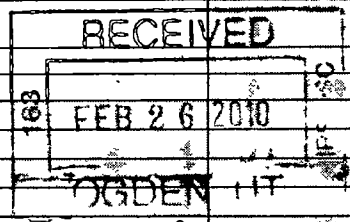

The mission of the Uncommon Individual Foundation ("UIF") is to research, educate about and encourage the use of mentoring in its original and most natural form. It is guided by the belief that every individual is singularly unique and has an identifiable Core Strength. Our research indicates that an individual's self-defined success in life is ultimately realized by having Knowledge of their Core Strength and Empowering themselves with the Passion to use it in the development, pursuit and Navigation of their self-defined Dreams.

For over 20 years, the UIF has educated and physically helped set up and train personnel in scores of mentoring programs in over 25 states. We originally used only printed material to educate train and encourage mentors, protégés and coordinates. We produced over 50 training manuals, which have been distributed to approximately 10,000 participants, who then continued to receive training from the Foundation. During the past six years the UIF has planned, organized, developed and now beta-test-released a web and advanced technology based application of its core mission. This web-based approach is designed to enable the UIF to continue to implement its mission using the

Foundation's original concept of Open-System Mentoring™ through the use of its web-based MentorSphere™, the mentoring environment each individual designs for themselves.

The UIF web-based mentoring application is being developed to be made available as the UIF Virtual Mentor™. Web-based URL's are being developed to identify and provide access to specific individually focused mentoring resources. Individual participants who desire to register and participate are endowed by the UIF to personally create their MentorSphere™ and engage Open-System Mentoring™ to identify and cultivate their mentoring resources. Participants are encouraged to engage these resources to form and focus their dreams and develop their passion to pursue them in their self defined mentoring environment (www.mentorsphere.com). Utilizing UIF web-based URL's, participants will eventually have the ability to use personal inventory technology to identify their Core Strength, understand and engage their Value System, Risk Temperament, Learning Styles, and other individual specific information to assist them in Forming, Focusing and Passionately Pursuing their Dreams in Pursuit of their Self Defined Personal Success (www.uif.org).

The UIF original in-person and now its web-based education and mentoring participation are designed for all individuals, starting with those who are at least close to an adolescent stage of life. Our web-based approach is designed for individuals who wish to organize and use their self-designed mentoring environment which we define as a MentorSphere™. The UIF also continues to present in-person training sessions for groups and makes available problem-solving resources for those involved in, or wanting to create their MentorSphere™. Currently the UIF is now continuing to implement its original in person mentoring education and training sessions together with its new web-based mentoring education and training applications.
