**The Master Teacher Program (MTEP) is a year-long intensive, rigorous, and demanding course of study including online and residential course work, demonstration of "best practices" and training of school or system colleagues. Eleven teachers are now certified Master Teachers in Alabama. They are geographically spread out, enabling economic programs/workshops to be available in diverse school systems. The Malone Family Foundation is the sponsor of this program helping to spread economic education throughout the State of Alabama.**

4b (Code: **SMG** ) (Expenses \$ **36,034** including grants of \$ \_\_\_\_\_ ) (Revenue \$ **37,157** )  
**The Stock Market Game (SMG) is the exciting ten-week online stock trading game enjoyed by more than 11,000 students in 2009-10. Teams invest a virtual \$100,000 in stocks and mutual funds and compete in lower and upper divisions (4-8 and 9-12 grades). SMG is endorsed by the NYSE and the Alabama Securities Commission and is run in the fall and spring. The game is correlated to national and state standards, and has an extensive teacher support center. Sterne Agee is the primary sponsor of the Stock Market Game, encouraging kids to take an interest in their financial futures.**

**Color the Concepts (CTC) is the unique opportunity for students to illustrate economic concepts in a fun and creative way. Teachers select the best illustrations to submit to the contest. Students compete in upper (6-8) and lower (K-5) divisions with 12 winners in each. State Farm sponsors Color the Concepts which encourages kids to understand economic concepts (wants vs needs, entrepreneurship, saving for the future) and hopefully put them to use in real life.**
