If you have any doubt about whether or not your proposal fits within our guidelines, please send a letter of inquiry or give us a call.

MISSION

The Anschutz Family Foundation supports Colorado nonprofit organizations that assist people to help themselves while nurturing and preserving their self-respect. The Foundation encourages endeavors that strengthen families and communities and advance individuals to become productive and responsible citizens. There is a special interest in self-sufficiency, community development, and programs aimed at the economically disadvantaged, the young, the elderly, and the disabled. The Foundation is also dedicated to funding efforts in rural Colorado.

AREAS OF INTEREST

The Foundation's mission is purposely broad, allowing it to support the work of many nonprofits that focus on improving the quality of life for individuals and communities. The bulk of the Foundation's grants are made in categories most directly related to the stated goals of the Foundation: improving the lives of individuals; promoting self-sufficiency; and community development.

TYPES OF GRANTS

Recognizing that organizational infrastructure is a necessity, the Foundation welcomes requests for general operating support. The Foundation also accepts requests for specific programs. The foundation occasionally issues a challenge grant instead of an outright grant. This is done when the foundation sees both a need and an opportunity for the organization to expand its funding base. GRANT SIZE

Typically grants are in the \$5,000 to \$10,000 range.

WHAT WE DON'T FUND

Generally, the foundation does not support:

- Grants to individuals
- Programs outside of Colorado
- Graduate and post-graduate research
- Religious organizations for religious purposes
- Special events, promotions or conferences
- Candidates for political office

- Endowments
- Debt reduction
- Multi-year grants
- Capital campaigns (On rare occasions the Foundation funds capital campaigns in rural Colorado for organizations with missions that closely align with the Foundation's interests. Applicants are advised to first submit a one-page letter of inquiry to gauge the Foundation's interest in reviewing a capital campaign request.)

♦ GUIDELINES FOR SUBMITTING A PROPOSAL

DEADLINES

Proposal deadlines: January 15 and August 1.

These deadlines refer to when your proposal must be in our office. If the deadline date falls on a weekend, proposals are due the preceding Friday.

Due to the large volume of requests that we receive, it is helpful to receive proposals prior to the specific deadlines. However, complete proposals must be received in our office by the close of business on the deadline dates listed above to be considered in that review cycle. Proposals postmarked on the deadline dates will be considered late and will be delayed until the next cycle. Sorry about that, but a deadline is a deadline.

The Foundation acknowledges receipt of all proposals, typically within four weeks of their arrival in our office. If you do not receive an acknowledgment, feel free to contact us as this may indicate that we did not receive your proposal.

<u>Proposal review schedule:</u> Proposals received in time for the January 15 deadline will be decided at a late April or early May Foundation board meeting. Proposals received in time for the August 1 deadline will be decided at a late November Foundation board meeting. Any proposals received after the stated deadlines will be rolled into the next funding cycle.



PROPOSAL FORMAT

We require applicants to use the Colorado Common Grant Application (CGA). Visit www.coloradocommongrantforms.org to access the CGA and it's accompanying User's

Guide. If you are not able to retrieve the form on-line, please be in touch and we will mail you a hard copy of the materials.

Please use the Checklist that accompanies the CGA when compiling your proposal to make sure you are submitting a complete proposal. An incomplete proposal is not very impressive and it delays the review of your proposal.

WHAT WE LOOK FOR WHEN REVIEWING PROPOSALS

- Alignment with the mission and interests of the Foundation.
- Clearly presented organization mission, goals, plans and financials.
- A solid financial sustainability plan. The Foundation is willing to take risks with young, developing organizations, however, we promote diversified funding streams and believe our funding should be no more than 10% of an organization's annual budget.
- A committed board of directors with 100% making a financial contribution to the organization. This requirement is not designed to promote wealth as criteria for board membership. We are more interested in full participation, rather than dollar amount.
- Strong volunteer participation.
- Community buy-in (evident through donations, volunteer engagement, existing partnerships and collaborative efforts).
- Solid effort to engage the community and/or participants in program development.
- On-going efforts to evaluate organizational and program effectiveness and commitment to making adjustments as needed.
- Effective and inspired leadership.
- An eye on the future that reflects recognition of potential impacts on and opportunities for the organization.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I email or fax my proposal?

No. Faxes and emails are not acceptable for transmitting a proposal to the Foundation.

Where do I send my completed proposal?

We need one copy of your proposal. It is fine to staple items in your proposal. Please do not spend any effort in binding your proposal or putting it in fancy packaging. All proposals end up in a file folder as soon as they are logged in.

Can I hand-deliver my proposal?

Yes. Just remember that it needs to be in our office no later than 5 p.m. on the date of the deadline.

Can I submit a proposal for both grant deadlines?

No. The Foundation will review only one proposal per year per organization.

Do I need to be a 501(c)(3)?

Applicants must be recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) organization or be operating under the umbrella of another 501(c)(3) organization or be a tax-supported institution such as a school or government agency.

Is there a limit to how many times I can receive funding from the Foundation? Yes and No!

Yes: In order to be fair, the Foundation instituted a "two-year rule" requiring that an organization which receives funding for two successive years take one year off before reapplying.

No: Other than the above mentioned "two-year rule," there are no limits to how many times the Foundation will fund your organization.



GRANT REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

All grantees receiving a grant of at least \$5,000 are expected to submit the Colorado Common Grant Report (CGR). The CGR is due either:

- a) One year after receipt of a grant, or
- b) With a new proposal, if the proposal is being submitted before a full year has transpired on your previous grant period.

Visit <u>www.coloradocommongrantforms.org</u> to retrieve the CGR and it's accompanying User's Guide. Please note that the CGR was revised in 2009. The CGR asks grantees to report on progress and results, successes and challenges, lessons learned, and financials.
