Lund Family Center's nationally awarded Adoption program, which is licensed by the State of Vermont, offers comprehensive lifelong services for birth parents, pre-adoptive and post-adoptive families, and adoptive children. In fiscal year 2009 (July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009) the organization provided:

- permanent homes for 187 children through adoption services, including 158 children who had been in foster care,
- comprehensive post-adoption services for 120 individual children, and
- search and reunion services for 1,161 individuals.

The Residential and Community Treatment program, which is licensed by the State of Vermont, offers a comprehensive approach to working with pregnant and parenting young women, their children, and other key family members. In fiscal year 2009 the organization provided:

- therapeutic residential treatment for 84 women and their 84 children and
- therapeutic outpatient treatment for 98 women and their 69 children.

Outcomes in 2009 included:

- 100% of babies born at Lund were born substance free,
- 100% of babies born at Lund were born within normal gestation period, and
- 96% of the women who made planned discharges from Lund's residential and community services did not relapse within 6 months after their discharge.

Lund Family Center is a statewide organization that operates in all of Vermont's 14 counties. The mission is to help children thrive by serving families with children; pregnant or parenting teens and young adults; and adoptive families. Lund focuses on three goals: reducing child abuse and neglect, strengthening families, and helping to create new families through adoption.

From its inception back in 1890 as "The Home for Friendless Women" Lund Family Center has worked for the past 120 years to improve the lives of women and children. Lund Family Center has evolved over the years to meet the changing needs of society, all the while, staying true to our mission of helping children thrive. Lund is a comprehensive parent/child resource and is a designated Parent Child Center for families in Chittenden County.

Lund Family Center is also Vermont's oldest and largest private non-profit adoption agency and has completed more than 8,700 adoptions. The program is licensed by the State of Vermont as a child placing agency. Lund Family Center was a 2009 recipient of the Congressional Angel in Adoption Award and has received an Award of Excellence from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, A March of Dimes Lifetime Achievement Award, and 2009 SAMHSA award. Lund's adoption services include comprehensive lifelong services to birth parents, adoptive families and adoptees. Services include: counseling, post-adoption support services, search and reunion services, home studies and preplacement services. Lund works in partnership with the State of Vermont to run Project Family, a program to find homes for older Vermont children up to age 18, who are awaiting adoption while in state custody. Since its founding in 2000, Project Family has found permanent homes for more than 250 older children. Lund has a sliding scale for adoption services.

Lund runs a comprehensive gender-specific residential treatment program and a

transitional housing program for pregnant and parenting adolescents, women, and their children. The residential program is the only one of its kind in Vermont.

Our comprehensive array of services include:

- Therapeutic residential treatment for women and their children;
- Therapeutic outpatient substance abuse and mental health treatment for women and children;
- Quality, affordable childcare and early education;
- Teen pregnancy prevention panels that go to schools and community centers to work to prevent teen pregnancy;
- Reach Up welfare to work programming for 404 individuals;
- Home visits to at-risk families in Chittenden County;
- High school and G.E.D. education and college support services to pregnant and parenting women;
- Job training programs;
- Supervised visitation program;
- Family Education: An array of educational groups to help women improve their parenting skills, increase their skills in learning to live independently, and therapeutic groups that help support treatment goals.

Through a federal HHS grant, Lund works with the Chittenden County, Vermont Dept of Children and Families on a program that provides assistance to families who come to the attention of the state for possible child abuse or neglect; the assistance is provided as early as possible to ensure successful outcomes. The three projects under the program's umbrella include (1) the development of two assessment beds for women and their children, which is located at Lund Family Center, the purpose of which is to avoid family disruption while allowing for a comprehensive assessment and treatment recommendations for the family in a safe supportive and supervised

environment; (2) the co-location of some of Lund's clinicians and case managers in DCF offices to allow for immediate screening, assessment and referral of families during the initial investigation and assessment phase of the child protective services case; and (3) a children's play lab model used to enhance and increase the availability of visitation for families involved with child protection services in a child centered environment.

re-classify the position.

- Salary is determined taking into account education, years of experience, and internal equity with goals to ensure that employees throughout the agency are compensated fairly and in a consistent manner. Salary for a new employee is determined by the HR Manager and Executive Director in conjunction with the HR Consultant.

- Salary for management staff and the Executive Director follows internal protocols and is determined through the HR Consultant and Board President, and may include input from other Board Officers as appropriate.

- An analysis of fair market compensation is conducted annually by the HR Consultant, including review of current and applicable statewide and national data for both nonprofit and for profit sectors. Recommendations are made by HR Consultant to the Board of Trustees Finance Committee for Lund's internal compensation structure and implemented based on Board President review and budget considerations.
