Part III, Program Service Accomplishments

Accomplishments for the IAF Northwest are focused in the areas of Leadership & Organizer Development and Strategic Initiatives. Support is provided to both fully operational affiliated organizations and to more informal “sponsoring committees” working to build new broad based organizations in their communities. Affiliates include: Metropolitan Alliance for Common Good (Portland OR); Spokane Alliance; Sound Alliance (Seattle-Tacoma), Greater Edmonton Alliance (Alberta) and Sydney Alliance (Australia). Sponsoring committees exist in the North Sound, Vancouver and Calgary.

Part III, Program Service Accomplishments (cont.)

Line 28. Leadership & Organizer Development \$353,794

Supported the development of leaders and organizers by:

- Providing weekly phone consultation and on-site mentoring support to organizers in affiliated organizations and to key leader-organizers in sponsoring committees;
- Conducting two Advanced 6-Day Leadership Institutes for over 70 people, including the first of its kind in Australia (in conjunction with the newly forming Sydney Alliance);
- Organizing 3 multi-day seminars for the professional organizers employed by the IAF NW affiliates;
- Conducting two strategic planning retreats for key leaders and organizers from all IAF NW affiliates and local retreats for leaders in Portland, Vancouver, North Sound;
- Raising funds and making controlled grants the affiliates for strategic charitable activities.

Line 29. Strategic Initiatives \$190,505

Continued to develop SustainableWorks as an effective model for creating jobs for disadvantaged constituencies, reducing energy consumption & costs for low and moderate income home and small business owners, cutting carbon emissions and building community capacity by:

- Refining and testing a 48-hour "building systems" training program for members of the mechanical trades (plumbers and pipefitters, sheet metal workers, and electricians).
- Replicating the training and organizational infrastructure in the Puget Sound area.
- Training building systems trainers in both Spokane and the Puget Sound.
- Training 80 trades people in the systems approach.
- Developing a 44 hour energy auditor training program in conjunction with Washington State University and training 14 energy auditors
- Auditing and retrofitting eight homes in the Spokane area as a pilot project.
- Creating a Business Advisory Committee to develop a business plan for taking the project to mass scale.
