<u>Iraqi Student Solidarity Committee</u>: Students at The Evergreen State College advocated for and secured tuition waivers at TESC for students whose education is interrupted by war and occupation. The Rachel Corrie Foundation teamed with the ISSC students to provide financial support for waiver recipients' living expenses while attending school as required by the school administration. There were two recipients in 2009, and outreach to other campuses organized dozens of other students to encourage their schools to provide similar services.

March 16 Memorial Celebration: A free community celebration of the Rachel Corrie Foundation for Peace and Justice. An annual event, in 2009 it included potluck dinner, a report to the community on land dedicated in Rachel Corrie's name in the West Bank, showing of two short films, live music performed by Jim Page, small group discussions and a candle-light vigil.

<u>Peace Works</u>: A conference in Olympia, WA which included presentations by the Rachel Corrie Foundation Gaza Delegation and the Indigenous Delegation to Palestine on the two group's recent trips to Israel and Palestine, an Art and Activism workshop, an outdoor celebration of the Olympia-Rafah Solidarity Mural with live music provided by three bands. (Grants: None)

<u>Rachel Corrie Memorial Scholarships</u>: Awarded at The Evergreen State College to two students who intend to use their studies for local and international efforts to bring Middle East peace.

The Olympia Film Society 2009 Film Festival: Sponsored showing the documentary film Rachel by French-Israeli filmmaker Simone Bitton. Six to seven hundred people viewed and discussed the film.

Friends of Sabeel – North America: Co-sponsored speaking event in Portland, Oregon, for Palestinian Episcopal priest Naim Ateek. This was an important opportunity for Oregonians to meet a Palestinian Christian and hear his vision for a just peace in the Middle East.

Arab American Community Coalition: Co-sponsored advertising in local Seattle, Washington, newspapers and on public buses to bring attention to the Israeli military attack on Gaza of December 2008 and January 2009. The advertisements were read by hundreds of thousands of people in the greater Seattle area and were instrumental in encouraging further grassroots effort to educate the public about the ongoing violence in the Middle East.

Gaza Mental Health Association (U.S.): Grant of aid to mitigate the mental health impact of the attack on Gaza of December 2008 and January 2009, including post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Gaza Mental Health Association is a U.S. non-governmental supporter of Gaza Community Mental Health Program, which, in turn, is active in Gaza communities. GCMHP works with thousands of children, women, and all victims of violence to enhance their capacity to deal with mental health issues. They are a mental health organization whose values and practices are based on justice, humanity, and human rights.

Middle East Children's Alliance (U.S.): Grant of aid to provide humanitarian relief to the people of Gaza after the attack of December 2008 and January 2009. MECA is a U.S. NGO that helps thousands of children annually, providing clean water, playgrounds, medical supplies, milk and fortified cereal, school supplies, and other humanitarian goods and programs directed at children. Funding for the second annual Rachel Corrie Memorial Ramadan Football (soccer) Tournament was included.

Fractured Atlas: "Rebuilding Hope": Grant of aid to support completion of the documentary film "Rebuilding Hope. The film features Gabriel Bol Deng, Koor Garang, and Garang Mayuol who were born in South Sudan but as young children were forced in 1987 to flee when militiamen led violent attacks on their villages. The youth crossed Southern Sudan on foot, reached safety in refugee camps in Ethiopia and Kenya, and in 2001 came to the U.S. with a large number of Southern Sudanese young men nicknamed "Lost Boys." The film documents the return of Gabriel, Koor, and Garang to Sudan in 2007 and their quest to find surviving family-members and to rediscover and contribute to their homeland. It sheds light on what the future holds for South Sudan in its struggle for peace, development and stability.

The completed film has screened to thousands of people across the U.S. and world with proceeds helping hundreds of people in Sudan by supporting healthcare and education projects initiated by the film's subjects.

<u>United Palestinian Appeal (U.S.)</u>: Grant for Gaza humanitarian aid to provide relief assistance to the people of Gaza after the Israeli military attack of December 2008 and January 2009 (Operation Cast Lead) in which over 1400 Gazans were killed, thousands were injured, homes were demolished, and the infrastructure of Gaza was hugely damaged. The United Palestinian Appeal is a U.S. nonprofit organization that provides humanitarian assistance in Gaza.

Agape Foundation: Grant funding to support Dr. Susan Greene's production of a video trailer "The Tale of Two Cities." The trailer is for use in promoting and securing funding for a film by the same title to document the history and creation of the Olympia-Rafah Solidarity Mural, a major project of the Rachel Corrie Foundation described above.

Boston Committee on the Middle East: Grant aid to support a two-week student delegation to Palestine with the goal of providing participants necessary tools to understand occupation in Palestine, to develop advocacy and leadership skills related to the issue, and to develop long-term mutually beneficial relationships among North American and Palestinian students. In workshops, participants shared their experiences, strategies, and goals for campus organizing and developed an international network for their efforts. The program was designed for those not affiliated with political parties but who work with grassroots organizations for change. Long-term impact was fostered through requirements for follow-up activity on participants' own campuses.

Birthright Unplugged/Re-plugged: Grant support for the Birthright Re-plugged return project which provides Palestinian children living in refugee camps opportunity to visit Jerusalem, the sea and the children's ancestral villages – experiences that are nearly impossible for most Palestinians in the West Bank, Gaza and outside Palestine. The children document their experiences with cameras and create an exhibit that contributes to the collective memory in the refugee camp community. The exhibits are also available for display in other venues and in North America. The program honors the request of Palestinians to share their stories with as many people as possible.

Oaxaca film presentation: Co-sponsorship of a community education event in which an audience of over 100 viewed a documentary film about Oaxaca, Mexico, by local filmmaker Johan Genberg followed by a panel and group discussion with participants that included the filmmaker and those with direct experience in Oaxaca.

<u>The Arab Center of Washington</u>: Co-sponsorship of the annual Arab Festival in Seattle, Washington, including registration for participation and presentation of Rachel Corrie Foundation educational materials. These were available to thousands of festival attendees from the greater Seattle area throughout the festival week-end.

<u>Seattle Green Festival</u>: Volunteers from the Rachel Corrie Foundation manned a table with educational information relating to the Israel/Palestine issue and Palestinian fair trade goods at the Seattle Green Festival. This activity provided educational outreach to thousands in the greater Seattle who learned about the people of Palestine, their culture, and related current events in the area. The expense was for event insurance.

The Rachel Corrie Foundation for Peace and Justice holds public forums, lectures, and conferences from time to time and also periodically attends the functions of other groups to educate the public on peace and justice issues. At these events the foundation often has a table with brochures and other literature about the Foundation and about various peace and justice issues. In addition, to educate the public about the economy of the Middle East and to attract people to our table for the free samples, we often sell olive oil made by small farmers in the Middle East and distributed in the U.S. on a fair trade basis. We also carry several books and other publications related to peace and justice issues, the most expensive of which is about \$14. We do ask that the public pay for these more expensive items, as the foundation does not have resources to provide them at no cost. Sales are transacted offpremises, away from the foundation's office, by unpaid volunteers. While gross income from this activity (\$3,038) is for the first time above \$1,000, the activity is exempt from tax both because it is related to the foundation's exempt purpose and because the sales are done completely by unpaid volunteers. "An unrelated trade or business does not include a trade or business: 1. In which substantially all the work is done for the organization without compensation..."
