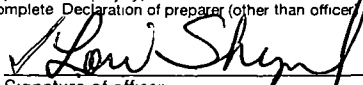

Program Service Accomplishments 2008 – 2009

Our agency gauges our success by the continued quality of services we are able to provide to a number of people with developmental disabilities and the amount of training we are able to provide to our employees, families of the people we support, and other agencies throughout the state and country. The agency was founded with the purpose of providing support services to individuals with developmental disabilities – mental retardation, cerebral palsy, autism, etc. – who chose to live, work and recreate in the community in integrated settings. The agency supports and teaches individuals with disabilities who choose to live outside of traditional congregate living situations, work in meaningful jobs and participate in mainstream recreational activities that are available to people with or without disabilities. All of our training and support services are provided in community environments – grocery stores, laundry mats, libraries, RTD buses, community colleges, etc. – or in the individual's home or apartment.

We have two types of direct supports that we are approved to provide by the State of California Department of Developmental Services. The first is Supported Living Services. The typical ratio in this service is one trainer to one individual with disabilities. The services are centered around assisting individuals to locate and rent or purchase accessible and affordable housing, finding roommates, budget, shop, cook nutritious meals, do laundry and, very importantly, develop relationships and connections with community members and systems that the individual is interested in including participation in recreational opportunities, churches, clubs, classes and other places where people would normally gather. The other direct service that we provide is Individualized Day Services. This is a daily (five days per week) program that assists people with things like job seeking, college classes, volunteer jobs and other things that would typically happen during the day. This service is provided at a varied ratio with one trainer for one, two or three individuals depending on the activity.

After the transition during the 2008 – 2009 fiscal year, Avenues Supported Living Services provided assistance to 18 individuals in the Supported Living Services and 15 individuals in Day Services. 11 of the individuals that receive Day Services also receive Supported Living Services in combination with the Day Services. Each of the people we support met goals and objectives they set specifically for themselves. Avenues Supported Living provided continued consulting to other agencies in the area of Behavior Assessment and Positive Behavior Supports as well as agency wide evaluations. Increase requests for speaking engagements at conferences and staff training for other agencies were attended by individuals or panels as availability permitted. We also continued

mentoring two people in creating their own agency providing supports to people with developmental disabilities in a similar way. We completed the process of transitioning them into an independent agency and transferring funding by the end of this fiscal year. We continue to provide consultation to previously branched off in the form of our Executive Director being the President of their Board of Directors as well as shared training and brainstorming. Hence, over the next fiscal year, we will decrease our capacity and employee pool as we go back to our optimum size. At that point we may consider mentoring an new agency into existence which would then increase our capacity and employee pool in order to create two unique agencies. Using this model of mentorship, we are able to maintain a quality program and help others to begin additional programs providing options for many people interested in supported living services.

We were able to retain a majority of our long term employees over the fiscal year as well as significantly increase the pool of employees to reflect growth of the new agencies. While turnover in this field is generally 300% per year, we had a very few number of our retained/long term employees leave the agency. The people we support remained constant as well. We were able to maintain our staff benefits to include contributions to a Simple IRA, medical coverage, tuition reimbursement, vacation pay and sick pay as well as other benefits. This helped insure continued consistency.

We continue to work with the people we support in areas of affordable housing including applying for and maintaining Section 8 and pursuing home ownership. Currently, one person we support owns a mobile home, one person lives in a condo which is in a special needs trust for her, and a few people we support are considering purchasing a condo or similar living situation to be put into a special needs trust for their adult child.

Our executive Director sits on a number of Committees and Boards associated with disability issues and plans on continuing this endeavor in order to have a wider impact and knowledge base. We continue to send our employees and the people we support to conferences and training symposiums for the same reasons.

Our main goals for the next fiscal year are to continue the supports we provide and to begin to mentor another new agency into existence. We will continue to attend and present at conferences and symposiums related to this field and consult with other agencies as requested. We will continue to monitor our fiscal situation as the economy changes in order to insure the long term stability of the agency.
