(1) CRY-Child Rights and You America, Inc. (CRY America) was established in November 2002 as a Delaware Corporation, and is a not-for-profit organized under Section 501(c)(3) of the US Tax Code. The mission of CRY America is to raise funds for and public awareness of the problems that face underprivileged children, with emphasis on children living in India.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

(a) Basis of Accounting/Presentation - The Organization maintains its accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

(b) Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

(c) Classification of Net Assets - Net assets is classified into three categories: unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted. All contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor or by law. Temporarily restricted net assets are contributions with temporary, donor-imposed time or purpose restrictions. Temporarily restricted net assets become unrestricted when the time restrictions expire or the contributions are used for their restricted purposes, at which time they are reported in the statements of activities as net assets released from restrictions. All permanently restricted net assets represent an endowment to be held in perpetuity. Investment income earned on this endowment is temporarily restricted for programs.

(3) Fixed assets are stated at cost. When assets are retired or otherwise disposed of, the cost and accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts, and any resulting gain or loss is recognized in income for the period. Maintenance and repairs are charged to expense as incurred; major renewals and betterments are capitalized. Depreciation is provided for using straight-line and accelerated methods over the following estimated useful lives:

(4) Licensing Agreement with Child Relief and You, India (CRY India)
CRY America has entered into an agreement, dated July 23, 2004, with Child Relief and You, India, a public charity trust of India. The agreement allows CRY America to use the CRY India name, trademark and logo. This agreement also outlines services provided to CRY America by CRY India for the purpose of facilitating grants made to India based projects. CRY America has also entered into an agreement with CRY India under which CRY India will provide grant management services for all grants made in India.
