## FY 2009 Program Summary

The organizations primary purpose it to promote and communicate the values, teachings and practice of peace and non-violence. To this end we work with stakeholders to develop the programs, structures and institutions which will support the transformation of their conflicts. This support is offered to diverse constituencies from students, educators and families in local communities, to senior political and civil society leadership, in three broad areas: advisory services to multi-stakeholder processes, support to peace education initiatives and support to humanitarian assistance programs.

## Program Review

The Peace Appeal continued to provide support to national stakeholders in Nepal's peace process, in conjunction with our partners the Academy for Educational Development, the Nepal Transitions to Peace Initiative ("NTTP"), and with financial support from United States Agency for International Development and the Swiss Federal Department of Foreign Affairs.

Our efforts included providing two senior technical advisors working in collaboration with the Nepal government and international agencies to provide advisory services, as well as technical assistance and training. One of the specific projects supported was the training of local facilitators who will assist the implementation of a nationwide network of local peace committees, including the development of manuals and strategic plans for their expansion. These committees are inclusive forums allowing local communities to address the effects of Nepal's 10 year civil war in their own localities. The number of committees have grown from 33 to 57.

Working in partnership with the Swiss government and NTTP we hosted a workshop for senior stakeholders from Nepal's political parties, government and former senior military leaders to discuss the challenges to the country's peace process posed by stalled efforts settle questions relating disarmament, demobilization and reintegration of military forces in the country.

We also mobilized an extensive team of legal scholars, practitioners and researchers in response to a request from Nepalese stakeholders. The team provided assistance to the national working group in Nepal focused on developing the enabling legislation for a truth and reconciliation process. The report which they delivered to the national stakeholders during the year was drawn up after extensive consultations with national

stakeholders themselves, local and international human rights organizations, and bi-lateral and multi-lateral aid institutions.

The Peace Appeal continued to support peace and humanitarian assistance efforts to populations made most vulnerable by Sri Lanka's long running conflict. We worked with local and international peace organizations monitoring the humanitarian needs of populations affected by the fighting ending the war in Sri Lanka. Through our own networks, we supported the delivery of food, basic medicines and educational materials and other necessities to homes caring for orphans and other children.

At the request of international private and multi-lateral institutions we supported the provision of technical assistance to dialogue initiatives in Lebanon.

We continue to collaborate on peace education efforts internationally with our partners, the Dream of the Good in Sweden, and the Swiss based Get the Point Initiative, helping these programs expand to schools and regions in Europe, the Middle East and North America, and aiding the development of curricular and other educational materials.

In our support of local stakeholders in conflicts, a core element of our approach is to focus on shared knowledge creation. To this end we worked with software developers to create two new online tools which allow stakeholders in conflicts to jointly create, manage and share information pertinent to their peacebuilding endeavors. Additionally, we continued our research and education efforts, including primary and secondary research and compiling of case studies, reports and other information resources on peace processes and ongoing conflicts for stakeholders and practitioners in our field. These resources are made available in both private and public online networks.
