Since JRF was founded in 1976, the organization has awarded more than
\$1.3 million in scholarships to over 600 women across the United
States. The program focuses on providing need-based financial aid to
adult women returning to school. Award recipients are selected among
hundreds of applicants in a competitive, three-tier review process.
Data from respondents to annual surveys in 2006-2008 show that 97.2%
had graduated or were making academic progress.

In 2008, JRF received 601 applications from women seeking financial aid
for college. To be eligible for a JRF scholarship, an applicant must
be a woman age 35 or older, a U.S. citizen, enrolled in or accepted to
an accredited school, pursuing a technical or vocational education, an
