ELIGIBILITY

APPLICATION

SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, a statement of educational and career goals, an outside appraisal, and financial need. Financial need as calculated by Scholarship Management Services must be demonstrated for the student to receive an award.

Efforts will be made to ensure that recipients are representative of all areas of the company. All other criteria being equal, preference will be given first to associates, then to their children.

Although Hannaford establishes the criteria, selection of recipients is made by Scholarship - Management Services. In no instance does any officer or associate of Hannaford or the Hannaford Charitable Foundation play a part in the selection.

Applicants will be notified in early May whether or not they have been selected to receive an award.

PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship Management Services processes scholarship payments on behalf of the Hannaford Charitable Foundation Payments are made in equal installments on August 15 and December 30. Checks are mailed to each recipient's home address and are made payable to the school for the student.
