




ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT
to the
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Pursuant to the provisions of the District of Columbia Non-profit Corporation Act, the undersigned adopts the following Articles of Amendment to its Articles of Incorporation:

FIRST: The name of the corporation is the Capital Area Community Food Bank, Inc.

SECOND: The following amendments of the Articles of Incorporation were adopted by the Corporation in the manner prescribed by the District of Columbia Non-profit Corporation Act:

Article Third Was Amended To Read: The purpose of the non-profit corporation organized in accordance with section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) is to help get food to the Washington area's hungry people by acting as a food clearing house. The Food Bank will solicit, gather and store food which may be surplus and edible. The Food Bank may also solicit funds. The Food Bank will store food at a central warehouse for distribution to receiving agencies qualified in accordance with section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). These agencies will then distribute food packages or use the food for the preparation of meals.

Article Fifth Was Amended to Read: The manner of appointment of directors to the board of directors shall be provided in the By-Laws. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for the services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing and distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Code) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 107(C)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

Article Sixth Was Amended to Read: The business, property and affairs of this corporation shall be managed by the board of directors. Upon dissolution of the corporation, the board of directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the board of directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the District of Columbia, exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations or organization, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

THIRD: The amendments were adopted at a meeting of the Board of Directors held on February 15, 1980, and received the vote of a majority of the Directors in office, there being no members having voting rights in respect thereof.


