The Interfaith Board of Directors is committed to Interfaith's mission "to provide low-income persons and families, rental housing and related facilities and services", primarily in Amherst, Massachusetts and the abutting communities.

Interfaith's President, Richard O. Johnson, died in December 2008. He had been a primary motivator in setting Interfaith's direction and in initiating and cultivating relationships that would impact its future grant-making.

Programs that were being initiated with Pioneer Valley Habitat for Humanity ('Habitat') or Housing Allowance Project ('HAP'), two charitable organizations supporting affordable housing in Hampshire County, were discontinued. The \$20,000 previously set aside in a checking account for this purpose was therefore recovered to Interfaith's main funds in 2009.

The emerging Board of Directors decided the best use of Interfaith's funds was to dedicate the entire corpus to the purchase of a building to house the homeless. The plan included finding a funding partner, as the building cost would be over \$1 Million, nearly double Interfaith's entire corpus. A partnership with a service organization qualified to run the facility would also be needed. This plan was initiated in March 2009. An offer on a property in Amherst was made in December 2009, that would require a \$17,000 deposit that was made available in the checking account.

The total purchase price offered for the property was \$1,400,000. Because at least \$500,000 would be provided by Interfaith, \$500,000 is treated as set aside and dedicated to this single purpose.
