In fiscal year 2009, we admitted 45,045 patients, treated 278,531 outpatients, and provided more than \$75 million in uncompensated medical care.

The hospital provides quality, leading-edge healthcare to a service area of more than 1.1 million people, regardless of their ability to pay. We provide the area's only regional trauma program and the busiest Emergency Department in the state of Alabama, cardiovascular services (largest Cath Lab in the state of Alabama, and cardiovascular surgery program which is ranked in the top 10% in the nation), primary stroke center designation, Joint Camp (nationally recognized joint replacement program), perfect rating for the Mammography program, approved Oncology program with commendation, and exceptional Lab accreditation.

Huntsville Hospital for Women and Children is home to the only full-service Pediatric Unit, Pediatric Emergency Department, Pediatric ICU, and the only Level III Neonatal ICU between Birmingham and Nashville. The hospital also houses one of only six St. Jude affiliate clinics in the country.

The hospital system's facilities include Huntsville Hospital, Huntsville Hospital for Women & Children, an outpatient Medical Mall, Madison Medical Park and a 70-bed rehabilitation hospital located on the campus. The 60-bed Madison Hospital is scheduled to open in early 2012.

As a not-for-profit hospital that receives no tax support from city, state or federal governments, Huntsville Hospital relies on philanthropy to fund its capital and operational needs. The Huntsville Hospital Foundation accepts charitable contributions on the hospital's behalf and works to fund both present and future equipment and program needs. Contributions of any amount are gratefully accepted and may be unrestricted gifts or designated for a specific hospital unit or program. Contributions to the Foundation are tax deductible, with 100% of all gifts benefiting the hospital program or department designated by its donors.

(3) four Giraffe Omni Beds for the Neonatal ICU which offer thermo-regulation for tiny infants and shields them from light and sound that could disrupt their growth; (4) a transport ventilator for the Kids Care critical care transport ambulance, an ultra-compact, electronically controlled and pressure-monitored system that acts as an artificial set of lungs for critically ill and injured children who struggle to breathe regularly on their own; (5) the Kids Kamp Cabin, an indoor activity room constructed next to the Kids Kamp outdoor play garden for pediatric patients and siblings to enjoy while visiting our hospital; (6) full funding of a music therapy program in the Pediatric Therapy department; (7) toys, games and activities for the Child Life program; (8) celebration parties for patients who complete their chemotherapy treatment at the St. Jude Affiliate Clinic; and much more.

PATHOLOGY LAB AND RADIOLOGY DEPARTMENT:**

The Foundation provided \$397,115 (15% of the total funds distributed) for the Pathology Lab and Radiology department. Philanthropy provided (1) a GeneXpert for the Lab, cutting-edge technology that performs a variety of rapid lab tests and provides diagnoses in hours, rather than days; (2) a Direct-View Digitizer for Radiology which is utilized during surgery so that x-ray images can be transferred instantaneously to a radiologist and analyzed quickly. This technology offers the added benefit of reducing surgery and anesthesia times for patients; and (3) Angiosuite equipment for Radiology and Vascular Surgery which allows for minimally invasive procedures. Instead of the traditional vascular bypass procedure, physicians now utilize stents and catheters, with angiosuite technology providing clear radiological images to guide the physician while performing the procedure.

NEUROLOGY / NEUROSURGERY:**

The Foundation provided \$234,269 (9% of the total funds distributed) to purchase a state-of-the-art monitoring system for the Neuro ICU. This system includes monitors in each patient room plus a central monitor at the nurses' station. The system monitors eight critical vital signs and waveforms, and also provides drug calculations for IVs.

The balance of philanthropy funding (\$1,221,819) provided cutting-edge technology and programs such as the following: (1) Vein Viewer for the Oncology Unit which uses infra-red light to illuminate and better locate veins, thus alleviating the pain of multiple needle sticks for cancer patients; (2) eleven biphasic defibrillators for Cardiology units, new technology that converts both ventricular fibrillation and atrial fibrillation, determines the patient's shock resistance level, and tailors the shock to have the greatest efficiency at the lowest risk of damage to the heart muscle; (3) an intubation system for the ER and Trauma department which utilizes a scope, camera and video screen for visualizing the trauma patient's airway and vocal cords for intubation;
