MetLife Dance for Life initiative is a program that employs a physical art - dance- not only to inspire young people to experience the joy of art, but also to teach children the importance of physical fitness. Seventeen YA affiliates completed the program this year, bringing the total to 20,000 students who have participated in it over the past four years.

YA Network Program Plan: During FY2009 YA National and affiliate board and program staff worked with an arts in education consulting firm to conceptualize and develop a network wide plan for improving Young Audiences core services and programs throughout the country.
