In addition, RI reimburses the president and president-elect for certain costs associated with maintaining their personal residences while they are traveling on behalf of the association. These expense reimbursements are taxable to the recipients. 5 HEALTH OR SOCIAL CLUB DUES OR INITIATION FEES.
