**Form 990, Part III, Line 1 - Briefly describe the organization's mission:**

The Colburn School (the "School") is a California not-for-profit organization offering instruction in the performing arts for students of all ages and community service programs which bring music to underserved children in inner-city schools. The School of Performing Arts was organized in 1950 and offers classes, lessons and workshops in Music, Dance, and Drama to approximately 1,700 students ranging in age from toddler to adult. The Conservatory of Music began in 2003 when the School was approved by the State of California Bureau for Private Post Secondary and Vocational Education to operate professional level music studies programs. Conservatory programs are offered at no charge to qualified students pursuing the highest levels of classical music performance training. Conservatory programs range from two to four years in length and result in either a Bachelor of Music degree, an Artist's Diploma or a Professional Studies Certificate. The Conservatory had 116 enrolled students during
