Mentoring

"Project Excel" is the Corporation's flagship project of the Mentoring program. This program focuses upon mentoring to African American males beginning in middle school and requires the mentee to enroll in the program with permission from his parents or guardian. Mentees enrolled in this program are eligible for a scholarship award from the Corporation's Village Legacy Education Program upon graduation from high school.

"Excel in School" is a sub-project of the Mentoring program. This sub-project is held at Cohn Elementary and is an on-site mentoring program that features the participation of the entire school. A team of men visits the school each week. The mentors split their time into segments to allow them an opportunity to visit classrooms. To address particular problems, additional time is spent with individual students during supplemental visits as recommended by the faculty and staff.

The Corporation's mentoring program also includes activities outside of school, such as picnics and trips to see college football games.

Back-to-School Expo

This program has been very successful and is annually held in July before school begins. About 2,000 students from metropolitan Baton Rouge attended the Expo. All children attending receive school supplies. Workshops are provided to enhance educational opportunities.
