KS Wild's Conservation Program is designed to fulfill the group's mission to protect and restore the biological diversity of the Klamath-Siskiyou region. This area, stretching roughly from Roseburg, Oregon in the north to Redding, California in the south, and from the Pacific coast to the Cascade crest, contains some of the most ecologically critical wildlands along the entire West coast of the U.S. Our focus is the more than 6 million acres of federal public lands in this region, administered by the National Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The Conservation Program was created in response to a history of ecologically destructive land management practices, including widespread clearcutting of old-growth forests, road building, cattle grazing and suppression of natural fire regimes. The core of this effort is our Forest Watch program, which monitors every proposed federal land management project in our area of focus. We comment, appeal, and litigate, when necessary, against projects that pose a threat to forest health and biological diversity. One of KS Wild's most significant achievements of 2008 was the cancellation of the Kelsey-Whisky timber sale, which would have fragmented a 46,000-acre roadless area on BLM lands adjacent to Oregon's Rogue River.

KS Wild's Forest Watch work is primarily a defensive approach to wildlands conservation. A more proactive approach is embodied in a variety of local, regional and national Campaigns that join KS Wild with other groups and networks to address a range of issues, including protection of threatened and endangered species, achieving designated Wilderness status for roadless areas, and promoting sustainable strategies to reduce the threat of catastrophic wildfire in the wildlands/urban interface zone. Campaigns and networking enhance our impact and bring national attention to these issues. KS Wild's Campaign work against the BLM's Western Oregon Plan Revisions (WOPR) was an important focus in 2008. The WOPR would have vastly increased clearcut logging, reduced protections for riparian and aquatic habitat, and undermined protections for threatened and endangered species. KS Wild staff, working with other conservation organizations, used the internet, print media, and action alerts to our members to educate the public and build a strong coalition to oppose this misguided plan. Our efforts came to fruition in 2009, with the new administration's decision to withdraw the WOPR and reinstate the management guidelines of the Northwest Forest Plan.

The third critical element of KS Wild's Conservation Program is Outreach. We work to educate the public about the value of intact, healthy ecosystems and the long-term ecological and economic consequences of federal land management practices, including timber sales, road construction, predator control, public lands grazing and recreational developments. In order to fulfill these goals we produce and distribute a quarterly print newsletter (3,500 copies per issue) and bimonthly email updates, lead hikes, show environmental films, and coordinate a variety of educational public events.

This bill, along with companion Senate legislation, would have increased protections for tributaries of the Wild Rogue River and expanded the Oregon Caves National Monument. The summer, 2008 issue of KS Wild's quarterly print newsletter had one page devoted to this issue, and staff visited Washington, D.C. to meet with legislators and their aides to push for passage of this bill.
