BY-LAWS OF THE TWO LAKES COORDINATED TRANSIT ALLIANCE, INC.

ARTICLE I - NAME

- **1.1 Name.** There shall be established an alliance named TWO LAKES COORDINATED TRANSIT ALLIANCE, INC. henceforth referred to as "Alliance".
- **1.2 Organization.** The Corporation shall be formed exclusively for non-profit purposes and shall have no shares of stock.
- **1.3 District Area.** The geographical area to be served by this Corporation shall consist of Clay, Geary, Marshall, Pottawatomie, Riley, and Washington Counties, henceforth referred to as "District #4".

ARTICLE II - STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

- **2.1 Purpose.** The purpose of the Alliance shall include but not be limited to meeting the following objectives:
 - a) to meet statutory requirements of K.S.A. 75-5051 *et seq.* which establishes Coordinated Transit Districts in Kansas to enhance coordination and management of state and federal passenger transportation funds to recipients of funds distributed for operation of public transportation services from state funds or federal funds designated for rural public and specialized transportation services.
 - b) to serve as a coordinating body for the purpose of providing information and referral services concerning the general public and community transportation providers for the primary benefit of older adults and persons with disabilities within District #4.
 - c) to provide transit information and referral exchange among the

Alliance membership.

- d) to represent the interests of the Alliance before appropriate governmental agencies, councils, commissions, etc.
- Corporation Earnings. No part of the earnings of the Corporation 2.2 shall insure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, directors, officers or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these By-Laws. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements or the making of oral behalf of any candidate for statements on public Notwithstanding any other provision of these By-Laws, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

ARTICLE III - CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION

Said Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purpose, including, for such purpose, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICES

- **4.1 Principle Office.** The principle office for the transaction of the business of the Alliance shall be located in District #4.
- 4.2 Registered Office. The Alliance may change the location of its

registered office as designated in the Articles of Incorporation to any other place in District #4. By like resolution, the resident agent at such registered office may be changed to any other person or corporation.

ARTICLE V - MEMBERSHIP

- **5.1 Membership.** The Alliance shall consist of members.
 - a) Members shall consist of one designated representative from each direct transportation provider based in District #4, who are funded by Section 16 or Section 18 monies administered by KDOT or who have made application to the Alliance for said monies.
 - b) Members shall consist of agencies, entities, or individuals with an interest in transportation within District #4.
- 5.2 Voting Privileges of Council Members. Every member on the Alliance, whose dues have been paid in accordance with Section 5.6 Membership Dues shall be entitled to one vote, in person or by proxy. Additionally, members or their designated proxy can earn or retain voting privileges by attending a minimum of three (3) of the duly called regular meetings within a agencies fiscal year.
- **5.3 Quorum.** A quorum of the Alliance shall be a simple majority of the current members.
- 5.4 Frequency of Meetings. A minimum of five (5) meetings per agencies fiscal year shall be held, with agendas to be provided to the Alliance membership at least ten (10) days in advance. Following the second absence of the Alliance during any fiscal year the Chairman will notify the Alliance by letter, with a copy of the letter also going to the KDOT Program Coordinator and that member in good standing status for the Alliance is in jeopardy. Following the third absence of the Alliance during the fiscal year the Chairman will notify said Alliance by letter, with a copy of the letter also going to the KDOT Program

Coordinator, that the Alliance is no longer a member in good standing until the beginning of the next agencies fiscal year. In the event that the Member can prove to the Chairman in a letter providing a conscious reason that they were unable to attend the meetings, the Chairman can ask the Alliance to approve the unexcused absence.

- 5.5 Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Alliance, for any purpose or purposes whatsoever, may be called at any time by the Chairperson. Notice of such special meetings shall be given in the same manner as for regular meetings of the Alliance. Notices of any special meeting shall specify in addition to the place, day, and hour of such meeting, the general nature of the business to be transacted.
- 5.6 Membership Dues. The amount of membership dues shall be set by a majority vote of the members and shall be payable each year before the Annual Meeting. The amount of membership dues of \$50.00 shall be addressed and approved at each annual meeting. The Alliance also has the authority to approve and assess special fees for general operation of projects of the Alliance. Special fees will require a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Alliance members.
- 5.7 Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the Alliance shall be held in April of each year. Notice stating the place, day and hour of the annual meeting shall be delivered to the Alliance membership not less than ten (10) nor more than thirty (30) days before the date of the meeting.

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS

- 6.1 Nominations. There shall be a nominating committee selected by the Alliance. This committee shall consist of: three (3) members. This committee shall elect its own chairperson. The committee must submit a list of nominations to the Alliance two (2) meetings prior to the Annual meeting.
- 6.2 Election. Every two years new officers are elected, the voting

members shall elect officers (Chairperson, Vice Chairperson(s), Secretary, and Treasurer) for a two (2) year term of office. No Board member may serve more than three (3) consecutive terms in any particular office. Only members are eligible for officer positions.

- **6.3 Duties.** The duties of each representative officer are described as follows:
 - a) Chairperson. The Chairperson shall preside at all Alliance meetings and Executive Committee meetings, and shall serve as an ex officio member of all committees.

The Chairperson shall be the signing authority of the Alliance for all legal purposes, such as but not limited to grant signatures, and other legal representation of the organization.

The Chairperson is responsible for the preparation of meeting agendas and their distribution to the membership.

b) Vice Chairperson(s). The First Vice Chairperson is empowered to act in the absence or disability of the Chairperson on all organizational matters. If the Chairperson is unable to serve, the First Vice Chairperson will assume the duties of the Chairperson until the next election of officers.

The First Vice Chairperson shall be a signing authority of the Alliance.

Additional Vice Chairperson(s) may be elected as needed. The order of additional Vice Chairperson(s) shall be Second Vice Chairperson, Third, etc., as decided by the Council when defining the additional officer's position(s).

c) Secretary. The Secretary, or a designee, shall be responsible for the maintenance of minutes for all Alliance meetings and Executive Committee meetings. The Secretary shall be responsible for gathering, maintaining, and distributing minutes

taken at meetings. Copies of the minutes of all meetings shall be maintained in the corporate offices for public review.

The Secretary shall be responsible for the agenda, maintenance of the roster of the Alliance membership and attendance record of the members.

d) **Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall keep and maintain or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and correct accounts of the properties and business transactions of the Corporation. its includina accounts of assets. liabilities. disbursements, gains, losses, capital, surplus and shares. The books of account shall be open to inspection by a scheduled appointment with the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall notify the Chairperson of all scheduled inspections prior to their occurrence. The Treasurer shall also report all such inspections to the Council at each regularly scheduled meeting.

The Treasurer shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, all monies and other valuables in the name and to the credit of the Corporation with such depositories as may be designated by the Treasurer with Alliance approval. He or she shall disburse the funds of the Corporation as may be ordered by the Executive Committee, shall render to the Chairperson and officers, whenever they request it, an account of all of his or her transactions as Treasurer and of the financial condition of the Corporation, and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned by the voting members. He or she shall be bonded, if required by the Alliance.

6.4 Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the officers (Chairperson, Vice Chairperson(s), Secretary, and Treasurer). Executive Committee meetings shall be called by the Chairperson. The primary function of the Executive Committee is to conduct the routine business of the organization within the limitations of the law, the Articles of Incorporation and these By-Laws. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to consider and make

recommendations to the Alliance. A quorum of the Executive Committee shall be a simple majority of the current Executive Committee members.

6.5 Meetings Procedures. All meetings on the 3rd Monday of the following months (annual meeting in April, regular Alliance meetings in February, July, October and November, special meetings, committee meetings, and Executive Committee meetings) are to be open meetings with the exception of meetings in executive session.

"Robert's Rules of Order" shall be used as a reference for questions regarding parliamentary procedures.

ARTICLE VII - GENERAL PROVISIONS

7.1 Amendments. Proposed By-Law changes must be submitted to the Alliance at a meeting for which notice has been furnished at least ten (10) days in advance with a copy of the proposed changes. The changes will be discussed at this meeting and will be voted on at the next regular Alliance meeting.

To alter, amend or repeal the by-laws of the organization, will require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of members present.

- **7.2 Committees.** Committees may be established by the Alliance. These committees shall meet regularly and report to the Alliance at each regular Alliance meeting. Committees may be composed of members and associate members.
- 7.3 Conflict of Interest. A conflict of interest is considered to exist when a Alliance member is requested to vote on agency-specific funding and the Alliance member is either:
 - a) employed by that agency, organization, or company;
 - b) an officer or director of that agency; or

c) if a member of the Alliance member's immediate family or partner is employed by or an officer or director of that agency.

If a conflict of interest is determined to exist, then the member must abstain from voting in any action regarding funding specifically for that agency.

If there is a question regarding a conflict of interest in a funding situation, the members should abstain to avoid even the appearance of conflict of interest.

Voting to adopt a committee recommendation which includes funding for several agencies is not considered to be an agency-specific vote.

- 7.4 Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Alliance will be July 1 June 30.
- 7.5 Staffing. The Alliance shall have the authority to hire staff as deemed necessary to carry out the tasks of the Alliance. The term of office, salary, benefits, and other conditions of employment shall be established by the Executive Committee and approved by the Alliance.
- 7.6 Indemnification of Officers. When a person is sued, either alone or with others, because he/she is or was a Director or officer of the Corporation, or of another corporation serving at the request of this Corporation, in any proceeding arising out of his/her alleged misfeasance or nonfeasance in the performance of his/her duties or out of any alleged wrongful act against the Corporation or by the Corporation, he/she shall be indemnified for his/her reasonable expenses, including attorney's fees incurred in the defense of the proceeding, if both of the following conditions exist:
 - a) the person sued is successful in whole or in part, or the proceeding against him/her is settled with the approval of the court.
 - b) the court finds that his/her conduct fairly and equitably merits such indemnity.

The amount of such indemnity which may be assessed against the Corporation, its receiver, or its director, by the court in the same or in a separate proceeding shall be so much of the expenses, including attorneys' fees incurred in the defense of the proceeding, as the court determines and finds to be reasonable. Application for such indemnity may be made either by the person used or by the attorney or other person rendering services to him/her in connection with the defense, and the court may order the fees and expenses to be paid directly to the attorney or other person, although he/she is not a party to the proceeding. Notice of the application for such indemnity shall be served upon the Corporation, its receiver, or its trustee, and upon the plaintiff and other parties to the proceeding. The court may also order notice to be given to the members in such form as the court directs.

- 7.7 Checks, Drafts, etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for payment of money, issued in the name of or payable to the Corporation, shall be signed or endorsed by such person or persons and in such manner as, from time to time, shall be determined by resolution of the Alliance.
- 7.8 **Expenditures.** All funds of the organization shall be deposited into an account bearing the name TWO LAKES COORDINATED TRANSIT ALLIANCE. INC. expenditures. Any other than monthly reimbursement of operating funds received from KDOT, must have approval of the Alliance. Funds shall be disbursed only upon the dual signature of the Treasurer and one other officer of the organization. All checks must be fully completed with the date. amount and which organization to receive funds before signing. (amended January 18, 2005)

ARTICLE VIII - DISSOLUTION OF THE CORPORATION

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Alliance shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, scientific, or any other proposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt

organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Alliance shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the applicable District Court, exclusively to such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
