

Gus Archie Memorial Scholarship

The Gus Archie Memorial Scholarship is supported by the Archie Fund of the SPE Foundation. Each year the SPE Foundation, working through the SPE Section Scholarship Support Program, awards the Archie Scholarship to the most outstanding student attending university for the first time. The curriculum must lead to an undergraduate degree in petroleum engineering.

The Archie Fund endows each scholarship at \$6,000 per year. The program provides support of an individual student through up to four years of university study, provided that he/she makes satisfactory academic progress. The program ordinarily requires a grade point average of 3.0/4.0 or higher for the current semester and a grade point average of 3.0/4.0 or higher on a cumulative basis. Students rotate off the program after four years of scholarship support.

Scholarship Application Deadline

Applications must be submitted by 30 April annually.

Selection Procedures

Applications may be submitted to any section of the Society of Petroleum Engineers and should be screened by the section according to the criteria used in selecting recipients in the SPE Section Scholarship Support Program. Candidates may also apply directly to: Student Activities, Society of Petroleum Engineers, P.O. Box 833836, Richardson, TX 75083-3836, USA.

Qualifications for Submitting Scholarship Applications

Following are the requirements for individual candidates who are submitting applications for the scholarship to the SPE Archie Scholarship Committee:

- Application for scholarship to be submitted by student.
- Statement by student that it is his/her intent to enroll in petroleum engineering in an accredited school.
- Appraisal of student from principal, advisor or counselor.
- An SAT score of 1800 (or ACT score of 27) or higher for US applicants. Non-US applicants should provide exit examination or placement scores with documentation explaining how to interpret the score.

Nico van Wingen Memorial Graduate Fellowship

The Nico van Wingen Memorial Graduate Fellowship in Petroleum Engineering is supported by the van Wingen fund of the SPE Foundation. Up to two awards are given in the amount of USD 5,000 each per year. Eligible students must be members of an official SPE Student Chapter and must be at the Ph.D. level intending to pursue careers in academia.

The Nico van Wingen Memorial Graduate Fellowship in Petroleum Engineering is renewable up to four years with an annual confirmation from the student's advisor. The confirmation should include the progress of the student and a justification for renewal of the fellowship.

Each university that has an SPE Student Chapter and offers a Ph.D. degree in petroleum engineering may nominate one candidate.

Scholarship Deadline

Applications must be submitted by 1 November annually.
