	Carilion Giles Memorial Hospital, a critical access hospital, exists to serve the health needs of its community, regardless of patient ability to pay. The acute hospital admitted 1,314 patients and provided 6,005 days of care during the year. Services include nursing care, extensive outpatient and inpatient surgical and endoscopic services, and mammography, CT, and MRI diagnostic imaging. Giles also provides services targeting the specific health needs of its population, including diabetes management, physical, speech, and occupational therapy, and participation in cardiac rehab and disease management programs. Giles also provides a 24-hour emergency department, emergency transportation, and a chest pain and stroke program. With 12,288 visits, Giles's emergency services are a critical component of its community's health safety net, acting as a primary health provider for a significant number of uninsured patients, who comprise 19% of ED visits. Giles supports community health screenings and education on chronic disease prevention and management, sponsoring 37 events touching over 1,500 people, and provides key support and coordination for a community-based medication assistance program. To further its mission, Giles provides extensive uncompensated care. Stated at cost, charity, bad debt, and unreimbursed Medicaid costs for the year exceeded 2.4 million.
