## **BY-LAWS**

### **AMERICAN COLLEGE OF ORAL AND MAXILLOFACIAL SURGEONS, INC.**

#### **ARTICLE I - PREAMBLE**

- a) A body of oral and maxillofacial surgeons, certified by the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery as determined by the Board of Regents, who shares the common interests and support of the highest ideals and traditions of the specialty hereby, unites under an organization which shall have as its name: The American College of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, Inc. The primary purpose shall be to advance oral and maxillofacial surgery through education and research.
- b) The office of the College shall be at such place as the President, with the consent of a majority of the members of the Executive Committee, may from time to time designate.
- c) Objects and purposes shall conform to its Certificate of Incorporation.

#### **ARTICLE II – THE COLLEGE**

##### **Section 1 – Membership Composition**

Members of the American College of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, Inc., shall be designated as:

- a) Fellow
- b) Associate
- c) Founder Fellow
- d) Honorary Fellow
- e) Life
- f) Retired
- g) Affiliate

Additional categories of membership shall be added as the Board determines.

Members of the American College of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, Inc., shall be designated as either “Fellows” or “Associate” members. Those who became Fellows prior to the date of adoption of the original By-Laws shall be designated as “Founder Fellows.” Fellows must be certified by the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, or by another recognized surgical specialty board which shares our interests in the area of maxillofacial surgery.

Those members who are in training or have as yet not been board certified shall be known as Associate members. When Associate members shall become certified they shall be entitled to be called Fellows with approval by the Board of Regents. All Fellows and Associate members must be licensed in their respective states, provinces, or countries

excluding federal services. Fellows and Associate members shall be elected by a majority of the Regents, herein and described.

### **Section 2 – Nominations to Fellow or Associate Membership**

a) Nominations to Fellow or Associate membership shall be made by completion of the established nomination application

b) All applications shall be forwarded to the Membership Committee at the Central Office, and will be presented to the Board of Regents for approval by a majority of Regents.

### **Section 3 – Honorary Fellows**

The Regents may elect as Honorary Fellows, by majority vote, individuals who possess national or international reputation in the fields of oral surgery, dentistry, medicine and allied health, or have rendered distinguished humanitarian services or otherwise contributed to the welfare of mankind without the need for other stipulated requirements as herein described. Honorary Fellows shall not be required to pay fees or dues, but shall enjoy all of the privileges of Fellowship. They shall have the right to vote, but not to hold office.

### **Section 4 – Life Member**

A Fellow or Associate member may achieve status of Life membership upon completion of thirty (30) dues paying years and have reached the age of 65 years. Dues shall be paid through the year in which Life membership is voted by the voting membership. Upon election to Life membership, dues shall be waived. Only in extenuating circumstances may exceptions be made and then only upon the recommendation of the Board of Regents. A Life member shall enjoy all privileges of the membership category held in prior to the election of Life status.

### **Section 5 – Retired Member**

Retired membership shall be granted to a member who is completely retired from practice, and has paid his dues through the year in which Retired membership is voted by the Board of Regents. Those members engaged in part-time practice (one day a week, etc.) or employed in an administrative or teaching capacity in an educational institution on a full or part-time basis for which remuneration is tendered, shall be considered ineligible. Application for retired membership must be presented in writing to the College.

Retired membership shall be granted to a member in the event he/she must suspend his practice due to personal illness or other extenuating circumstances. Under these circumstances, his dues shall be waived at the discretion of the Board of Regents.

A Retired member shall have the same privileges as an active or affiliate member except the right to vote or hold office. In the event a Retired member resumes practice, it is incumbent on said member to notify the Central Office so that he/she may be reinstated.

### **Section 6 – Affiliate Member**

Affiliate membership shall be granted to a members who is not an oral and maxillofacial surgeon, and who is board certified in another head and neck surgical specialty or its equivalent. Induction as an Affiliate Member is to be at the discretion of the Board of Regents.

### **Section 7– Voting: Holding Office**

- a) Associate members are eligible to vote, but may not hold office.
- b) Fellows are eligible to vote and hold office.

### **Section 8 – Maintenance of Fellow or Associate Membership**

The Regents may terminate any membership for cause if  $\frac{3}{4}$  of all of the Regents find that the conduct of the member has been injurious to the objectives, good order, reputation, or best interests of the College, or is derogatory to its dignity, inconsistent with its purposes, or shows a failure to maintain the standards of conduct or ideals of the organization.

### **Section 9 – Meetings**

- a) The Annual Meeting of the membership shall be held at a time and place to be selected by the Executive Committee. Any official business of the College may come before the membership at the Annual Meeting. *Roberts Rules of Order* shall govern membership meetings.
- b) Special Meetings of the membership may be called from time to time by the Executive Committee.
- c) Only Associate, Fellow, qualified Honorary Fellow and qualified Life members in good standing shall have voting rights.
- d) At all meetings of the College, each member in good standing shall have one vote and may take part and vote in person or by proxy. Each proxy must be executed in writing and shall be valid only for the meeting at which it is presented. Unless otherwise specifically provided in these Bylaws, a majority vote of the members, present and voting in person or by proxy, shall govern.
- e) The President may, at the President's discretion, order the assembly cleared of non-voters.
- f) At the pleasure of the presiding officer, voting may be by secret ballot, standing poll, show of hand or voice response. Proxy voting shall not be allowed.

### **Section 10 – Quorum**

The members present at any meeting of the College shall constitute a quorum at such meetings.

### **Section 11 – Dues and Assessments**

Members shall pay such annual dues or assessments as may from time to time be determined by the Regents.



### **Section 12 – Insignia, Advertising of Membership**

No member shall exhibit any seal, certificate or plaque indicating membership or any other status in the College except as provided by the Board of Regents.

Any insignia, membership certificate or plaque remains the property of the College.

## **ARTICLE III – REGENTS**

### **Section 1 – Management**

The day-to-day management and control of the business affairs of the College shall be vested in the Regents. It shall keep a record of its proceedings.

### **Section 2 – Regent's Accountability**

The Board and individual Regents represent the membership of ACOMS and are directly accountable to said membership. They also have a fiduciary duty to those who provide funds to ACOMS and to its staff for the sound administration of the College. In addition, they have a general duty of trust to those served by the College and to the general public.

Every Regent of ACOMS shall exercise the powers and discharge the duties of his office honestly, in good faith and in the best interests of ACOMS, and in connection therewith shall exercise the degree of care, diligence and skill that a reasonably prudent person would exercise in similar circumstances.

### **Section 3 – Membership**

The Board of Regents shall consist of sixteen (16) members:

President	President-Elect
Vice President	Secretary-Treasurer
Immediate Past President	Canadian Regent
Six (6) U.S. District Regents	Latin American Regent
Armed Services Regent	European Regent
Chair, RE&H Foundation, <i>ex officio</i> voting	

All Regents shall have the ability to vote. All motions, unless otherwise specified, must pass by a majority vote.

The President shall be the presiding officer of the Regents and along with a majority of the Board of Regents shall appoint the Secretary-Treasurer.

The Regents may be elected for two (2), two (2) year terms and may be eligible for reelection after going off the Board for two (2) years.

Officers shall be elected for a two (2) year term.

The U.S. District Regents and the Latin American, Canadian, European and Armed Services Regents shall be elected on an alternating basis; that is, three (3) U.S. District Regents are elected at each election and the Canadian, Latin American, European and Armed Services Regents are elected every second election, the first election being in 2009.

#### **Section 4 – Vacancies**

Vacancies in positions among Regents shall be appointed and approved by a 2/3 vote of the Board of Regents. Any Fellow elected to fill a vacancy shall hold that office until the expiration of the term in which the vacancy occurred; thereafter, he/she may be elected to the position as specified under Section 2 of this article.

#### **Section 5 – Meetings**

Meetings of the Regents may be called at any time and designated place by the President of the College to transact business as may be pertinent to the affairs of the College. Not less than ten (10) days notice of the time and place of the meeting shall be given to each Regent, at his/her address as shown on the records of the College. Meetings may be open to Members by written request.

#### **Section 6 – Quorum**

Six (6) Regents [in addition to the Executive Committee] shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

#### **Section 7 – Conflict of Interest**

(a) Conflict of Interest Policy - Where a Regent, either on his behalf or while acting for, by, or with or through another, has any pecuniary or personal interest, direct or indirect, in any matter, or otherwise has a conflict of interest, as a Regent, he:

- (1) Shall disclose his interest fully at a meeting of the Regents;
- (2) Shall disclose his interest and the general nature thereof prior to any consideration of the matter in the meeting;
- (3) Shall leave the meeting during the discussion of, and the vote on, the transaction or arrangement that result in the conflict of interest;
- (4) Shall not take part in the discussion of or vote on any questioning respect of the matter; and
- (5) Shall not in any way, whether before, after or during the meeting, attempt to influence the voting on any such question.

The pecuniary or personal interest, direct or indirect, through a business interest or an investment or of an immediate family member shall, if known to the Regent, be deemed

to be also the pecuniary interest of the Regent. Every declaration of interest and the general nature thereof shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

**(b) Violations of the Conflicts of Interest Policy**

1. If a board or committee has reasonable cause to believe that a member has failed to disclose actual or possible conflicts of interest, it shall inform the member of the basis for such belief and afford the member an opportunity to explain the alleged failure to disclose.

2. If, after hearing the response of the member and making such further investigation as may be warranted in the circumstances, the board or committee determines that the member has in fact failed to disclose an actual or possible conflict of interest, it shall take appropriate disciplinary and corrective action.

## **ARTICLE IV – OFFICERS**

### **Section 1 – Officers**

The officers of the College shall consist of the President, President-Elect, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer and Immediate Past President.

### **Section 2 – Election and Appointment**

All officers, other than Secretary-Treasurer, shall be elected by the Members. They shall serve until their respective successors are elected and installed. The new officers will preside at the second business meeting of the annual meeting. Vacancies in any office of the College shall be filled by the Regents as provided for in Article III, Section 4 of these By-Laws.

### **Section 3 – President**

The President shall be the chief executive officer of the College. He/She shall be an ex-officio member of all committees and the presiding officer at meetings of the Regents and general assembly. He/She shall have general charge and responsibility for all matters of administration of the College under the direction of the Regents. He/She may direct employees of the College and with the consent of the majority of the Executive Committee appoint or remove employees of the College. He/She may sign, together with the Secretary-Treasurer, any legal documents or checks for the disbursement of funds. His/Her term of office shall be for two (2) years and may not be re-elected unless He/She is completely off the Board of Regents for two (2) full years.

### **Section 4 – President-Elect**

The President-Elect shall automatically succeed the President in the event that the President can no longer serve. He/She shall preside at meetings and perform all duties of the President in the absence of the President. The President-Elect does not automatically become President without election by the membership. In the event that he/she assumes

the office of President because of the President's absence or illness, he/she shall be eligible to complete that term and then serve an additional two (2) year term if elected.

#### **Section 5 – Vice President**

The Vice-President shall, in the absence of the President and the President-Elect, preside at all meetings and perform the duties and exercise the powers of the President. His term of office shall be for two years.

#### **Section 6 – Secretary-Treasurer**

The Secretary-Treasurer shall administer the funds of the College under the supervision of the Regents, and shall make such reports to the Regents or members as may be requested by them. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be responsible for the minutes of the meetings of the Regents and general assembly. He/She will provide notices in accordance with the provisions of the By-Laws, disburse monies and communications and perform such other duties as may be assigned by the President or Regents.

#### **Section 7 – Executive Director**

An Executive Director may be chosen by the Board of Regents to be responsible to the Board and to the President and other officers during periods when the Board is not in session. The Executive Director shall at all times act in accord with the purposes and goals of the College, and shall be guided by the President in executing College policy and programs.

The Executive Director shall work with the President on all projects. The Executive Director shall conduct the correspondence of the College, prepare bulletins for circulation to the membership, and collect dues. The Executive Director shall conduct all official business not delegated to other officers.

The Executive Director shall assist committee chairs, officers, and members as called upon. The Executive Director shall clear all publicity prior to its release. The Executive Director shall be provided with funds authorized by the Board and supervised by the President and Treasurer.

#### **Section 8 – Compensation**

No expense by members or officers, except the Executive Director, shall be compensable unless prior requisition has been approved by both the President and the Treasurer.

### **ARTICLE V – COMMITTEES**

There shall be Standing Committees of the College responsible to the Board of Regents. The Regents shall appoint members of such committees. No committee member shall serve for a period of years greater than the number of persons on the committee. Changes in committee structure may be made at the discretion of the Regents. The Standing Committees shall include, but not necessarily be limited to:

- a) Executive Committee

- b) Budget and Finance Committee
- c) By-Laws Committee
- d) Membership Committee
- e) Continuing Education Committee
- f) Nominating Committee
- g) Communications Committee

**a) Executive Committee**

The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, President-Elect, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer and the Immediate Past President to monitor the day-to-day activities of the College and the Central Office.

**b) Budget and Finance Committee**

This committee shall be chaired by the Secretary-Treasurer and shall consist of no less than three (3) or more than five (5) Fellows. It shall have general supervision and oversight of the financial affairs of the College; to recommend the selection of certified public accountants to annually audit the accounting records, accounting practices and procedures, and financial statements of the College; review or cause to be reviewed, from time to time, the accounting practices and procedures and the internal controls of the College; and meet at least annually with the College's certified public accountants to review and receive reports with respect to such practices, procedures and controls. It shall, through the Secretary-Treasurer, report annually to the members on the financial condition of the College and the results of audits. It shall recommend to the Board for adoption the College's Policy on Reserve Funds. The President and the Board shall receive financial reports and audits for review.

**c) By-Laws Committee**

This committee shall consist of no less than three (3) or more than five (5) members. It shall have the responsibility for continuous review of the By-Laws and introduction of amendments as may be commensurate with current needs of the College. It shall receive recommendations for amendments from any member and consider the appropriateness thereof. Amendments so accepted by the Committee shall be framed in the proper language and presented to the Regents.

**d) Membership Committee**

This committee shall consist of no less than five (5) or more than seven (7) members. It shall act under the supervision of and be responsible to the Regents. It shall be responsible for the preparation and necessary modifications of the application form for admission to the College and verify the accuracy and completeness of all applications. Membership recommendations for admissions to the College shall be submitted to the Regents for approval by the majority.

**e) Continuing Education Committee**

This committee shall consist of no less than five (5) or more than seven (7) members. It shall have the responsibility for making all arrangements for the annual meeting and for long range planning of the meetings. The President shall appoint this committee.

**f) Nominations Committee**

This committee shall consist of five (5) members. The Chairman will be the Immediate Past President. One member shall be elected at the annual meeting of the general assembly. Two additional members of the Nominations Committee shall be elected from the Board of Regents. The election of Officers shall be determined by the members. The ballot shall state the committee's recommendations and will provide for write-in candidates. Any Fellow may become a candidate by obtaining ten (10) signatures from Fellow or Associate members and submitting it to the Nominations Committee who will place the name on the ballot.

**g) Communications Committee**

This committee will oversee all ACOMS communications and report to the Board. The President shall appoint members of this committee.

**Section 2 – Special Committees**

The Regents shall have power to appoint any Special Committee, designating membership and precise responsibility, to carry out any special need of the College not herein provided for under the By-Laws. Special Committees shall act in accordance with specific instructions from the Regents and their activities shall terminate with the fulfillment or otherwise conclusion of the assignment for which they are formulated.

**ARTICLE VI – ADOPTION AND AMENDMENT**

**Section 1 – Amendment**

These By-Laws may be amended only at the Annual Meeting of the membership or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose.

Notice of such proposal shall be circulated at least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting to all voting members.

**Section 2 - Ratification**

Amendments must be confirmed by a majority vote of those members attending and qualified to vote, or voting by proxy, provided a quorum is present.

**ARTICLE VII - FINANCES**

**Section 1 – Fiscal Year**

The fiscal year of the College shall begin on the first day of September of each year.

### **Section 2 – Checks**

All checks, drafts or notes of the College shall be signed and countersigned by such Officers or agents of the College as may be designated from time to time by the Board of Regents.

### **Section 3 – Reserve Policy**

The College will establish a policy on reserves – an accumulated percentage of annual revenue - to meet the goals of the College and unanticipated expenses that may arise.

## **ARTICLE VIII – LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION**

The College shall indemnify every Officer and Regent of the College against any and all expenses, including counsel fees, reasonably incurred by or imposed upon any Officer or Regent in connection with any action, suit or other proceeding (including the settlement of any such suit or proceeding if approved by the then Board of Regents of the College) to which the Officer or Regent may be made a party by reason of being or having been an Officer or Regent of the College whether or not such person is an Officer or Regent at the time such expenses are incurred. The Officers and Regents of the College shall not be liable to the members of the College for any mistake of judgment, negligence, or otherwise, except for their own individual willful misconduct, or bad faith. The Officers and Regents of the College shall indemnify and forever hold such Officer and Regent free and harmless against any and all liability to others on account of any such contract or commitment. Any right to indemnification provided for herein shall not be exclusive of any other rights to which any Officer or Regent of the College, or former Officer or Regent of the College may be entitled.

## **ARTICLE IX – DISSOLUTION**

The College shall use its funds only to accomplish the objectives and purposes specified in these By-Laws and no part of said funds shall inure, or be distributed to the Members of the College. On dissolution of the College, any funds remaining after the payment of outstanding obligations shall be distributed to one or more regularly organized and qualified charitable, educational, scientific or philanthropic organizations to be selected by the Board of Regents.
