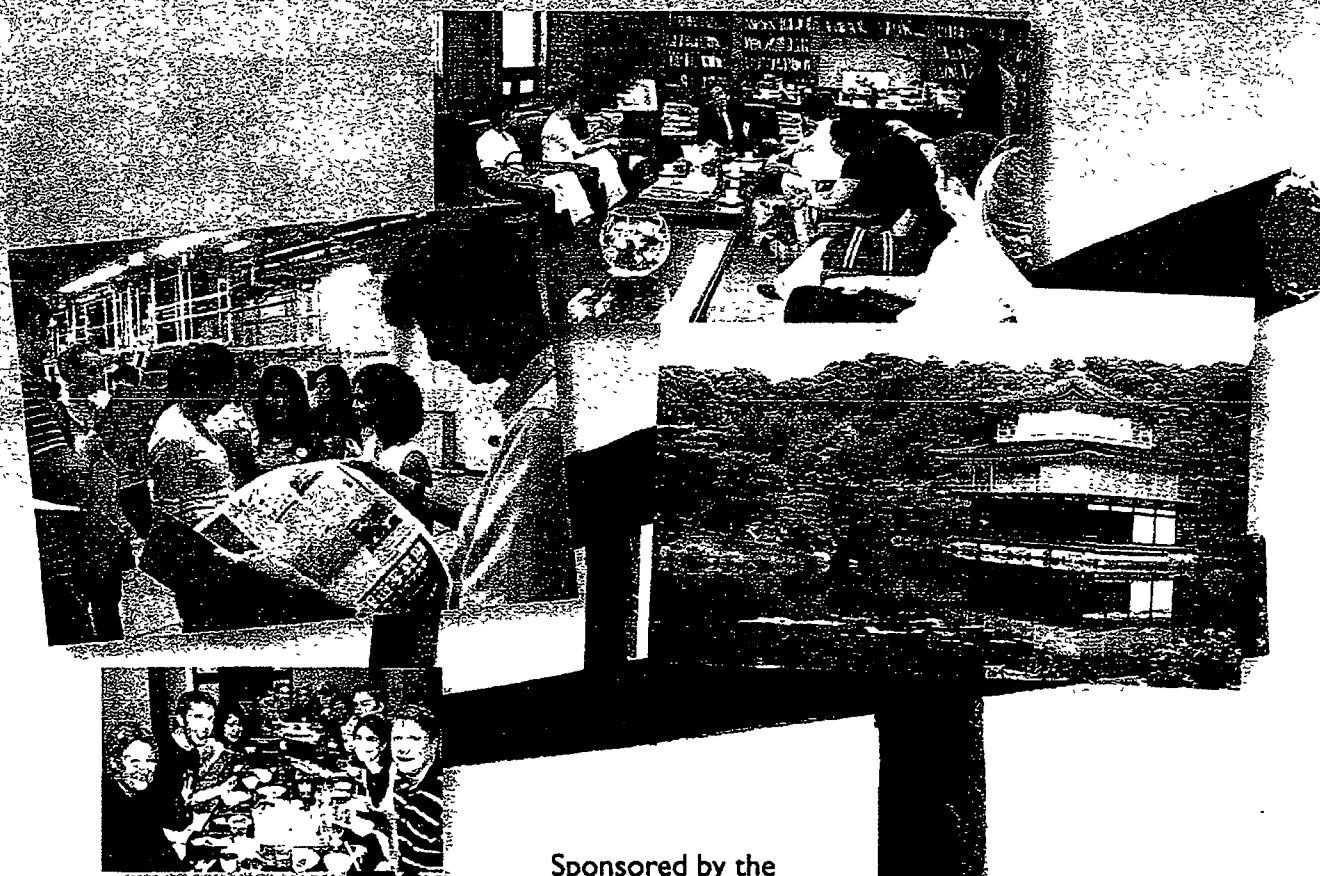

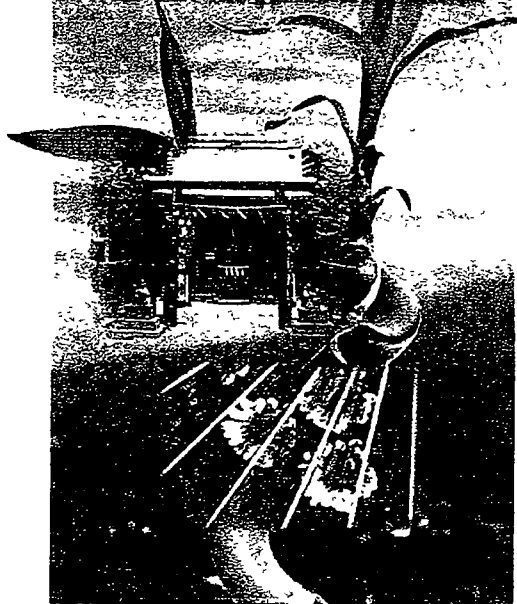

FAQs About The Man & The Prize

So, who was Roy W. Howard?

He led United Press International and Scripps Howard Newspapers during a journalism career that spanned nearly six decades. He was so revered by fellow journalists that in 1955, at age 72, the Society of Professional Journalists named him honorary president. At the time of his death in 1964, then U.S. president Lyndon B. Johnson said he was "already a legend in his profession" and predicted he would be remembered in history as one of journalism's commanding figures.

Why the international collegiate reporting award in his honor? Roy Howard lived a global life well before most journalism schools taught about international reporting. He traveled and worked in Asia, and had a great affinity for Japan, Korea and China. Howard corresponded with presidents about U.S. policy in Asia, and records at the presidential libraries show that they took his insight seriously.

Why is the prize an international study experience?

An international study perspective is essential for journalists who cover politics, business, war, immigration issues and their own diverse communities. We have in Bradley J. Hamm, dean of the journalism school at Indiana University, a uniquely qualified leader for this trip. He is not only a gifted instructor, but also a Roy W. Howard scholar who has extensive travel experience throughout Asia.

Why the trip to Japan and South Korea? Few American journalism students today have any experience in Asia. Even for the nearly 200,000 American students who study abroad each year, only about seven percent select a country in Asia. Meanwhile, Japan has the largest circulation newspapers in the world. In South Korea and Japan, a new media world is emerging with incredible technology.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR GREATER CINCINNATI FUND AND COMMUNITY FUND

Priority is given to projects and programs that make our communities better places to live, learn and work, that are measurable with stated goals and objectives, that clearly demonstrate effectiveness and innovation, that are models for others, that can eventually be self-supporting or show other evidence of long-term viability. All grant recipients must provide proof of 501(c)(3) status.

Specific projects and programs are preferred over general operating funds and capital campaigns.

Multi-year contributions and the purchase of tables at fund-raising events are discouraged.

The demand for support for special fundraising events far exceeds our ability to participate. We do not support walks, runs, golf outings or neighborhood-specific events. The exception is team sponsorship when employees are personally participating. We do not support "disease-related" events or those strictly related to research. We will not purchase tables for public or private K-12 schools, school districts or their foundations.

Organizations that receive United Way or Fine Arts or other general campaign funds, already supported by the Foundation do not receive priority for funding.

The Foundation does not make contributions to individuals, to religious organizations (unless they are engaged in a significant program benefiting the entire community), to political causes or candidates, to anti-business organizations, for courtesy advertising, to organizations that discriminate on the basis of race, creed, religion, gender or national origin, to private foundations or to veterans, fraternal or labor groups.

WRITTEN REQUESTS ARE REQUIRED. Queries in advance of full proposal are advised. A full proposal includes a brief description of the organization, a brief description of the program for which support is requested, including rationale, a detailed project budget, schedule of implementation, methods of evaluating and reporting results, and qualifications of program manager. Describe other sources of funding. Include a representation statement and a list of the names and affiliations of the board of directors and the governing body.

Requests are accepted year-round. Notifications are normally sent within 90 days.

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Sales taxation of information services and data processing

Introduction

The transfer or processing of information long has been difficult for state tax administrators to classify and tax properly, with technology creating an ever-changing paradigm for business operations. As a result, a taxpayer engaged in transferring information may incur a different sales tax treatment in each state in which it conducts business. The same transaction may be classified as an information service in one state and classified as data processing in another state. This article examines the current sales tax treatment for this activity in various states.

What You Should Know

What is an information service?

For sales tax purposes, an information service definition proves useful to determine which transactions can be classified accordingly. The term generally refers to services wherein the primary purpose is to obtain information that is accumulated, analyzed, or summarized for a client or customer from a base of information maintained by the service provider. Such information may or may not be provided according to criteria provided by the client or customer. An information service commonly is analyzed according to whether it occurs in a tangible or electronic form and whether the information is standardized or presented for a particular customer.



New York defines an information service as “the collection, compilation or analysis of any kind of information and the furnishing of reports to other persons.” New York further clarifies that information services include credit reports, tax or stock market advisory and analysis reports, and product and marketing surveys [20 NY ADC 527.3(a)(3)]. Washington State defines an information service as “every business activity, process, or function by which a person transfers, transmits, or conveys data, facts, knowledge, or procedures to a user through any tangible or intangible medium.” The term specifically excludes transfers of tangible personal property, such as computer hardware or standard prewritten software programs [WA ADC 458-20-155].

What does data processing mean?

Data processing can be defined simply as:

- The processing of information for the purpose of compiling or producing records of transaction;
- Maintaining information; and
- Entering and retrieving information.

Historically, the processing of data typically was thought of as a function similar to data entry. However, the term has evolved with technological advances. For instance, in Texas, data processing includes word processing, data entry, data retrieval, payroll and business accounting data production, data search, information compilation, and other computerized data and information storage or manipulation. The term also includes the use of a computer or computer time for data processing, whether the processing is performed by the provider of the computer or computer time or by the purchaser or other beneficiary of the services. Texas clarifies that the following services are considered data processing services: entry of inventory control data, maintenance of records of employee work time, filing payroll tax returns, preparing W-2 forms, and computing and preparing payroll checks [V.T.C.A., Tax Code § 151.0035, 34 TX ADC § 3.330(a)].

How are transactions classified?

As the preceding terms have demonstrated, there is considerable overlap between these two definitions. A transaction may involve data processing and information services concurrently or may involve a part of each activity. Herein lies the confusion for taxpayers, as well as state tax administrators: whether a transaction more closely resembles a data processing transaction or an information service transaction. The answer may be different in different jurisdictions according to whether the focus is on the action (processing) or the outcome (information).

For example, Connecticut defines computer and data processing services as “providing computer time, storing and filing of information, retrieving or providing access to information, designing, implementing or converting systems, providing consulting services, and conducting feasibility studies.” However, information services are not included in the enumerated list of services subject to sales tax in Connecticut. An information service performed in Connecticut would most likely fall under the “computer and data processing” umbrella for classification purposes since the service most closely resembles retrieving or providing access to information

[CT ADC § 12-426-27]. However, this example illustrates the confusion for a provider of information services when there is not clear direction as to how the service should be classified for sales tax purposes.

How are different states taxing information services/data processing?

In Ohio, taxable sales include transactions that involve the transfer, for consideration, of title or possession of books, manuals, bulletins, lists, or similar materials providing current information or data on a particular subject that are furnished and/or supplemented on a continuing basis pursuant to a contract. The statute also provides that taxable sales include the provision of automatic data processing, computer, and information services when the true object of the consumer is the receipt of the automatic data processing, computer, or information service rather than the receipt of a professional service [OH ADC 5703-9-43, 5703-9-46]. Therefore, information services and data processing are clearly taxable unless the object of the transaction is a professional service.

California, on the other hand, does not tax data processing services or the transfer of information by electronic telecommunications from a remote location if there is no tangible personal property sent to the purchaser. However, the tangible transfer of information is subject to tax [18 CA ADC §1502(a), (c)(5), and (c)(8)].

New York taxes data processing and information services. However, the state differentiates whether the information services are of a business or personal nature. Specifically, if the information furnished is "personal and individual in nature and is not or may not be substantially incorporated in reports furnished to other persons, such information services are exempt from tax" [NY Law Sec 1105(c)(1)].

What are some current examples of services considered information services/data processing?

Software as a Service (SaaS), a subset of cloud computing, is a service that currently is being scrutinized closely by the states. SaaS typically involves software applications that are available via an Internet web browser, such as e-mail accessed online, etc. As of the date of this article, the following states classify SaaS as an information or data processing service: Connecticut, D.C., Hawaii, Kansas, Minnesota, New Mexico, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, and Texas. However, the following states consider SaaS electronically delivered software: Arizona, Colorado (repealed effective July 2012), Idaho, Indiana, Louisiana (temporarily suspended), Massachusetts, Michigan, New York, Utah, Vermont, and Washington State.

To further illustrate, Texas determined that an out-of-state company providing an online business application to Texas customers that recorded and managed their business transactions was performing taxable data processing services for sales tax purposes. Customers accessed the taxpayer's software through the Internet and transmitted data to the taxpayer's out-of-state servers, which processed the data to prepare a tax return [Letter No. 200805095L, Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts (5/28/2008)]. Therefore, the state of Texas focused on the processing function for sales tax purposes, rather than whether software was purchased or information was provided.

Massachusetts takes a different position than Texas in a similar example. The Department of Revenue determined that a financial information provider's charges for access to an electronic database that allows users to obtain reports prepared by the seller were not subject to Massachusetts sales and use tax because the object of the transaction was to obtain information rather than to use the software itself. Charges for access to web-based tools that allow users to make credit decisions, manage risk exposure, and create credit applications, however, were taxable as sales of a right to use prewritten software because the object of the transaction was to use the seller's software to manipulate information [Letter Ruling 11-2, Massachusetts Department of Revenue (3/4/2011)]. In this example, the state looked to the object of the transaction to determine the taxability, regardless of whether the processing of information was involved.

What This Means in Practice

A provider or processor of information must evaluate carefully whether that process is classified as a data processing or information service transaction in the states in which it does business. Once the activity is properly classified, the taxability can be determined. Although this process of classifying and determining tax might seem a simple exercise, the reality is that the slightest technological upgrade can lead a taxpayer (and ultimately a state tax administrator) to disagree on the conclusions.

Many questions arise including: Are there other elements of the transaction involved, such as software? Are there other services included in the transaction (e.g., personal services) that could alter the true object of the transaction? Does the transaction involve an emerging technology that does not neatly fit into existing definitions? Does the classification of the transaction change depending on the states it is performed in? Are there sourcing issues as well to be aware of? Are there technological changes in the marketplace that can influence the classification or taxation of the transaction? Is the tax determined by whether tangible personal property is transferred? The answers to these questions can offer insight to make effective tax decisions.

Amended Form 990 Explanation

The taxpayer is amending its 2008 Form 990-PF, Return of Private Foundation, as it has recently become aware that it should have been filing Form 926, Return by a U.S. Transferor of Property to a Foreign Corporation. During its 2008 tax year the Taxpayer's third party investment manager caused the taxpayer to make investments into certain Mutual Funds located in the Cayman Islands.

The taxpayer is filing this amended income tax return pursuant to Question 17 of the 2011 Offshore Voluntary Disclosure Initiative Frequently Asked Questions and Answers.

The taxpayer was unaware of the Form 926 filing requirement at the time the originally filed Form 990-PF was filed. The taxpayer has reported all of the earnings from the Cayman Islands mutual funds as well as all other investment income earned during the 2008 tax year
