

The Open World Program was established to enable emerging Russian leaders to gain firsthand exposure to the American system of democracy through visits to local governments and communities in the United States. This year, KHSI was awarded its fifth Open World grant, supporting our seventh delegation from Russia. In November 2009, we will be hosting this delegation of twelve professionals focusing on social issues/social services. Home stays are a centerpiece of the Open World experience and host families have been identified to provide this experience for the delegates.

Expansion Country Hosting Program - Azerbaijan

The congressionally sponsored Open World Program has recently expanded its reach to include delegations from Azerbaijan, among other countries. KHSI was awarded the grant to host a delegation of seven professionals under the Social Issues - Equal Participation in Public Life for People with Disabilities focus theme. The emphasis was to observe and learn about a number of examples of community-based supports that have enabled individuals with disabilities in the U.S. to live full and meaningful lives

Pennsylvania Partnerships Abroad, Ltd.

This program involves Masters Degree business students from the University of Economics in Wroclaw, Poland, who work and study with American businesses in

Pennsylvania. Keystone works with both the Pennsylvania non-profit humanitarian organization known as Pennsylvania Partnerships Abroad, Ltd. (PPA) and the University of Economics in Wroclaw. Keystone is proud to have participated in this program during the last seven years. For the 2009/10 hosting year, the Keystone Partnership provided training for an individual in public relations and marketing.

Felty's (President of Keystone Human Services, parent company to this Organization) efforts have lead to a formal Commitment for Action in support of the Initiative's Global Health priority. This Commitment centers on the Keystone Global Partners (KGP) program. The KGP model is built on years of Keystone Human Services' work empowering community leaders and professionals through our International Practical Training Program and International Professional Exchanges. KGP aims to apply the strengths of America's private nonprofit sector to help build the capacity of emerging non-government organizations (NGOs) in countries that are just beginning to develop their human service systems in the areas of autism, education, health care, intellectual disability, mental illness, and physical disability. The ultimate goal of the

program is to advance systems of care - coordinated networks of services and supports - for people with disabilities around the globe.

International Federation of Educative Communities (FICE)

FICE, an international organization developing systems of care throughout the world, has re-established FICE-United States, with Dennis W. Felty serving as President.

The current major focus of FICE-USA is to organize sponsoring partnerships, and develop a structure to partner with other international sponsors, and promote the growth of activities with FICE-South Africa.

Development and Support of International Initiatives

As a result of our efforts, KHSI has become the "Founder" (i.e. sole member) of two international NGOs that are organized to develop programs to support children, adults and families with developmental disabilities. The first NGO is organized in Moldova and is called Keystone Human Services Moldova Association. This is a Moldovan NGO. The second is organized in Russia and is called Keystone Social Educational Foundation for Social Assistance to Children and Families. This is a Russian NGO. Both of these NGO organizations have offices in their respective countries, file required regulatory financial reports, maintain bank accounts and conduct general business affairs. The Founder does not have access to the bank accounts. Grants and fundraising for these NGOs is conducted by KHSI and amounts are transferred to support the activities of the NGOs.

These activities are consistent with the tax exempt activities of KHSI and related KHS entities.

The following are the accomplishments of these two organizations.

KHSI Moldova Association (KHSIMA)

KHSIMA operates two Children and Family Centers based on Keystone's successful Head Start Center model, with program integration to address the specific needs of each community where these Centers are established. Located in the village of Tudora since 2004, KHSIMA's first program was designated "The Unity Center" (Unitate) by the children who are supported there. This Center serves an average of 25 children annually, whose circumstances indicate an environment of extreme risk, particularly due to poverty, alcoholism, and being left behind when parents leave to find work in other countries. Satisfaction of local families and community leadership has so increased the demand for services that a larger facility is being developed. This new building, known as The Janice Wenger Unity Center, will have the capacity to serve fifty or more children and their families, once realized.

In 2007, with financial assistance of the European Commission, a second Children & Family Center opened its doors in the town of Bacioi, a suburb of the Capital of Chisinau. Named "Vis" (Dream), this program also focuses on the community's most vulnerable children. Thirty-four (34) children and their families are served annually. Participants learn life skills, nutrition, cooking and hygiene, in addition to English, music, and art classes. They have educational opportunities, gain self-esteem, and most importantly, have fun. Students also experience a

nurturing environment, which is heated and well-lit.

The Bacioi Center is a place where they can access a computer, have a hot meal,

complete their homework, build friendships, and engage in after-school activities.

Community for All- Moldova

KHSI has been supporting and collaborating on the development of a project in Moldova to transform the residential system of care for children and adults with disabilities by replacing long-stay residential institutions with comprehensive, coordinated, community-based services and supports. Through a partnership between KHSI, the Moldovan Ministry of Social Protection - Family and Child (MSPFC), Open Society Mental Health Initiative (OSMHI), Soros Foundation - Moldova (SFM), and Hope and Homes for Children (HHC), this project targets the closure of the institution for boys with disabilities in Orhei, and other institutions, and develops the necessary alternative services in the community. Over the project's planned five years, policies, legislation, implementation mechanisms, and the capacity and tools needed to sustain this transformation over the long term are being developed.

KHSI was successful with a grant proposal to OSMHI (a program of the Soros

Foundation) to be the main implementing partner in the project. The grant was

approved for \$686,000 for the first 15 months of the five-year project. (Starting

10/15/08) Additional grant awards for the balance of the program will be negotiated

based on the progress of the initiative. A special focus will be given to quality of

services and their sustainability in all aspects, from financial and human

resources, to legislative frameworks and monitoring mechanisms. In addition to these

KFCF

Keystone Foundation for Children and Families (KFCF), a Russian NGO focuses on support for children with disabilities and their families, as well as the thousands of children who languish in orphanages. Advocacy efforts highlight the importance of keeping children in the community and providing families with the necessary supports to promote a secure and meaningful life.

USAID North Caucasus Project

Keystone's USAID-funded initiative has come to a fruitful conclusion in the North Caucasus region of Russia, having initiated two comprehensive systems of services and supports through Centers in North Ossetia and Kabardino Balkaria.

Keystone is pleased that other parties have recognized the positive impact of several of our pilot programs and will be continuing many of their invaluable services and supports.

Based on most recent Quarterly Progress Report, an estimated 870 vulnerable children and their families in North Ossetia and Kabardino-Balkaria received counseling and

therapy services as a result of this project. Direct beneficiaries of this project also included 415 adults served at the two Centers. Total direct beneficiaries from the two Center programs, including children, was over 1,200, with an estimated 3,600 indirect beneficiaries. Over 1,000 youth participated in youth club programs and events sponsored by the project. Additionally, the number of organizations engaged in the development, reform, and/or implementation of comprehensive systems of care for children and their families through this initiative was over 130.

Open Society Institute Mental Health Initiative: Consultation to Community-Based Rehabilitation Centers and Mobile Rehabilitation Teams in Azerbaijan

KHSI has been awarded a grant from OSI/MHI to provide "Consultation to Community Based Rehabilitation Centers and Mobile Rehabilitation (CBRCs) teams in Azerbaijan. The project will focus on Early Intervention services by providing consultation from specialists in speech therapy, occupational therapy, and child psychology as it pertains to children with autism, intellectual disabilities, and cerebral palsy. The project will be to develop and provide a program of consultation and training activities responsive to the needs of two OSMHI-supported CBRCs.
