The payment rate for
	inpatient services is on a per case rate, calculated based on the diagnostic-related group (DRG) into which the patient is categorized. Outpatient services are reimbursed by Medicare based on a fee schedule. CHRISTUS Health dba US Family Health Plan also provides the uniform medical benefit for 9,976 military family members under contract with the Department of Defense. Under this program, comprehensive medical services are provided to families of active duty military personnel, and to retirees and their families in all age categories including those over age 65. CHRISTUS Health also participates in the TRICARE standard program and many of our hospitals contract with the Managed Care Support Contractor for the South Region to provide services under the provision of TRICARE Prime.
