

**Special Olympics Maine conducts several state level competitions annually in 19 Olympic-style sports. Among these are summer and winter games, which are 3-day, 2-night events hosting 1,350 and 500 athletes respectively - regional soccer and basketball events (6 total), equestrian, aquatics, bocce, motor activities, golf, and tennis competitions in various locations around the state.**

On an annual basis, our program serves over 3,000 different athletes. In addition, there are more than 40 competitive events offered at the local or area level.
