There are two classes of Members of Munson Healthcare: (1) Elected Members; and (2) Ex-Officio Members. There is no separate voting by class on matters brought to vote by the Members. Each Elected Member and each Ex-Officio Member shall have one (1) vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the Members.

The Elected Members of the Corporation shall consist of not more than two hundred (200) persons, at least two-thirds of whom shall be residents of Grand Traverse, Leelanau, Benzie, Kalkaska and Antrim Counties of the State of Michigan at the time of their election to membership. No person shall be eligible as an Elected Member after attaining the age of eighty-five.

Each Elected Member shall be nominated by the Board of Directors pursuant to recommendation by the Governance Committee and elected by the Members to serve a five (5) year term. An Elected Member's term shall automatically cease in the event the individual becomes an Ex-Officio Member. The Elected Members shall be divided into staggered terms so that nearly equal numbers shall be elected each year.

The Ex-Officio Members of the Corporation shall consist of each director or trustee serving on the boards of directors or board of trustees of certain subsidiary and affiliate organizations.

Any transactions with disqualified persons are subject to prior approval of fair market value by the CVC Committee. The responses are reviewed and summarized by Munson Healthcare's legal department. A full report is presented to the CVC Committee for its review and approval. The CVC Committee utilizes the questionnaire responses to evaluate any transaction with a potential conflict.

Munson Healthcare (MHC) is a Michigan nonprofit corporation organized to direct the delivery of a broad array of health care services provided through its various subsidiaries and affiliates. The Munson Healthcare system consists of a major tertiary referral hospital, Munson Medical Center; a Critical Access Hospital, Paul Oliver Memorial Hospital; extensive outpatient treatment and rehabilitation facilities; and ancillary emergency, transportation and home-based medical services. The Munson Healthcare system also has affiliation relationships with several rurally based medical centers and has a service area that covers 24 counties in Michigan's northern Lower Peninsula and eastern portion of the Upper Peninsula.

Munson Healthcare provided \$36 million in community benefit for the residents of northern Michigan in fiscal year 2009. Included in this community benefit is the cost of providing charity care, bad debt, the unreimbursed cost of Medicare and Medicaid services, and numerous uncompensated community health improvement services and programs. Of special note are the outreach programs that Munson Healthcare initiated, facilitated, and supported in carrying out the tax-exempt purpose of providing health care to the communities it serves.
