# **Spectrum Youth and Family Services Description of Organization and Programs**

**Spectrum's mission:** Spectrum Youth and Family Services is a community-based social service agency committed to working with Vermont youth and families to improve their lives through advocacy, direct service and a continuum of support services, leading to a more just and compassionate community.

#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Crisis Services— The goal of this program is to provide immediate access and crisis intervention for youth and families in emergency situations. The service is staffed by trained Spectrum employees and is integrated with the community's First Call service system. Specific crisis services may include the 24-hour hotline, short-term crisis intervention counseling, emergency shelter, and intensive collaborative and crisis work with other community providers.

Shelter—Spectrum's 12-bed emergency shelter provides young people with temporary shelter while they begin the process of getting their life back on track. When a young person comes to the shelter, they are assigned a professional team that works like a family and a community to support them. This team consists of a residential staff member, mental health and substance abuse counselor, educational advocate, and an employment advisor. The young person receives a medical check-up and the team works together to develop an assessment. Staff members work together with the young person to articulate his/her goals and objectives, and to support the youth in carrying out the work to achieve those goals.

Residential Services— Spectrum's residential services are designed to respond to the developmental needs of the youth. The Transitional Living Program (TLP), includes a 9-unit Single Room Occupancy residence (SRO) that serves as a bridge toward independent living for formerly homeless youth. The Spectrum Youth Co-Op is a community based group home for six male youth in custody of the State of Vermont. It provides a setting for young men to transition from a more restrictive residential setting to a community based living program.

Adolescent and Family Counseling Program—Spectrum's Counseling Program promotes and provides individuals and families with supported opportunities for growth and change The Program provides individual, family, and group counseling for adolescents and their families Counselors use current research models with adolescents and families

We provide youth with screening/assessment and treatment/counseling for substance use and mental health, relapse prevention, aftercare/recovery, coordinated medical treatment services and psychiatric evaluation, parent education, training, support and counseling for

families and caregivers, coordinated educational/vocational services, and assistance with accessing Medicaid and other entitlements and services

**Education Program**—The goal of the Education Program is to provide homeless, foster, and at-risk youth with support to achieve their academic goals. We work with youth to

- Research and organize their previous school experience and academic credit history
- Assess their academic needs
- Connect them to public high schools, vocational training, and GED preparatory opportunities (e.g. Vermont Adult Learning, YouthBuild, Job Corps, Community College of Vermont, Champlain College, University of Vermont)
- Advocate for appropriate placement, academic and social support within the educational institution, and increased access to necessary resources, both financial and academic

JOBS -- The Chittenden County JOBS Program is a collaborative effort between Spectrum and HowardCenter The program provides youth, ages 16-21, with comprehensive, integrated case management services, with the goal of successful, competitive employment. The youth served have been identified as having an emotional and/or behavioral disability and are in need of extra support and services to obtain and maintain a job.

Services include assessment and consultation, care coordination and resource referral, independent living skills training, supportive counseling, job development and individualized job placement

Mentoring Program— The Spectrum Mentoring Program is a community-based mentoring program that matches responsible adult volunteers with adolescents from Spectrum between the ages of 11 and 21. Mentor matches participate together in various activities in order to build a trusting relationship from which the youth can draw support. As an active member of various mentoring partnerships, the Mentoring Program is committed to the Elements of Effective Practice as outlined by the National Mentoring Partnership. We adhere to our mission to create and support community based mentoring to help adolescents develop the life skills and support networks needed for a healthy, successful future. Spectrum undertakes this mission with the conviction that mentored youth benefit from positive adult role models.

Street Outreach—Program staff build relationships with street youth to facilitate youth leaving the streets. Spectrum's Outreach program is staffed by Peer Outreach Workers (POW's) as well as trained, professional social workers, who work together to find the areas where street youth congregate and sleep, and to bring services to them. Teams of trained POW's and adult staff members offer basic first-aid, counseling, information, and referrals to services for HIV, pregnancy, substance abuse and sexual abuse prevention, and they provide street youth with information and referrals to services.

Drop-in Center—Drop-in is a safe place for young people to eat a meal, use the telephone, do laundry, get clothing, or take a shower. This is where many youth make initial contact with Spectrum, and begin to access our services. Drop-in staff plan and facilitate healthy activities for youth including rock climbing, snowboarding, hiking, photography, art projects, and weekly discussion groups on HIV prevention education, substance abuse, dating and healthy relationship. Peer outreach workers help run the Drop-in providing informal counseling, settling goals, and referring youth to other. Spectrum services

**Youth Development Services Program**— This program serves youth who are or have been in the custody of the State, or young people in the substitute care system under the Department for Children and Families. This program provides youth between the ages of 15 and 22 with the education, skill development, learning experiences and information to prepare for their transition from State care. Spectrum staff members provide support services that include life skills assessment and education, self-advocacy, and assistance in developing social networks. This program helps youth navigate the transition to adulthood by providing assistance with housing, employment, and education, along with other age-appropriate life skills.

Student Assistance Program (SAP)— The SAP provides substance use prevention and intervention services in area schools. The primary effort of an SAP is early identification and intervention for students who may be presenting alcohol or other drug problems. The program is designed to work with individual school communities to assess their particular needs, interests, and capabilities, and then develop and provide an effective service program based on the school community's individual needs. This might include prevention programs, assessment and coordination of services for individual students, referral for treatment programs, group intervention, training for school staff, and follow-up services.

Community Support and Supervision— This program provides direct support and supervision to youth on probation and living in the community Staff hold youth accountable for their behavior by working in coordination with social workers, school personnel, parents, service providers, and police to ensure that youth are complying with conditions of probation

Violence Intervention and Prevention Program— As part of a coordinated community effort in Chittenden County, the mission of VIPP is to end male violence against women and children by educating men who batter and young men who use violence. As a batterer intervention program, VIPP holds men accountable for their violence and to look at the effects of their actions, giving them an opportunity to change their behavior and beliefs

**Project Safe Choices (PSC)**—PSC grew out of our work with adult men and the recognition that dating and other violence is a significant problem among adolescents. The program provides training and educational opportunities for schools and community-based organizations that work with young men
