	Jersey-based Russell Berne Foundation, the government of Israel, and the Technion with the American Technion Society. With more than 119 faculty members and some 300 graduate students and postdoctoral fellows from 14 different faculties, RBNI is among the largest nanotechnology centers in Europe and the USA The establishment of the RBNI was followed by the establishment of five additional nanotechnology centers in other Israeli research universities, enhancing the research capacity of this science in Israel. RBNI is involved in the establishment of new infrastructure, recruitment of new "star quality" faculty members, in a graduate studies program in nanoscience and nanotechnology, forming ties with industry and other academic institutions, the commercial utilization of intellectual property, and the initiation of new research programs. The research encompasses most facets of nanoscience and nanotechnology, including nanoelectronics, nano-optics, nanomaterials, nanomechanics and the ways these interface with life sciences and medicine Results of Phase 1 (2005-2009). 1 Established nanotechnology as a science that crosses the traditional boundaines between faculties and discipline. This was accomplished by creating joint research programs, seminars, internal and external symposia, education programs, and shared infrastructure centers. New infrastructures were built and existing ones upgraded, while nano-research and education were vigorously promoted. The Alfred Mann Institute for Biomedical Development at the Technion(AMIT) was established in 2006 to turn the ideas of Technion researchers into medical devices, pharmaceuticals and biologics that contribute to the improvement of human health worldwide. AMIT screens and evaluates research projects with the potential to become widely used medical products that benefit mankind. Following positive feasibility studies, AMIT may build a team that can transform the science into end-user applications and lead pre-clinical and clinical activities During 2009, five projects were managed at the framework of AMIT Cardiamit TVP1022 is an isomer of Rasagiline (Azilect), an EDA approved drug for Parkinson's Disease (Isomers are compounds with the same molecular formula but different structural formulas.) TVP1022 is proposed as a cardio-protective drug to supplement existing therapies. Recent animal studies have not confirmed earlier results as to the efficacy of TVP1022 Therefore, the project is being reassessed. The Morris and Renee Rochlin Neuroprotective Drug Development Laboratory in the Ever Topf Center of Excellence for Neurodegenerative Diseases Research Developing treatments and preventive drugs for Parkinson's disease and Atherier's bases requires new molecular and genetic tools, which have been made available in this facility, including some of the latest technical devices in pharmacogenetics, neurochemistry, and neuropharmacology. Research focuses on multiple areas, including the relation of Alzheimer's to Parkinson's disease and the mechanism of nerve cell death. The researches have created Azlect (FDA approved and now available) and also Anti-Lew y Body Disease drugs and other thr-functional drugs. New research also involves the creation of antitoxidants and fron chelators as neuroprotective drugs. VK-28 and HLA 20, based on green tea extract, have both shown great promise in animal models. Ongoing genome and proteomic research may help develop drugs for other neurodegenerative diseases such as Fredreich ataxia and Huntington Disease.
