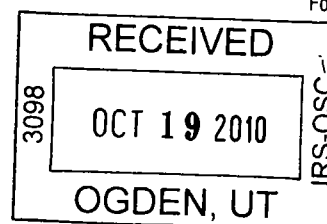

Please note the attached tax returns are being filed late. Therefore, the taxpayer, the Noah Foundation (hereafter called "the Foundation") is potentially subject to significant late payment and late filing penalties and interest. Also, because qualifying distributions were paid after the statutory time allowed, the Foundation is also potentially subject to significant IRC § 4942 tax. We respectfully request an abatement of those penalties and taxes for reasonable cause as will be described below.

The Foundation's founder and sole trustee, Faith Berry (hereafter called "Trustee"), has undergone substantial personal hardship during the period covered in the filing of these returns. In 2004 she was still undergoing chemotherapy as a result of being diagnosed with advanced ovarian cancer in December of 2002 and having surgery for the cancer in January of 2003. After the surgery she underwent intensive chemotherapy for 18 months and suffered from debilitating side effects from her chemotherapy medicine, Taxol, both during the chemotherapy and for long thereafter. The Trustee's body broke down from the stress caused by the chemotherapy and she suffered from painful nerve damage called neuropathy which manifested itself in alternating pain and numbness in her extremities. About the time that she was recovering from this condition, the Trustee's husband left her and their children, causing a long and difficult divorce proceeding. Shortly thereafter, in the period from 2005 to 2006 she suffered from major flooding in her home which made large parts of the living area uninhabitable. For example, all the bathrooms were completely inoperable and the Trustee and her family had to use a port-a-potty. On Labor Day weekend in 2006, the Trustee suffered from a major concussion while horseback riding. She spent the next three days in the hospital, which is an unusually long period for a concussion but it shows how significant the injury was. For the first six months after the concussion all of her cognitive abilities were significantly impaired, and for the next six months she suffered from severe memory lapses and her ability to form new memories was debilitated. In the summer of 2007, the Trustee was badly injured when a horse she was looking after in her barn reared up and fell into the Trustee. The right side of her face was crushed and, because of the medication she was on, she could not have surgery on her fractures, which resulted in a slow and delicate recovery. In the spring of 2007 she underwent even more substantial flooding in her home (her home is still being repaired even now) as well as a substantial fire on her property that caused major damage. Finally in 2008, when she seemed to be recovering from all of her misfortune, the economy wreaked major havoc on her family business, Saddleback Mountain in Maine, and she had to devote all of her energy to assisting her aging parents in getting the family business solvent again. When all of this was effectively done, the Trustee devoted herself to bringing current all of her previous tax filing obligations, especially that of the Foundation.

The returns are of course late, however, that was due to the litany of misfortune that the Trustee has suffered from. She has rededicated herself into the management of the Foundation. She is closely working with an established area CPA firm to make sure all required filings and payments will be timely made prospectively. To impose the penalties that could be assessed would cause significant financial hardship in that it would take money away from organizations and programs that the Foundation is going to make grants to.

The Foundation is also potentially subject § 4942 tax on failure to make qualified distributions. It is important to note that, however, at no point in the Foundation's existence have unqualified distributions been made to any person or any entity. Neither the trustee nor any other individual or entity incurred any private inurement or pecuniary benefit from the Foundation. It is only because of the severe hardship that the Trustee went through that the qualified distributions were not made timely. As of December 31, 2009 a total of \$149,934 of undistributed income from prior years needed to be distributed. As of October 15, 2010 the Foundation has made qualifying distributions totaling \$158,000 to the following qualified 501(c)(3) or New Hampshire state government recipients:

Therefore, as of the date these returns have been filed, no undistributed income remains unpaid. Before December 31, 2010 the Foundation will make additional grants of at least \$56,000 for the 2009 tax year. To assess § 4942 tax on the Foundation will create a monumental burden on the organization and will significantly hinder the planned giving that will occur in the near future and severely hurt not only the Foundation, but most importantly the needy organizations that will be counting on the upcoming distributions to fulfill their many needed charitable works. Therefore the Foundation respectfully requests a full abatement of all penalties and interest that might be assessed.
