of the
OZARKS TECHNICAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOUNDATION

February 1, 1996

ARTICLE I. PURPOSES

The purposes of the Ozarks Technical Community College Foundation shall be the same purposes as set forth in the Articles of Incorporation of the Foundation. The same, from time to time, may be amended.

ARTICLE II. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Duties. The property, business and affairs of the Foundation shall be controlled, conducted and managed by a Board of Directors who shall exercise all the corporate powers of the Foundation.

Section 2. Number. The number of Directors of the Foundation shall be thirty-one, which may be increased or decreased from time to time by amendment to these Bylaws. Two shall be *ex-officio* Directors and twenty-nine shall be elected Directors, as provided in these Bylaws. The elected Directors and *ex-officio* Directors of the Foundation shall constitute the Board of Directors, hereinafter called the "Board".

Section 3. *Ex-Officio* Directors. There shall be two *ex-officio* members of the Board who shall serve as members by virtue of and during the terms of their respective offices. The President of Ozarks Technical Community College or his/her designee, and a member of the Board of Trustees of Ozarks Technical Community College. They will be designated by the Board of Trustees and shall serve as the *ex-officio* non-voting members of the Board.

Section 4. Directors Elected. There shall be twenty-nine elected members of the Board who shall be elected in such manner and for such terms that will result in the expiration of the terms of office of approximately one-third of the members on a staggered basis as provided in the Bylaws.

Section 5. Nominations. Nominations for election of Directors shall be made by a nominating committee consisting of the President of Ozarks Technical Community College, the President of the Ozarks Technical Community College Foundation, and three members of the Board of Directors of the Foundation who are appointed by the President of the Foundation.

Section 6. Elections. At the annual meeting of the Board, or at a duly constituted special meeting of the Board, the Directors then serving shall, by a majority vote of Directors then in office, elect such other Directors as may be authorized by the Bylaws.

Section 7. Vacancies. A vacancy on the Board of Directors caused by death, resignation, removal or otherwise, may be filled for the unexpired term by the Board of Directors from nominations made by a nominating committee consisting of the President of Ozarks Technical Community College, the President of the Ozarks Technical Community College Foundation, and three members of the Board of Directors of the Foundation who are appointed by the President of the Foundation.

Section 8. Term of Office.

A. *Ex-Officio* Directors. The President of Ozarks Technical Community College and a member of the Board of Trustees of Ozarks Technical Community College shall serve as directors as long as they hold their respective offices.

B. Elected Directors of the Board. The number of elected Directors of the Board shall be twenty-nine and shall serve terms of three years, except as described below

shall remain on the Board until their successors are elected at the annual meeting in 1999 from nominations submitted by the nominating committee of the Ozarks Technical Community College Foundation Board of Directors, at which time their respective terms shall expire and their successors shall be elected for three-year terms.

Six additional Directors, for a total of twelve elected Directors, shall be selected by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at the annual meeting in 1997 from nominations submitted by the nominating committee of the Ozarks Technical Community College Board of Directors, and shall serve respective terms of three years, and shall remain on the Board until their successors are elected at the annual meeting in 2000, at which time their respective terms shall expire and their successors shall be elected for three-year terms

Six additional Directors, for a total of eighteen elected Directors, shall be selected by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at the annual meeting in 1998 from nominations submitted by the nominating committee of the Ozarks Technical Community College Foundation Board of Directors, and shall serve respective terms of three years and shall remain on the Board until their successors are elected at the annual meeting in 2001, at which time their respective terms shall expire and their successors shall be elected for three-year terms

ARTICLE III. MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Meetings. An annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held at such place as may be fixed by resolution of the Board upon at least ten (10) days' notice, within ninety (90) days before July 1 of each year.

Regular meetings of the Board of Directors, other than annual meetings, may be held at such time and place as, from time to time, shall be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors or by written consent of the members thereof

Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of the President of the Board of Directors or any five (5) members of the Board of Directors. The person(s) authorized to call a special meeting of the Board of Directors shall fix the time and place where such meeting shall be held. Notice of any special meeting of the Board of Directors shall be given at least seven (7) days previous thereto by written notice to each director at his/her address as shown on the records of the Foundation

Section 2. Notice of Meeting. The Executive Director or the Secretary of the Foundation shall give notice of every meeting of the Board of Directors, in writing, at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting date. Neither the business to be transacted, nor the purpose of any regular or special meeting need be specified in the meeting notice.

Section 3. Quorum. A majority of the number of Directors of the Board as then appointed shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Board.

Section 4. Voting. At all meetings of the Board, each Director is to have one vote. The

act of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board

Section 5. Removal. Any one or more of the Directors may be removed, either with or without cause, at any meeting of the Board by a vote of a majority of all Directors currently serving in office.

Section 6. Indemnity. The Foundation shall indemnify and save harmless each and every Director from all liability arising out of the performance of his/her or their functions, duties and/or responsibilities, express or implied, under these Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation of the Foundation

ARTICLE IV. OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers.

- A. **Honorary Chairman.** The first Honorary Chairman shall be selected by the President of Ozarks Technical Community College. This process will be ratified by the Ozarks Technical Community College Board of Trustees. The Honorary Chairman shall remain in this position until a successor is elected by a majority vote of the entire Board of Directors of the Ozarks Technical Community College Foundation.
- B. **Executive Officers.** Executive Officers of the Foundation shall be the President, President Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, and Executive Director

The initial Executive Officers shall be appointed by the President of Ozarks Technical Community College with the advice and consent of the Ozarks Technical Community College Board of Trustees. The initial Executive Officers will serve until the regular annual meeting of the Foundation Board of Directors in 1997. Thereafter, the Executive Officers will be elected annually by the Board of Directors at the regular annual meeting of the Board. The President and President Elect shall be selected from the Board of Directors. The Secretary and Treasurer may or may not be a member of the Board of Directors

The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by the same person. The Executive Director of the Foundation shall not be a member of the Board of Directors.

- C. **Ex Officio Members of the Executive Committee.** The Executive Director shall be a non-voting *ex officio* member of the Executive Committee
- D. **Voting Privileges of Secretary and Treasurer.** The Secretary and Treasurer shall have no voting privileges at the meetings of the Board of Directors unless the Secretary and Treasurer are also members of the Board of Directors

Section 2. Removal. Any officer elected by the Board of Directors may be removed at any time by a vote of a majority of the entire Board of Directors

Section 3. Vacancies. A vacancy in any office caused by death, resignation, removal or otherwise, may be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired term

Section 4. Compensation. The Board of Directors may determine the compensation, if any, to be received by officers of the Foundation and agents appointed by the Board of Directors

Section 5. Bond. The Board of Directors, by resolution, may require the officers and agents of

the Foundation, or any of them, to give bond to the Foundation, in sufficient amount and with sufficient surety, to secure the faithful performance of their duties, and to comply with such other conditions as the Board of Directors may, from time to time, require.

ARTICLE V. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President. The President shall be the principal executive officer of the Foundation. Subject to the direction and control of the Board of Directors, he/she shall be in charge of the business and affairs of the Foundation; he/she shall see that the resolutions and directives of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee are carried into effect except in those instances in which that responsibility is assigned to some other person by the Board of Directors, and, in general, he/she shall discharge all duties incident to the office of President and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors. He/she shall preside at all meetings of the members, the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors. Except in those instances in which the authority to execute is expressly delegated to another officer or agent of the Foundation, or a different mode of execution is expressly prescribed by the Board of Directors or these bylaws, he/she may execute for the Foundation any contracts, deeds, mortgages, bonds or other instruments which the Board of Directors has authorized to be executed, and he/she may accomplish such execution either under or without the seal of the Foundation, and either individually or with the Secretary, or any other officer thereunto authorized by the Board of Directors, according to the requirements of the form of the instrument. He/she may vote all securities which the Foundation is entitled to vote except as and to the extent such authority shall be vested in a different officer of the Foundation by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. President Elect. The President Elect shall assist the President in the discharge of his/her duties as the President may direct, and shall perform such other duties as, from time to time, may be assigned to him/her by the President or by the Board of Directors. In the absence of the President or in the event of his inability or refusal to act or serve, the President Elect shall perform the duties of the President and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. Upon the expiration of the term of the President, in the absence of reelection, the President Elect shall stand for election to the office of President. Except in those instances in which the authority to execute is expressly delegated to another officer or agent of the Foundation, or a different mode of execution is expressly prescribed by the Board of Directors or these bylaws, the President elect may execute for the Foundation any contracts, deeds, mortgages, bonds or other instruments which the Board of Directors has authorized to be executed, and he/she may accomplish such execution either under or without the seal of the Foundation and either individually or with the Secretary, or any other officer thereunto authorized by the Board of Directors, according to the requirements of the form of the instrument.

Section 3. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be the principal accounting and financial officer of the Foundation. He/she shall (a) have charge of and be responsible for the maintenance of adequate books of account for the Foundation; (b) have charge and custody of all funds and securities of the Foundation, and be responsible therefore, and for the receipt and disbursement thereof; and (c) perform all the duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as, from time to time, may be assigned to him/her by the President or by the Board of Directors. If required by the Board of Directors, the Treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his/her duties in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine.

Section 4. Secretary. The Secretary shall record the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose, see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws or as required by law, be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the Foundation, keep a register of the post office address of each member of the Board of Directors which shall be furnished to the secretary by such member, and perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as, from time to time, may be assigned to him/her by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Executive Director. The first Executive Director of the Foundation shall be recommended to the Board of Trustees for appointment by the President of Ozarks Technical Community

College. The subsequent Executive Director of the Foundation shall be recommended to the Board of Trustees for appointment by the President of Ozarks Technical Community College after consultation and input throughout the search process from the Foundation's executive committee. The Executive Director has no voting privileges and shall serve as the primary staff person for the Foundation

ARTICLE VI. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. Membership and Duties. An Executive Committee consisting of the President, President Elect, Secretary, Treasurer, Executive Director and three additional members of the Board may be created by a majority vote of the entire Board of Directors to serve at the pleasure of the Board with the President of the Board to act as chairperson thereof. The Board of Directors shall fill the vacancies on the committee. Between meetings of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee shall possess and may exercise any and all powers of the Board of Directors in the management of the business and affairs of the Foundation, to the extent authorized by resolution adopted by a majority vote of the entire Board of Directors. The Executive Committee shall keep a complete record of its activities and regularly report them to the Board of Directors at every meeting thereof. All action taken by the Executive Committee shall be subject to revision, alteration or change by the Board of Directors, provided that the rights of those persons shall not be affected thereby. The Executive Committee shall serve one-year terms and be elected annually at the regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Meetings of the Executive Committee. A majority of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The Executive Committee may determine the time and place for its meetings, the notice necessary therefore and its rules of procedure.

ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

The Board of Directors, by majority vote of the entire Board, may establish committees as it shall deem necessary. Members of such committees shall hold their membership for such terms and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as the Board may, from time to time, determine.

ARTICLE VIII. SEAL

The seal of the Foundation shall be in the form of a circle, and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the Foundation and the words "Corporate Seal" and "Missouri".

ARTICLE IX. CONTRACTS, PROXY, LOANS, CHECKS AND DEPOSITS

Section 1. Contracts. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Foundation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Proxy. Unless otherwise ordered by the Board, the President of the Foundation (1) shall have full power and authority to act and vote, in the name of and on behalf of the Foundation, at any meeting of shareholders of any other corporation in which the Foundation may hold shares, and at any such meeting shall possess and may exercise any and all rights and powers incident to the ownership of such shares; and (2) shall have full power and authority to execute, in the name of and on behalf of the Foundation, proxies authorizing any suitable person(s) to act and to vote at any meeting of shareholders of any other corporation in which the Foundation may hold shares, and at any such meeting the person(s) so designated shall possess and may exercise any and all rights and powers incident to the ownership of such shares.

Section 3. Loans. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Foundation and no evidence of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution of the Board of Directors. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 4. Checks, Drafts, Other Orders. All checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Foundation shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Foundation and in such manner as shall, from time to time, be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Deposits. All funds of the Foundation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Foundation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select

Section 6. Gifts. The Board of Directors may accept, on behalf of the Foundation, any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purposes of the Foundation

ARTICLE X. WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever any notice is required to be given pursuant to the Bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation of the Foundation, or the corporation laws of the State of Missouri, a written waiver thereof signed by the person or persons entitled thereto, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall satisfy such requirement of notice

ARTICLE XI. AMENDMENTS

The Bylaws of the Foundation may be altered or repealed and new Bylaws may be adopted by a vote of the majority of the Board of Directors at any annual meeting or at any special meeting with at least 30 days notice to the Board members, setting forth the terms of the proposed Bylaws, amendment, or repeal

ARTICLE XII. INVESTMENTS AND EARNINGS

Section 1. Investments. The Foundation shall have the right and responsibility of using, retaining, investing and reinvesting all or any part of any securities, monies, property or funds acquired or held by it in whatever manner according to the judgment of the Board, without restriction of any kinds, provided that the intent of the donor is honored and provided further that no actions shall be taken by or on behalf of the Foundation if such action is a prohibited transaction and would result in the denial, suspension, or revocation of tax-exempt status under the United States Internal Revenue Code, as amended, for the Foundation

Section 2. Earnings. No member, director, officer, employee or any other person shall receive at any time any of the net earnings or pecuniary profit from the operations of the Foundation except that nothing shall prevent the payment of reasonable compensation for services rendered to or for the Foundation in pursuance of any of its purposes, such compensation to be fixed by the Board

ARTICLE XIII. BOOKS AND RECORDS

The Foundation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors and committees having any of the authority of the Board of Directors, and shall keep at its registered or principal office a record giving the names and addresses of the directors entitled to vote. All books and records of the Foundation may be inspected by any director, or his/her agent or attorney, for any proper purpose at any reasonable time. The books of the Foundation shall be audited annually beginning with fiscal year 1997

ARTICLE XIV. FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Foundation shall be fixed by resolution of the Board of Directors

ARTICLE XV. TYPES OF FUNDS

Section 1. Unrestricted Fund. Resources of the Foundation which are currently expendable for any Foundation purpose, including operating expenses, of the Foundation.

Section 2. Restricted Funds. Foundation funds restricted by the donor for a specific use or program.

A. General Restricted Fund

This fund will be used to accumulate all general restricted contributions by account or type of restriction. The restricted purpose of these funds will be fulfilled by the Board during its allocation of monies to specific programs, usually on an annual basis.

B. Special Designated Restricted Fund

The purpose of this fund is to allow the donor to designate a specific program. In order to achieve special designation, the initial or annual contribution by the donor must be a minimum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500). The only limitation on this gift is that no designation may be made for a specific person.

C. Donor Recommended Restricted Fund

This fund is a different type of restricted fund. Any donation of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or more can be placed in a specially restricted fund which can be utilized for different purposes based upon periodic recommendations by the donor. Recipients of the benefits from the fund must otherwise qualify under the guidelines of the Foundation and the final decision will rest with the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Endowment Funds. Funds received with the stipulation that the principal be maintained intact. The Foundation maintains endowment funds which are invested to produce income and growth. Income from the endowments is used, pursuant to direction of the donors and Board of Directors, to provide additional resources to the unrestricted and restricted funds. Endowment funds are divided into permanent endowment which has been so designated by the donor of the funds and into Quasi-Endowment which consists of funds designated as endowment by action of the Board of Directors.

A. General Endowment Fund

This fund will be used to accumulate contributions by specific account, with income to be allocated as directed by the donor.

B. General Quasi-Endowment Fund

All contributions which are not specifically designated for any other funds will be placed in the General Quasi-Endowment Fund. The General Quasi-Endowment Fund is principally a Board-designated Quasi-Endowment Fund and, unless otherwise directed by the Board of Directors, Eighty Percent (80%) of such general contributions shall be placed in the Quasi-Endowment, and the remaining Twenty Percent (20%) of such contributions and all fund income shall be allocated annually to the UNRESTRICTED FUND, unless respective donors would otherwise request. Any significant donor may specify the allocation of funds within given areas of activities (with Board approval) and/or percentages to be endowed and/or expended.

The General Quasi-Endowment Fund income and annual allocation shall be used to benefit any approved school activity.

C. Scholarship Endowment Fund

All contributions to this fund shall be for endowment. This endowment fund is divided up into two divisions - a general scholarship fund and a specific scholarship fund. A minimum gift of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) or more may be placed in this fund to endow a

specific scholarship. Income from the general scholarship fund may be utilized by the Board of Directors for scholarships of any type, including adding money to other specific scholarships to make them more viable. In the specific scholarship fund, specific scholarship designation by course of study (academic, vocational or any other acceptable category) is allowed.

D. Donor Recommendation Endowment Fund

This fund is a different type of endowment fund. Any donation of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or more can be placed in this endowment fund, with the income being utilized for different purposes based upon periodic recommendations by the donor. Recipients of the benefits from the fund must otherwise qualify under the guidelines of the Foundation and the final decision will rest with the Board of Directors.
