Refugee Resettlement

HIAS and Council is a life-line for new refugees who enter the United States. We are often the first "Americans" refugees see; we meet refugees at the airport, take them to their new homes which is often furnished with items supplied through volunteer efforts, and link refugees to employment, English classes and mainstream services. Refugees have a wide variety of skills and backgrounds; some have Ph.Ds and others have little formal education and have never ridden on a train. A key element of refugee resettlement is cultural orientation to life in an urban, industrialized city. HIAS and Council resettled 49 refugees as of September, 2009.

Citizenship

HIAS and Council is one of the largest providers of citizenship processing services for the elderly and disabled in the Commonwealth. HIAS and Council worked on over 300 citizenship cases from the larger Philadelphia region by filing their applications for naturalization and representing them during their interviews. HIAS and Council also teaches a citizenship class specifically geared to the elderly in the JCC's Klein branch.

Immigration Processing Assistance

This work includes the Refugee and Immigrant Self-Sufficiency Efforts (RAISE) initiative, our core migration service helps individuals navigate the various immigration agencies including the United States Immigration and Citizenship Service. During the 2008 to 2009 fiscal year, 438 individuals were served in this department. Services include:

- Family petitions
- Adjustment of status (obtaining a "green card")
- Sponsoring family members who live abroad
- Replacement of documents
- Travel documents

Representation and Litigation

HIAS and Council handled over 450 complex immigration matters during the 2008-2009 fiscal year.

- Our Immigrant Youth Advocacy Project provided assistance to 90 victims of interpersonal violence and abused, neglected and abandoned children.
- Our Interpersonal Violence Initiative helped over 100 clients break free from their abuser and provided assistance to victims of crimes

Our Litigation Team provided direct represent to asylum seekers and those with complex immigration needs, including families in the Berks Family Shelter

Asylee Outreach Project

The Asylee Outreach Project links those granted political asylum to employment programs, English language training, and helps secure documentation needed to access mainstream services. The program provides self-sufficiency workshops for asylees in homeownership, educational opportunities and consumer issues, serving over 230 asylees each year.

Technical Assistance

HIAS and Council staff provided workshops to attorneys, refugees social services and domestic violence advocates on immigration issues such as asylum, citizenship and domestic violence.

Advocacy and Civic Engagement

HIAS and Council works with other service providers, faith-based organizations and community groups to provide a voice for immigrants and refugees. The organization works to create a welcoming and secure environment for immigrants and their families in our region. Issues such as access to government services, immigration reform, and the fair treatment of the foreign-born are addressed through coalition participation.

During the 2008 to 2009 fiscal year, HIAS staff engaged in over 30 outreach and training sessions, reaching over 1200 providers and 50,000 members of the public through media outlets.
