Note 1 – Organizational Activity

Utility Emergency Services Fund of Philadelphia ("UESF") was organized on January 20, 1983 as a Pennsylvania not-for-profit corporation. UESF provides direct financial assistance to low-income Philadelphia residents who are unable to pay their utility bills solely with their own funds and face the loss of their electric, gas or water services. UESF is funded through government grants, public and private donations. In addition, participating utility companies fund staff and office operating costs for UESF.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of UESF have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and accordingly reflect all significant receivables, payables, and other liabilities.

Basis of Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, *Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations*. Under SFAS No. 117, UESF is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. For the year ended June 30, 2009, UESF had no permanently restricted net assets.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Expense Allocation

The costs of providing various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the Statement of Activities and in the Statement of Functional Expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue

Donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the Statement of Activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Contract Revenue

UESF receives substantially all of its contract revenue from City agencies. UESF recognizes contract revenue from its contracts either on a pro-rata basis over a 12-month period, which represents the service period for certain contracts, or to the extent of expenses.

Any of the funding sources may, at its discretion, request reimbursement for expenses or return of funds, or both, as a result of non-compliance by UESF with the terms of the grants/contracts.

Property and Equipment and Depreciation

Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation of property and equipment is provided using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the property and equipment.

Accounts, Contracts and Contributions Receivable

Accounts, contracts and contributions receivable are stated at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. Balances that are still outstanding after management has used reasonable collection efforts are written off through a charge to bad debt expense.

Income Taxes

The Internal Revenue Service has classified UESF as exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Federal Income Tax Code; and as an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c) of the Code; and as an organization that is not a private foundation as defined in Section 509(a) of the Code.

Statement of Cash Flows

UESF considers all investments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Note 3 – Funding Sources

Settlements

Settlement of past due utility bills for qualified applicants are funded by grants from the Office of Housing and Community Development (OHCD) and private donations. Amounts paid to the utility company by UESF are matched by the participating utility and, whenever possible, a contribution is made by the applicant. UESF will provide assistance for PECO, Philadelphia Gas Works (PGW) and the Philadelphia Water Department (PWD) applicants up to the maximum of \$500 per applicant, including the amount matched by the utility. In addition, UESF under a different contract will provide assistance to Philadelphia Gas Works (PGW) for applicants up to the maximum of \$1,000 per applicant.

OHCD provides grants to be paid to the participating utility companies on behalf of eligible households. OHCD contracted to provide funds totaling \$1,525,000 for the year ended June 30, 2009.

Administrative Expenses

Three participating utility companies are the primary source of funding for UESF's operating costs.

Note 4 – Pension Plan

UESF sponsors a Simplified Employee Pension (SEP) plan for their employees. The SEP is funded by UESF for each employee based upon a predetermined percentage of salary. For the year ended June 30, 2009, contributions under this plan were \$28,734.

Note 5 – Contributions from Utility Companies

The following represents a summary of contributions received by UESF for the year ended June 30, 2009 from PECO, PGW, and PWD for operating expenses and public relations activities:

UESF anticipates funding from the utility companies for the year ending June 30, 2010 of \$660,147. As of June 30, 2009, PWD has committed to funding \$220,149 for operating and public relations expenditures. Subsequent to year end, PGW and PECO has committed to their share of \$220,149.

Note 6 – Satisfaction of Program Restrictions

Net assets of \$242,065 were released from donor restrictions for the year ended June 30, 2009 by incurring expenses satisfying the restricted purposes specified by the donors.

Note 1 - General Information

The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal and city awards presents the activities in all the federal programs of Utility Emergency Services Fund of Philadelphia (UESF). All financial assistance received directly from federal agencies as well as financial assistance passed through other governmental agencies or not-for-profit organizations are included in the schedule.

The UESF Community Development Block Grant contract number 0920118 was established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development through the City of Philadelphia, Office of Housing and Community Development (OHCD) as grantee, to assist needy Philadelphia residents in settling their past-due utility bills. In addition, the City of Philadelphia directly provides \$1,000,000 for the same purpose under contract 0820021-02.

Funds made available through this contract were to be expended only as grants to be paid to participating utility companies on behalf of eligible households. Revenues and expenditures relating to Contract Numbers 0920118 and 0820021-02 are included in the UESF financial statements.

Under Contract Numbers 0920118 and 0820021-01, between OHCD and UESF commencing on July 1, 2008, OHCD agreed to pay compensation for services provided in the Contracts, a sum not to exceed \$525,000 and \$1,000,000, respectively for the year ended June 30, 2009, of which \$525,000 was federal financial assistance and the \$1,000,000 was from City financial assistance.

Note 2 - Basis of Accounting

The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal and city awards is presented using the accrual basis of accounting. The amounts reported in this schedule as expenditures may differ from certain financial reports submitted to federal agencies due to those reports being submitted on either a cash or modified accrual basis of accounting.

Note 3 - Relationship to Basic Financial Statements

Federal and city awards and expenditures are reported on the statements of activities and functional expenses as program services. In certain programs, the expenditures reported in the basic financial statements may differ from the expenditures reported in the schedule of federal and city awards due to program expenditures exceeding grant or contract budget limitations which are not included as federal and city awards.
