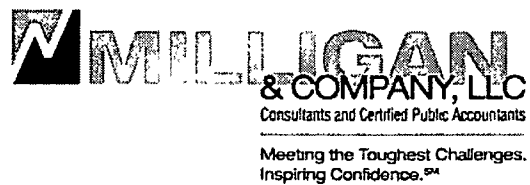

1. ORGANIZATION

The Fund for Charitable Giving (the “Fund”) is a tax-exempt public charity that has been organized to support charitable organizations nationwide. The Fund issues grants to public charities. The Fund accepts contributions from individuals (“donors”) who can contribute to the Fund at any time and qualify for a tax deduction in the year the contribution is made. The minimum initial contribution is set at \$10,000. Donors recommend grants to qualified public charitable organizations of their choice at any time. PNC Bank, N.A. (“PNC”) is the Trustee of the Fund and oversees the investments and disbursements of the donor advised funds.

The Fund invests its assets in four investment pools, each of which has a different investment objective. Donors may allocate contributions to any combination of the investment pools. Contributions from all donors are pooled together for investment purposes. The Fund maintains subaccounts with respect to all individual donors. Each subaccount reflects the amount of the donor’s contribution and the related investment and disbursement activity.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation—The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Accordingly, income is recognized as earned and expenses as incurred, regardless of timing of payments.

Net Assets—A description of each major class of net assets is as follows:

Unrestricted Net Assets—Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets—Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that either expires by the passage of time or can be fulfilled and removed by actions of the Fund pursuant to those stipulations.

Contributions—Cash contributions are recorded on the date when the donor check is received by the Fund. Contributions received in forms other than cash are recorded at the fair value (the closing price of the security) of the asset contributed on the date received. The non-cash assets contributed are subsequently liquidated and the proceeds from the sales are reinvested into one of the Fund’s pooled investments, as recommended by the donor.

Use of Estimates in the Preparation of Financial Statements—The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and net assets and related disclosures at the date of the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties—The Fund utilizes various investment instruments, including mutual funds and common stock. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accordingly, the amount that may be available for charitable grants.

Cash Equivalents—Cash equivalents are recorded at fair value and consist of unallocated funds that are invested in domestic non-pooled money market instruments.

Investments—The Fund's assets are stated at fair value based on quoted market prices and consist of pooled investments, as well as donated cash equivalents and equity securities, which have yet to be liquidated and subsequently reinvested in the pooled investments. The Fund's investment pools are primarily invested in BlackRock Mutual Funds (a related party of the Trustee), iShares iBoxx \$ Investment Grade Corporate Bond Exchange-Traded Fund, PIMCO Total Return Bond Fund, Vanguard Mutual Funds, Harbor International Fund, Artisan Mutual Funds, Baron Mutual Funds, MFS Mutual Funds, the Calamos Growth Fund, the RS Emerging Markets Fund, and the T. Rowe Price Growth Stock Fund.

Interest and dividend income (included in "net investment income") are recorded on an accrual basis.

Realized gains or losses on investment securities are recorded on a specific security or pool basis and recognized on a trade-date basis. The Fund presents in the Statement of Activities and Changes in Net Assets, the net unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of its investments.

The Fund incurs portfolio management expenses and trust compensation expenses, which are netted against interest and dividend income. Portfolio management expenses are paid to several mutual fund providers described in the first paragraph of this section. Trust compensation expenses are assessed quarterly and are charged to the net asset value of the pooled investments. Portfolio management expenses for the years ended December 31, 2009 and 2008 was \$30,130 and \$94,095, respectively. Additionally, \$6,741 and \$6,271 was paid to a related party investment fund manager during 2009 and 2008, respectively.

Also, as of December 31, 2009 and 2008, the Fund incurred administrative expenses, such as legal and accounting fees of \$66,395 and \$35,306, respectively. Expenses incurred by the Fund are allocated to each investment pool based on each pool's market value in relation to the overall Fund value.

New Accounting Standards—In June 2009, Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) issued the last FASB Statement referenced in form: FASB Statement No. 168, *The FASB Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) and the Hierarchy of Generally Accepted Accounting Principles*. ASC was a major restructuring of accounting and reporting standards designed to simplify user access to all authoritative U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (“GAAP”) by providing the authoritative literature in a topically organized structure. This standard establishes ASC as a source of authoritative U.S. accounting and reporting standards for nongovernmental entities and is effective for financial statements issued for annual periods ending after September 15, 2009. The Fund adopted this standard as of December 31, 2009, accordingly FASB Statement references were updated to the appropriate ASC topic reference.

In July 2006 the Financial Accounting Standard Board released FASB Interpretation No. 48 (“FIN 48”) *Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes*. FIN 48 provides guidance for how uncertain tax positions should be recognized, measured and disclosed in the financial statements. This guidance has since been incorporated into the ASC Topic 740, *Income Taxes*. The Fund adopted this guidance as of December 31, 2009, see Note 4.

In May 2009, FASB ASC 855 (Topic 855), *Subsequent Events*, was issued. Topic 855 requires incorporating the accounting and disclosure requirements for subsequent events into U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. This guidance introduces new terminology, defines a date through which management must evaluate subsequent events, and lists the circumstances under which an entity must recognize and disclose events or transactions occurring after the balance sheet date. The Fund adopted the new guidance as of December 31, 2009, see Note 5.

In September 2009, FASB issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) No. 2010-06, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures (Topic 820)-Improving Disclosures about Fair Value Measurements*. ASU No. 2010-06 requires disclosures to (1) disclose separately the amounts of significant transfers in and out of Level 1 and Level 2 fair value measurements and describe the reasons for the transfers and (2) in the reconciliation for fair value measurements using significant unobservable inputs (Level 3), a reporting entity should present separately information about purchases, sales, issuances, and settlements (that is, on a gross basis rather than as one net number). This update also provides clarification of certain exiting disclosures included in Topic 820. ASU No. 2010-06 is effective for interim and annual reporting periods beginning after December 15, 2009, except for the disclosures about purchases, sales, issuances, and settlements in the roll forward of activity in Level 3 fair value measurements. Those disclosures are effective for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2010 and for interim periods within those fiscal years. The Fund has adopted the applicable provisions as of December 31, 2009, for which there was no significant impact to these financial statements.

Reclassifications—Investment pools fair value level from the prior year financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year presentation. There were no changes in the inputs used to measure fair value.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

In accordance with Topic 820, the fair value of investments is categorized into a three-tier hierarchy, which assigns priorities to inputs of valuation techniques used to measure fair value. Inputs refer to assumptions market participants would use when pricing an asset and are classified as observable (i.e. assumptions based on market prices obtained from independent sources) and unobservable (i.e. assumptions based on best information available or the reporting entity's assumptions). The hierarchy of inputs is summarized below:

- Level 1 – observable, represents assets with unadjusted quoted market prices for identical assets (registered securities).
- Level 2 – other observable, not quoted market prices for identical assets. As of December 31, 2009 and 2008, there were no investments classified as level 2.
- Level 3 – unobservable, reflect reporting entity's assumptions that would be made by market participants. As of December 31, 2009 and 2008, there were no investments classified as level 3.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for financial instruments measured at fair value on a recurring basis:

Equity Securities: This category includes U.S. Common Stocks. Fair value measurements for U.S. Common Stocks are obtained from quoted prices or executed exchange trades. These measurements are classified as Level 1.

Investment Pools: This category includes Investment Pools, for which the underlying investments contain Domestic Equity and Fixed Income Mutual Funds which are registered securities. These measurements are classified as level 1.

Units of Participation—A subaccount is established for each donor once the contribution has been accepted. The Fund allocates the contribution among the investment pools in accordance with the donor's selection and assigns units of participation in the pools to the subaccount. Units are assigned no later than the business day after the Fund receives either cash or the proceeds from the sale of the securities donated and allocates them to the pools. The Fund determines unit value at the end of each business day by dividing the value of each fund pool by the number of outstanding units in the respective pool.

4. FEDERAL INCOME TAX

The Fund is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3). Since its initial filing for tax-exempt status, the Fund has not received any notice from the Internal Revenue Service that such tax-exempt status has been challenged or changed.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Fund to report information regarding its exposure to various tax positions taken by the Fund. The Fund has evaluated whether any tax positions have met the recognition threshold and have measured the Fund's exposure to the tax positions. Management believes that the Fund has adequately addressed all relevant tax positions and that there are no unrecorded tax liabilities. Any interest or penalties assessed to the Fund are recorded in administrative expenses. No interest or penalties from federal or state tax authorities were recorded in the accompanying financial statements.

5. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In accordance with Topic 855, the Fund has performed an evaluation of subsequent events through May 4, 2010, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued. The Fund is not aware of any subsequent events which would require recognition or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements.
