STATEMENT 9

TO PROMOTE ALTERNATIVE SOLUTIONS TO THE NATION'S DRUG PROBLEMS.

Statement of Program Service Accomplishments

In 2008 Students for Sensible Drug Policy made significant strides in educating the public about the negative impact that the War on Drugs has on youth and students. Over the course of the year SSDP's affiliate network expanded from 125 chapters to over 150 chapters across the North America, while expanding the national staff to four full time employees, and opening a satellite office in San Francisco, CA.

In 2008, SSDP chapters at 30 colleges ran a total of 39 campus change campaigns, designed to reform punitive drug policies on college campuses and replace them with sensible policies. Of these, 11 resulted in successful policy changes. These changes occurred at the following schools:

- Kalamazoo College SSDP enacted a Good Samaritan Policy
- Kalamazoo College SSDP started a campus wide Safe Ride program
- Kalamazoo College SSDP kicked local police out of the dorms
- Franklin Pierce University SSDP enacted a Good Samaritan Policy
- Franklin Pierce University SSDP ended unannounced dorm searches
- University of Connecticut SSDP enacted a Good Samaritan Policy
- Missouri Southern State University SSDP enacted a Good Samaritan Policy
- University of Maryland SSDP stopped automatic dorm expulsion for marijuana possession
- North Carolina State SSDP started a Safe Ride Program
- Southern Methodist University enacted a Good Samaritan Policy
- Brown University SSDP created a scholarship program for students impacted by HEA.

SSDP organized our 10th Anniversary Conference and Alumni Reunion in College Park Maryland, which was held November 21-23, 2008. We were able to bring over 450 students and more than 500 members (including alumni and nonstudents), making it the largest conference in SSDP's ten year history. Saturday of the conference featured a full day of drug war education where students heard from a range of experts in the field including MPP's Rob Kampia, Ethan Nadelmann of the Drug Policy Alliance, Caren Woodson of Americans for Safe Access, and Adam Wolf of the ACLU. Prominent figures such as Congressman Danny Davis (D-IL) and BET/CNBC commentator Keith Boykin also addressed the conference. For the first time at an SSDP conference, a prohibitionist agreed to engage in a discussion on the Drug War during a debate between SSDP executive director Kris Krane and Students Taking Action Not Drugs founder Kevin Sabet.

The final day of the conference consisted entirely of activist skills training workshops. These included workshops on chapter organizing techniques, running a campus change campaign, fundraising, media relations, harm reduction training, and a workshop on using SSDP as a resume builder.

Over the course of the year, we developed a number of new materials to assist our chapters in running campaigns on their campuses. First and foremost, our new west coast outreach director revamped the organization's student organizing manual, making it more concise and less text heavy, ensuring that more new chapter leaders will take the time to absorb the information. Additionally, our field staff created a new sample chapter constitution and a new sample chapter budget that students can download from the website in order to ease the process of starting a new chapter.

We also developed a series of promotional materials for events that SSDP chapters can bring to their campuses. This includes flyers for screenings of the movie Busted, LEAP Speakers, SSDP's AMPLIFY Project, and a new debate series between SSDP executive director Kris Krane and Students Taking Action Not Drugs founder Kevin Sabet. We also created a new section of the SSDP website where chapter leaders can get information on bringing speakers and events to campus (<http://ssdp.org/resources/speakers/>).

SSDP has become one of the premier student organizations using Facebook as an organizing tool, and the popular social networking site has become one of the organization's principle tools for organizing chapters and events. There are currently more than 14,950 members of the SSDP Facebook Cause, with thousands of other members in more than 80 SSDP regional and chapter Facebook groups, as well as issue-based groups monitored and maintained by the organization. We have also created campaign-specific Facebook groups for our Campus Change Campaigns, so the national office can provide advice and guidance while chapter leaders share tactics and lessons learned during the course of a campaign.

In July 2008 SSDP organized a weekend long leadership summit in Washington DC that was attended by nearly all SSDP national board members as well as SSDP's most promising chapter leaders. The weekend featured roundtable discussions, workshops, and trainings on grassroots organizing techniques, fundraising, student organizing, and SSDP specific campaigns. This leadership summit helped lead to the development of SSDP's 2009 strategic plan.
