



Experience Corps Baltimore City:

The Experience Corps program finished a highly successful year. The  
program continues to provide a triple win for Baltimore City - for our  
children, our older adults, and our schools. Experience Corps Baltimore  
City operated in 19 schools across the city. In each school, teams of  
15-20 members worked under the direction of the classroom teacher in  
K-3 classrooms. Experience Corps members continue to help teachers  
focus students, reinforce instruction, practice skills with students,  
and motivate learning. A total of 312 Experience Corps Baltimore City  
members were enrolled this year, and those members logged 157,238.75  
hours of tutoring and mentoring services to some 7,000 students in 285  
classrooms.

Adult Literacy and English for Speakers of Other Languages:

The Adult Literacy and English for Speakers of Other Languages Program  
provides quality, learner-centered instruction to promote literacy and  
help foreign-born residents improve English language skills. In FY  
2009, the Program enrolled a combined total of 570 adult learners in  
classes and one-to-one tutoring. Class enrollment increased 38% over  
the previous year, and 75% of learners post-testing increased their  
scores. 16 teachers worked with learners in the neighborhoods of  
Charles Village, Better Waverly, Govans, Hamilton, and Ednor-Gardens.  
Learners logged 23,389 hours in classes and another 3,333 hours were  
offered by volunteer tutors. One-on-one tutors assisted 128 learners,  
with 18 new tutors trained during the year. Cost per learner was

NED encourages neighborhoods to set their own priorities, allowing us

homeowner investment, or sanitation, NED provides active support to our  
communities and uses our investment to leverage support from Baltimore

The change in the Baltimore City Public Schools' funding last spring presented a major challenge to the Program. A policy intended to redistribute system dollars to individual schools meant that for the first time, school system funding for Experience Corps would need to come directly from school budgets. The Program asked principals to budget for about one quarter of funds needed to support Experience Corps at their school, transforming a previously "no-cost" program into a budget expenditure.

Perhaps the most meaningful endorsement of Experience Corps' effectiveness, we are happy to report that in a year of exceedingly tight budgets and many staff cuts, principals overwhelmingly voted to pay for the program. Nineteen schools either found funding from community partners or included Experience Corps in their 2009 budgets.

Exciting results developed by our research partners at the Johns Hopkins Center on Aging and Health through a National Institute of Aging grant indicate Experience Corps has a pronounced effect on learning. Students in Experience Corps schools showed greater gains in reading and math performance on standardized achievement tests (the Stanford 10 and the Maryland State Assessment (MSA) compared to students in the comparison schools. Schools with Experience Corps also reported significantly fewer (35-50%) office referrals for behavior

issues and fewer suspensions and expulsions. School climate was also perceived to be more positive in Experience Corps schools, as reported by parents, teachers and students in a school system survey.

Although Experience Corps requires members to serve at least 15 hours per week, members have averaged over 22 hours per week for each of the past three years. 97% of members indicated overall satisfaction with their experience.

Teachers in Experience Corps schools agreed that students received more individual attention, student behavior improved, and the overall learning environment was improved due to the presence of Experience Corps members. Experience Corps Baltimore City plans to serve at least 20 schools with some 350 members for the 2010 fiscal year.

Community Connections Coordinators, creating mutually supportive linkages between schools and their surrounding neighborhoods. VISTA members also built capacity and leadership in parent organizations and neighborhood associations, as well as ensured parent and community representation on School Family Councils. Partnerships with colleges, faith partners, and other nonprofit agencies continued to bring trained tutors and mentors into the schools to support in-school and after-school programs. Volunteers from local colleges, including Johns Hopkins University, Loyola College, Goucher College, and Towson University; local Lions Club members; and many other community members contributed significantly to the schools' volunteer base. The total volunteer hours developed by PEP in all partnership schools (not including Experience Corps) are equivalent to time worked by 3 full-time employees.

The Barclay Boys Summer Rites Program took place for the second consecutive year. Established in 2007 in response to a call from neighborhood parents for gang-prevention efforts, the program engages 16 boys in eight weeks of rigorous activities, structured around recreation, work ethics, instructional activities, and civic service.

This summer, in partnership with the Maryland Institute College of Art, GHCC administered the Remington Art Camp which engaged 13 students, ages 11 to 14, in five weeks of community art activities. In addition to creating their own artwork, camp goers led a community diorama art project during Artscape at the American Visionary Art Museum.

For the seventh year in row, GHCC partnered with Baltimore Tennis Patrons to enable low-income children from Barclay, Waverly, Pen Lucy, Remington, Charles Village, and Coldstream-Homestead-Montebello neighborhoods to receive free tennis lessons. This summer, the program served 175 students.

**Workforce Development:**

In May 2009, the Baltimore Trades Guild (BTG) entered into an agreement with Greater Homewood Community Corporation (GHCC) to assist with the financial management and program oversight of its two project components: The Artisan Project and the Contractor Capacity Project.

increasing administrative skills, enhancing trades skills, and assisting with licensing and certification as needed; 2) To enhance the skills and abilities of a minimum of 45 trade laborers in lead hazard and remediation; and 3) To mentor and train youth ages 18-19 years old who are ageing out of the city foster care program. The training will be to introduce trade skills for high-growth jobs in the residential environmental rehab industry.

There are three funding sources for the implementation of the two projects. The first project is a contract between Baltimore City Department of Social Services/Family League and Community Resources, Inc. The second project is a contract between the Baltimore City Health Department and Greater Homewood Community Corporation. The third funding source will be from fees for services.
