The Colorado Parent & Child Foundation (CPCF) has three Directors that are associated with Grantees as employees or directors. Only one of those grantees receives in excess of 1% of total Colorado Parent and Child Foundation income and support. That grantee receives 13% of total income and support. Each of the Directors who is associated with a grantee is precluded from deliberations related to that respective grantee.

Historically, the CPCF has included representatives from grantees to be represented on the Board as many Foundations which support CPCF encouraged CPCF to include constituents (grantees) to participate in the governance function.

The objective of the grant awards is not to benefit the organizations which the Directors are associated with but to assist eligible families that meet HIPPY or PAT grant requirements which do not include the directors or employees of the organizations the directors are associated with. The transactions are substantially different than the types of grants described in the instructions to Schedule L Part III or business transactions described in the instructions to Schedule L Part IV (there is no profit motive associated with the transactions).

CPCF is in the process of restructuring its Board and two Board members associated with grantees will be become non voting ex officio Board members at the beginning of the 2009-2010 fiscal year and the third Board member associated with a grantee will no longer be associated with that Grantee beginning of the 2010-2011 fiscal year.
