APRI spearheads the "Black Labor Alliance" an initiative to build black community support for the trade union movement and to convey to Labor the needs and concerns of black Americans. It has 114 chapters in 36 states.

For example, for the past three years, APRI's National Education Conference has aggressively focused on health advocacy and healthcare reform education to establish practices and implement programs to enure that the issue of race-based healthcare disparities was placed squarely on the nation's agenda.
