COMMITMENT TO BENEFITTING OUR COMMUNITIES PATIENT CARE SERVICES CHRISTUS Health was formed in 1999 when the Sisters of Chanty Health Care System, sponsored by the Sisters of Charity of the Incarnate Word of Houston and the Incarnate Word Health Care System, sponsored by the Sisters of Charity of the Incarnate Word of San Antonio, brought their health care ministries together Bishop Claude Marie Dubuis founded both congregations more than 140 years ago, and his original call to the Sisters from his native France continues to challenge CHRISTUS Health to fulfill its mission of extending the healing ministry of Jesus Christ and reach out to those in need in the more than 60 communities it serves The vision of CHRISTUS Health, a Catholic, faith-based health ministry, is to be a leader, a partner and an advocate in the creation of innovative health and wellness solutions that improve the lives of individuals and communities so that all may experience Gods healing presence and love The Central Louisiana Region of CHRISTUS Health responds to the community needs through services provided at CHRISTUS Saint Frances Cabrini Hospital in Alexandria, La , a 280-bed facility, CHRISTUS Coushatta Health Care Center in Coushatta, La , a 25-bed crtical access hospital, and CHRISTUS Saint Josephs Home in Monroe, La , a long term care and assisted living facility with 130 licensed beds and 60 residential units All three facilities in this region share the one objective of leading the way toward healthier communities CHRISTUS Saint Frances Cabrini Hospital serves Rapides and nine surrounding civil parishes, which have a total population of more than 373,000, of whom more than 20 percent live at or below the federal poverty level In FY 2009 alone, the hospital admitted 12,492 patients and treated 163,220 patients in its outpatient facilities In addition, the hospital provided emergency services to 40,766 individuals CHRISTUS Saint Frances Cabrini is the only cancer center in central Louisiana to offer comprehensive care in a hospital setting It is central Louisianas leader in cardiac services, offering a complete range of cardiac diagnostic services including CTA, cardiovascular surgery, interventional cardiology and electrophysiology CHRISTUS St Frances Cabrini also leads the way in orthopedic care in central Louisiana, offering neuro-musculoskeletal services, a joint replacement center, and a sports medicine center CHRISTUS Coushatta Health Care Center, located in Red River Parish, economically the poorest in Louisiana, offers a wide range of inpatient and outpatient services including minor surgery, day surgery, cardiology, diabetes care, respiratory therapy, radiology, physical therapy, nephrology, gynecology, ear, nose, and throat services, ophthalmology, orthopedic services, infusion therapy and adult psychiatric services The federal government has designated CHRISTUS Coushatta Health Care Center a critical access hospital due to the strategic location of its emergency room, which reduces the time patients would have to spend on transportation to Natchitoches, La or Shreveport, La for treatment Both CHRISTUS Saint Frances Cabrini Hospital and CHRISTUS Coushatta Health Care Center provide 24-hour emergency rooms open to all needing emergent care, regardless of their ability to pay CHRISTUS St Josephs Home of Monroe, La is the only religiously-based long term care facility in its area The facility works to meet the physical, spirtual, emotional, and social needs of all residents and their families by providing a complete range of services and accommodations from which residents and their families may choose The long-term care facility provides 24-hour licensed nursing services and personal care assistance in private and semi-private rooms The assisted living facility meets the needs of people needing physical assistance with daily living activities but not 24-hour care Both facilities provide their services to create an at-home atmosphere The CHRISTUS Health Central Louisiana region also sponsors many local community health services These include 17 school-based health centers in five civil parishes around CHRISTUS Saint Frances Cabrini Hospital, a dental clinic at CHRISTUS Coushatta Health Care Center, a senior citizens center in Alexandria, and rural health clinics in Ringgold and Coushatta As a not-for-profit organization and as part of CHRISTUS Health, a regional governing board comprised largely of independent community members helps govern the Central Louisiana region of CHRISTUS Health The region has an open medical staff comprised of qualified physicians who work with its three facilities to provide care to our communities These physicians receive their privileges only after a thorough and comprehensive credentialing process Touching the lives of people helps CHRISTUS Health Central Louisiana stand apart and provides further motivation to serve the medically needy in all of the communities surrounding its three facilities Whether the issue is the life of a child expecting a future filled with miracles, the life of a man in need of a critical heart surgery, or the life of a woman about to give birth to her first child, CHRISTUS Health Central Louisianas health care services work to provide the best care possible regardless of an individuals ability to pay Moreover, the
