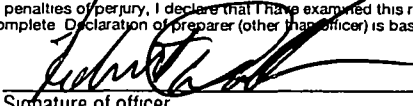
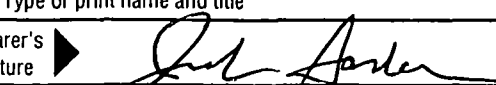

New Mexico Boys and Girls Ranches, Inc. (The Ranches)

New Mexico Boys and Girls Ranches, Inc. (The Ranches) is a nonprofit organization that operates multi-denominational Christian homes for children from troubled backgrounds, and provides services for struggling families. The goal is to promote wholeness for children and their families through intervention, counseling, parenting classes, residential group care and/or foster placement.

The Ranches consists of five divisions: New Mexico Boys Ranch, New Mexico Girls Ranch, Pippin Youth Ranch, Families for Children and The New Mexico Family Connection.

We do not accept government funds or sponsorship from a national organization or church denomination. All contributions are a result of the generous support of private individuals, businesses, corporations, civic organizations, foundations and a variety of churches.

Residential Group Care

Designed for pre-teens and teenagers, residential programs at Boys Ranch and Girls Ranch help children and families experiencing a variety of difficult situations ranging from chronically low or failing grades to negative home situations where children are unable to remain. The residential programs provide a family-style, multi-denominational Christian atmosphere where services are provided regardless of religion, ethnic background or financial situation.

As a semi-independent and transitional living program, Pippin Youth Ranch offers struggling young adults, ages 17-21, the opportunity to learn life skills essential for responsible independent living. Life skills such as managing a checking account, budgeting, buying groceries and maintaining an apartment are taught.

Residential Services

- Individualized Counseling – Certified counselors meet weekly with the children at Boys Ranch and Girls Ranch to help them overcome the difficulties that brought them to The Ranches, and to help ensure that they are getting their needs met.
- Animal Program – As children learn that animals depend on them for food, shelter and affection, they can better understand what is needed to develop a meaningful relationship with another person. 4-H Clubs, horsemanship, and caring for animals such as pigs, goats and rabbits are all components to this program.
- Education – Campus schools at Boys Ranch and Girls Ranch are extensions of the public school systems, and provide individual instruction and learning systems for children who haven't succeeded in traditional public education programs.
- Health Services – Appropriate medical and dental care is provided for all residents.

Family Therapy and Counseling

Licensed counselors at The New Mexico Family Connection help families improve their relationships through improved communication skills and more effective parenting approaches.

Services are available to families in the greater Albuquerque area, and provided for children residing at New Mexico Boys and Girls Ranches and their families.

Foster Care and Adoption

Families in medical, emotional or personal crisis sometimes need to place their children in temporary foster care until they can stabilize their lives and provide a safe home. Through Families for Children, temporary, voluntary foster care is provided for children under the age of ten. Ongoing support, training and counseling are offered for foster parents, as well as families receiving or requesting foster care and adoptive services.

As a chapter of Child SHARE (Shelter Homes, A Rescue Effort), Families for Children also works with a network of churches to recruit, train and support foster and adoptive families for several agencies in the greater Albuquerque area.

Parenting Classes

Parent education classes give parents the tools they need to develop strength in areas of human effectiveness and well being in their children.

Financial Support, Fund Raising and Investment Fund Management

Financial support, fund raising and investment fund management is provided for New Mexico Boys and Girls Ranches, Inc. by the New Mexico Boys and Girls Ranch Foundation. See Form 990 – New Mexico Boys and Girls Ranch Foundation, Inc. for more information.
