



Tuition assistance, supportive services, and case management may be available for targeted groups depending on the funding source. The Resource Development Center offers child care referrals and information to families. Child care providers and teachers have access to a wide variety of training opportunities offered by an education specialist. There are also services for local businesses and employers seeking to
