NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS NOVEMBER 30, 2009 AND 2008

1. Nature of Operations:

Hartley Dodge Foundation is a non-private charitable organization. Its purpose is solely for the upkeep, maintenance, care and repair of the Hartley Dodge Memorial which is the municipal building of the Borough of Madison, New Jersey.

Hartley Dodge Foundation is exempt from federal taxation under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code per exemption letter dated October 25, 1941. The Internal Revenue Service ruled in a letter dated March 4, 1971, that the Foundation is not a private foundation.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. Net assets and revenues, expenses, gains, and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, net assets and changes therein are classified and reported as follows:

Unrestricted net assets – Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.

Temporarily restricted net assets – Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may or will be met, either by actions of the organization and/or the passage of time. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Permanently restricted net assets – Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the organization. Generally, the donors of these assets permit the use of all or part of the income earned on any related investments for general or specific purposes.

Revenue recognition – The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, whereby income is recorded when earned and expenses when incurred.

Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and cash equivalents – The Organization considers all cash on hand and in the bank, money market funds and certificates of deposit with an original maturity of less than three months to be cash equivalents.

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Organization that is, in substance, unconditional. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the

contributions are recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets.

The Foundation has adopted Statements of Financial Accounting Standards No.124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-For-Profit Organizations". Under this standard, investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities shall be measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. In addition, under this standard, gains and losses on investments of a donor-restricted endowment fund are changes in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets if explicitly required by the donor or by a law that extends a donor's restriction to them.

Comparative Data – The financial information for the year ended November 30, 2008, presented for comparative purposes is not intended to be a complete financial statement presentation.

Donated Services – The value of donated services to the Organization meeting the requirements for recognition in the financial statements was not material and has not been recorded.
