POIC operates an alternative school and train unskilled and unemployed persons and help place them on jobs.

Program Services

Education

Under this program, Portland OIC provides the following services:

Rosemary Anderson High School which is a private alternative high school offering accredited educational opportunities for students not succeeding in a traditional school environment.

After School Program which is one after-school programs providing tutoring and academic support for students attending Ockley Green Middle School, who are not meeting the state academic standards (Opportunity and Supplemental Instruction Services - OASIS).

During the year ended June 30, 2009, 279 students were enrolled in the Rosemary Anderson High School and 160 were enrolled in the summer school program.

Employment & Training

Under this program, Portland OIC provides the following services:

Youth Employment Empowerment Project (YEEP) which provides case management, employment training, alcohol and drug education, and job referrals for gang-impacted youth ages 16-21.

Adaptive Adventure Team (AAT) which is a year-round program providing students with career exploration, work experience activities, and academic support.

Leadership Academy which is a five-day residential camping experience during the summer. Camp activities are designed to help students face their fears and learn how to resolve conflicts using productive strategies. Follow-up is provided throughout the academic year.

Career Opportunities for Youth (COFY) provides youth with training and work experience in the coffee retail and distribution industry.

During the year ended June 30, 2009, 154 youth served in the YEEP, and 32 were served in the AAT.

Social Enterprise Venture

Under this program, POIC, in partnership with Bridgetown Coffee and New Seasons Market, operates a coffee kiosk at the corner of N. Interstate and Rosa Parks Way on the New Seasons Market lot. Youth trained in the COFY program's Barista Training may serve an internship in the kiosk before job placement. Included in the Social Enterprise Venture is a retail coffee service for businesses and offices.

During the year ended June 30, 2009, 81 were served in BHCD, 12 were served in HGHD, and 113 were served in ARRA.
